

PERMIT

- A.** Use under this permit shall begin on 06/26/2026 and end on 06/28/2026. The permit shall not be extended.
- B.** The estimated fee for this use is 5%. It shall be paid in advance and is not refundable. Within 30 days of conclusion of the event the holder shall submit final records of gross revenue collected for reconciliation for any additional fees due the United States.
- C.** SMITHFIELD CITY CORP of 315 E 600 S, SMITHFIELD, UT, UNITED STATES, 84335 (the holder) is hereby authorized to use, subject to the terms of this permit, National Forest System lands described as: Sec. 40, T. 13 N., R. 2 E., SALT LAKE MERIDIAN, as shown in attached Exhibits A, B, and C. This authorization covers approximately 10 acres.
- D.** The holder is authorized to conduct the following activities and install the following improvements in the permitted area:

The 16 Crossings Run is a foot race sponsored by Smithfield City. The run begins in Mack Park in Smithfield City, continues up Birch Canyon on the system trail. Participants turn around at the wilderness boundary and finish the race at Mack Park. Further information can be found in the attachments below:

- E.** The holder shall conduct the authorized activities according to the attached approved plans and specifications, Exhibits A, B, and C. The holder shall not install any improvements not specifically identified and approved above or in exhibits.
- F.** No soil, trees, or other vegetation may be destroyed or removed from National Forest System lands without specific prior written permission from the authorized officer.

G. The holder shall comply with all federal, state, county, and municipal laws, ordinances, and regulations, which are applicable to the area or operations covered by this permit.

H. The holder shall maintain the improvements and premises to standards of repair, orderliness, neatness, sanitation, and safety acceptable to the authorized officer. The holder shall fully repair and bear the expense for all damages, other than ordinary wear and tear, to National Forest System lands, roads and trails caused by the holder's activities.

I. The holder has the responsibility of inspecting the use area and adjoining areas for dangerous trees, hanging limbs, and other evidence of hazardous conditions, which would pose a risk of injury to individuals. After securing permission from the authorized officer, the holder shall remove such hazards.

J. The holder shall be liable for any damage suffered by the United States resulting from or related to use of this permit, including damages to National Forest resources and costs of fire suppression.

K. The holder shall hold harmless the United States from any liability from damage to life or property arising from the holder's occupancy or use of National Forest System lands under this permit.

L. The holder agrees to permit the free and unrestricted access to and upon the premises at all times for all lawful and proper purposes not inconsistent with the intent of the authorization or with the reasonable exercise and enjoyment by the holder of the privileges thereof.

M. This permit is subject to all valid existing rights and claims outstanding in third parties.

N. This permit may be revoked or suspended upon breach of any of the conditions herein or at the discretion of the authorized officer. Upon expiration or revocation of this authorization, the holder shall immediately remove all improvements except those owned by the United States, and shall restore the site within days, unless otherwise agreed upon in writing. If the holder fails to remove the improvements, they shall become property of the United States, but that will not relieve the holder of liability for the cost of their removal and restoration of the site.

O. This permit is a license for the use of federally owned land. It does not grant any interest in real property. This permit is not transferable. Upon approval of the authorized officer, the holder may enter into agreements with third parties to exercise the rights and privileges granted by this authorization.

P. The holder is required to comply with standards for adequacy and type of services set out in the attached operating plan.

Q. Gambling or gambling machines or devices will not be permitted on National Forest System lands regardless of whether or not they are lawful under State law or county ordinances.

R. The holder, in advertisements, signs, brochures, letterheads, and like materials, as well as orally, shall not misrepresent in any way, either the accommodations provided, the status of the authorization, or the area covered by it or the vicinity. The fact that the permitted area is located on the National Forest shall be made

readily apparent in all formats of the holder's brochures and advertising regarding the use and management of the area and authorized facilities.

S. Pursuant to 31 U.S.C. 3717, et seq., interest shall be charged on any fee amount not paid within 30 days from the date the fee or fee calculation financial statement specified in this authorization becomes due. The rate of interest assessed shall be the higher of the rate of the current value of funds to the U.S. Treasury (i.e., Treasury tax and loan account rate), as prescribed and published by the Secretary of the Treasury in the Federal Register and the Treasury Fiscal Requirements Manual Bulletins annually or quarterly or at the Prompt Payment Act rate. Interest on the principal shall accrue from the date the fee or fee calculation financial statement is due.

