# Health Days Race and Trail Run Social Distancing Operating Plan

In preparation for our Health Days Fun Run and 16 Crossings Trail Run on June 6th, we have taken ample precautions to make sure it can be held in a safe manner that complies with the phased guidelines in Orange and Yellow. The organization of the race will allow proper social distancing, discourage congregating, avoid contact with high-touch surfaces, and allow for screening of participants. We expect a much smaller number of runners than originally planned which will facilitate the social distancing measures we have in place. Please see below for details.

## Packet-Pickup

Everything the runner needs for race day will be put in a bag for them to pick up before
the race. We'll schedule times for them to arrive to pick up their packet to avoid a
gathering of people. For example: last names that begin with A-C arrive 5:00 pm- 5:30
pm.

## **Race Start**

- We will screen all participants as they arrive at the park via a check-in table at the start line.
- We will not use a mass start for either race. A trickle start will be used: Participants will have a scheduled time to arrive at the park and will be sent onto the route every 30-60 seconds to maintain a minimum of 6' apart. For example: 20 runners (20 if in orange stage, 50 if in yellow stage) will be scheduled to arrive between 6:30 am- 6:50 am, 20 runners scheduled to arrive 6:50 am- 7:10 am. When they arrive, we will screen them and send them onto the route every 30-60 seconds to keep the proper distance.
- We will use disposable chips for the timing which is a contactless way of timing. The participants will pick up their race packets, including their timing chip, before the race so they can just show up and run.
- The start/finish line will be divided with barriers so those starting their race will be separated from those finishing their race.

### Routes

While both races have the same start and finish line, they will split off onto different routes one
mile up the road. There is plenty of room on the road and double track trail to maintain
adequate social distance.

## Finish line

- There will be 2-3 post-race recovery stations where we will give the participants a prepackaged bag with a water bottle, prepackaged food, swag, raffle prize, etc. As the runner crosses the finish line, we will direct them to one of the stations to avoid congregating.
- We will not hold an awards ceremony or anything like that to avoid any congregating.

## **Timing**

The timing system automatically updates on the timing company's website in real time. We will
not post any results and will encourage runners to visit the website on their smartphones. We
will also send out the race times immediately following the race. This will discourage
congregating as well.

## Signage

- We will have ample signage to reinforce the regulations for social distancing.
- We will announce social distancing guidelines over the PA system every five minutes.
- The start line will have cones set 6' apart to keep proper distance.

## Staff/Volunteers

- We will use minimal staff and volunteers.
- The staff/volunteers who will be within 6' of participants will be required to wear a face mask.

## **Spectators**

• We usually don't get too many spectators; however, we will discourage spectators and advise any spectators to follow all social distancing guidelines as well.

**Application Deadline:** Completed application forms must be submitted to the Cache County Development Services Office forty-five (45) calendar days before an event is scheduled to take place. This allows sufficient time for evaluation of the application. Late applications shall be denied unless the applicant demonstrates that compliance with the 45 day deadline was impractical or impossible due to the nature of the event. A special event permit application may be approved and a permit issued to the applicant by the Director upon approval by all the agencies specified in Section 8.40.40.

Authority: Cache County has no authority to approve permits for events other than in the unincorporated area of Cache County. Permits issued by Cache County apply only to the unincorporated area of the county, and if an event crosses into a municipality within Cache County or across the county line, applicants should determine if a permit is necessary in the other jurisdiction.

Right to Deny: Cache County reserves the right to deny permit applications for proposed special events which may pose, or have posed a significant danger or threat to the public health, welfare or safety, or which may result in unreasonable inconvenience or cost to the public. In the event the application is denied, the applicant may appeal to the Cache County Executive.

## 16 Crossings Trail Run Permit Application

- 1) NA, government organization
- 2) The race will begin at Mack Park and head up Birch Creek Canyon. Participants will stay on the main roads and double track trail. The route is an out and back with the participants returning on the same route they came up on. (See attachment)
- 3) We will have approx. 75-100 participants, 5-6 staff and volunteers, and possibly 10-15 spectators with a maximum of 150 people. Spectators will be at Mack Park.

## 4) Health Plan-

Any food/snacks on the route will be pre-made/pre-packaged. We will have personnel with food handlers permits overseeing the food to ensure health standards are kept.

## Water-

There will be three aid stations with culinary water in a cooler for participants. We will have culinary water and restroom facilities at Mack Park for all participants, spectators, staff, and volunteers.

## Waste-

We will have trash bags at each aid station and our staff will clean up the route on their way back down the canyon. All trash/waste will be packed out and disposed of at the rec center.

Access for emergency vehicles: Ambulances may access the trail from Smithfield Canyon Road and Birch Canyon Road; helicopters may access the trail at the Birch Canyon trailhead (Approximately mile 3.2). We have the key to open the third gate to allow emergency vehicles onto the trail if necessary.

<u>Number and location of first aid stations:</u> There will be three first aid stations throughout the race; one at the start/finish line, one at the Birch Canyon trailhead (approximately mile 3.2), and one at the turnaround (approximately mile 5.8, just before the wilderness boundary).



- 2) The race will begin at Mack Park and head up Smithfield Canyon. The One mile and 5k routes are out and back routes so they will return to Mack Park on Canyon Rd. The 10k will return to the park via Upper Canyon road. Smithfield Police Department will have three cars along the route. One unit will be at 50 N. Canyon Rd. to close off Canyon Rd. during the race. Another will lead the runners up the canyon during the mass start to ensure their safety then park at Canyon Rd. and Upper Canyon Rd. to reroute cars to Upper Canyon Rd. The third unit is on Canyon Rd. at the 10k turnaround to inform vehicles of the race and help them travel safely. (See attachment)
- 3) We will have approx. 350 participants, 50 staff and volunteers, and 40-50 spectators. Spectators will be at Mack Park.

## 4) Health Plan-

Post-race recovery food will be pre-made/pre-packaged. We will not have any cut fruit.

#### Water-

There will be three aid stations with culinary water in a cooler for participants. We will have culinary water and restroom facilities at Mack Park for all participants, spectators, staff, and volunteers.

#### Waste-

Each aid station will have trash bags to collect all paper cups. All trash/waste will be disposed of in the city dumpsters at Mack Park.

As mentioned above, SPD will be present at the event and SFD has been notified of the event. They will have a EMT unit in the area in case of emergency. Each aid station will also have a basic first aid kit.