1. In the event the account becomes delinquent, administrative costs to cover processing and handling of the delinquency will be assessed.

2. A penalty of 6 percent per annum shall be assessed on the total amount delinquent in excess of 90 days and shall accrue from the same date on which interest charges begin to accrue.

3. Payments will be credited on the date received by the designated collection officer or deposit location. If the due date for the fee or fee calculation statement falls on a non-workday, the charges shall not apply until the close of business on the next workday.

4. Disputed fees are due and payable by the due date. No appeal of fees will be considered by the Forest Service without full payment of the disputed amount. Adjustments, if necessary, will be made in accordance with settlement terms or the appeal decision.

5. If the fees become delinquent, the Forest Service will:

a) Liquidate any security or collateral provided by the authorization.

b) If no security or collateral is provided, the authorization will terminate and the holder will be responsible for delinquent fees as well as any other costs of restoring the site to its original condition including hazardous waste cleanup.

6. Upon termination or revocation of the authorization, delinquent fees and other charges associated with the authorization will be subject to all rights and remedies afforded the United States pursuant to 31 U.S.C. 3711 *et seq.* Delinquencies may be subject to any or all of the following conditions:

a) Administrative offset of payments due the holder from the Forest Service.

b) Delinquencies in excess of 60 days shall be referred to United States Department of Treasury for appropriate collection action as provided by 31 U.S.C. 3711 (g), (1).

c) The Secretary of the Treasury may offset an amount due the debtor for any delinquency as provided by 31 U.S.C. 3720, *et seq.*)

T. For the purpose of administering this permit (including ascertaining that fees paid were correct and evaluating the propriety of the fee base), the holder agrees to make all of the accounting books and supporting records to the business activities, as well as those of sublessees operating within the authority of this authorization, available for analysis by qualified representatives of the Forest Service or other Federal agencies authorized to review the Forest Service activities. Review of accounting books and supporting records shall be made at dates convenient to the holder and reviewers. Financial information so obtained shall be treated as confidential as provided in regulations issued by the Secretary of Agriculture. The holder shall retain the above records and keep them available for review for 5 years after the end of the year involved, unless disposition is otherwise approved by the authorized officer in writing.

U. Appeal of any provisions of this authorization or any requirements thereof shall be subject to the appeal regulations at 36 CFR Part 214 or revisions thereto.

V. This permit is accepted subject to the conditions set forth herein, including any conditions in any exhibits attached to and made a part of this authorization.

W. The above clauses shall control if they conflict with additional clauses or provisions.

X. The fee for this use will be 5% of adjusted gross receipts generated by the activity authorized by this permit. The holder shall pay in advance a sum of \$101.24. This is a fee amount based upon an estimate of the adjusted gross receipts to be generated by the authorized activity. Upon completion of the authorized activity, the holder shall provide to the Forest Service, pursuant to Clause Exhibit C of this permit, a copy of the holder's records of gross and adjusted gross receipts. Using those records, the actual fee for this use will be calculated by the authorized officer. An adjustment in fees will then be made to make the actual fee amount due commensurate with the rate of 5% of the total adjusted gross receipts.

Y. 1. The holder and its employees shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, color, sex (in educational and training activities), national origin, age, or disability or by curtailing or refusing to furnish accommodations, facilities, services, or use privileges offered to the public generally. In addition, the holder and its employees shall comply with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 as amended, section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended, and the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended.

2. The holder shall include and require compliance with the above nondiscrimination provisions in any third-party agreement made with respect to the operations authorized under this permit.

3. Signs setting forth this policy of nondiscrimination to be furnished by the Forest Service shall be conspicuously displayed at the public entrance to the permit area, and at other exterior or interior locations as directed by the Forest Service.

4. The Forest Service shall have the right to enforce the foregoing nondiscrimination provisions by suit for specific performance or by any other available remedy under the laws of the United States or the State in which the violation occurs.

Z. In addition to the above nondiscrimination policy, the holder agrees to ensure that its programs and activities are open to the general public on an equal basis and without regard to any non-merit factor.

AA. The holder shall furnish proof of insurance, such as a certificate of insurance, to the authorized officer prior to issuance of this permit and each year thereafter that this permit is in effect. The Forest Service reserves the right to review the insurance policy and require any changes needed to ensure adequate coverage of the United States in connection with the authorized use and occupancy. The holder shall send an authenticated copy of any insurance policy obtained pursuant to this clause to the authorized officer immediately upon issuance of the policy. Any insurance policies obtained by the holder pursuant to this clause shall include the United States as an additional insured in an endorsement to the policy, and the additional insured provision shall provide for insurance coverage for the United States as required under this clause and to the extent of the full limits of insurance available to the holder. The holder shall give 30 days prior written notice to the authorized officer of cancellation of the insurance policy. The certificate of insurance, the authenticated copy of the insurance policy, and written notice of cancellation or modification of insurance policies should be sent to 1500 US 89, Logan, UT, 84321. Minimum amounts of coverage and other insurance requirements are subject to change at the sole discretion of the authorized officer on the anniversary date of this permit.

1. The holder shall have in force liability insurance covering losses associated with the use or occupancy authorized by this permit arising from personal injury or death and third-party property damage in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 as a combined single limit per occurrence.

2. Depending on the holder's operations, the Forest Service may require the holder to demonstrate the availability of funds to address any release or threatened release of hazardous materials that may occur in connection with the holder's use and occupancy. Any requirements imposed would be established case by case by the authorized officer based on the degree of environmental risk from the holder's operations. The storage and use of normal maintenance supplies in nominal amounts generally would not trigger financial assurance requirements.

BB. Executive Order 13706, *Establishing Paid Sick Leave for Federal Contractors*, and its implementing regulations, including the federal contractor paid sick leave clause at 29 CFR Part 13, Appendix A, are incorporated by reference into this authorization as if fully set forth in this authorization.


CC. The Forest Service shall have the authority to check and regulate the adequacy and type of services provided the public and to require that such services conform to satisfactory standards. The holder may be required to furnish a schedule of prices for sales and services permitted by the authorization. Such prices and services may be regulated by the Forest Service: Provided, that the holder shall not be required to charge prices lower than those charged by comparable or competing enterprises.

DD. Gambling or gambling devices is prohibited on National Forest System lands, regardless of whether gambling or gambling devices are lawful under state or local law.

EE. The holder shall not misrepresent in any way, either orally; in its online or print circulars, brochures, advertising, and other media; or on its website, signs, or letterheads, any aspect of the use authorized by this permit, including services provided by the holder, the status of this permit, or the permit area. All the holder's online or print circulars, brochures, advertising, and other media regarding use of the permit area shall state that the permit area is located in the Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest.

2. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED ACTIVITY:

This is a fun run sponsored by Smithfield City. We offer it so patrons can have an opportunity to enjoy nature in a fun group setting. The run begins at Mack Park in Smithfield City and heads up Birch Creek Canyon. We have music, awards, prizes, and refreshments after the run.

3. LOCATION & DESCRIPTION OF NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM LANDS & FACILITIES APPLICANT WOULD LIKE TO USE

The route begins at Mack Park, goes up Canyon road, turns right on Birch Canyon road, and heads up Birch Creek Canyon. The runners stay on the road the entire time and turn around at the end of the cherry stem. The route is an out and back with the participants returning on the same route they came up on. (See attachment)

Oh for sure, I completely agree. Traffic control and road issues are extremely important. I've attached what our finish line area looks like with some additional notes below:

- We have four toilets by the finish line area with four additional toilets by the parking lot if needed.
- The start/finish line chute has steel crowd control barriers to protect the runners. The chute only occupies the south bound lane/parking. We leave the north bound lane open at all times for emergency vehicles and local traffic.
- We have three Smithfield City Police units controlling traffic. I believe their location and traffic control plan were previously sent but I can send something if needed. Basically, we keep all the runners in the park until right before the start time. The police then start diverting traffic for the start of the race with an additional unit by the 5k turnaround in the canyon as a visual for drivers to slow down. Additionally, the entire route has A-frame signs warning drivers that there are runners on the road and we post 15-20 volunteers in safety vests at all turns. We stagger the start times as well so there isn't a huge horde of runners going down the road at one time and advise all runners to follow all traffic laws.

Good question. Both races start in the same place and have the same set up at Mack Park.

The only difference is that the 16 Crossings Trail Run will have a slightly different traffic plan. Since it is a much smaller race (last year we had 80 runners) and we only use a small stretch of canyon road, we only use one officer. The officer leads the group up canyon road until the runners turn off and go up the dirt road to Birch Creek Canyon. The officer then comes back down and sets up at the road just before Mack park and diverts south bound traffic only. We keep the north bound lane open the entire race since they aren't on the road for very long.
