3. This event is inside the wildfire season. Roads being used could be subject to closure and evacuation in the event of an emergency.
4. Public safety will be handled by the Cache County Sherrif as outlined in the application. Event organizers and runner must allow access for emergency vehicles as necessary.
5. No parking of vehicles or camping is allowed along Mt. Pisgah road. Parked vehicles and spectators along the road make emergency response nearly impossible.
6. If new complaints are submitted, a County Staff Engineer will inspect for compliance with the conditions below. Costs arising from the special event for each department is charged to the permittee (§8.40.40.C.3). The Public Works Service Fee Estimate for this event is \$393.75
7. These additional requirements or conditions are imposed and deemed necessary to protect the public interest by ensuring traffic management, security of property, or the health and safety of the public (§8.40.50.D)
8. In previous event(s) complaints about parking and safety were submitted to the County. Parking along County Roads for special events is not permitted and can pose serious threats to human safety. Ensure and enforce all participants park only in designated areas.



9. For any special event within the public right-of-way that results in road closures or affects normal traffic, the permittee shall provide adequate traffic control to ensure the safety of those involved. This allows sufficient time for evaluation of the application. Late applications shall be denied unless the applicant demonstrates that compliance with the 45 day deadline was impractical or impossible due to the nature of the event. A special event permit application may be approved and a permit issued to the applicant by the Director upon approval by all the agencies specified in Section 8.40.40.

Authority: Cache County has no authority to approve permits for events other than in the unincorporated area of Cache County. Permits issued by Cache County apply only to the unincorporated area of the county, and if an event crosses into a municipality within Cache County or across the county line, applicants should determine if a permit is necessary in the other jurisdiction.

Crossover Half Special Event Permit Application - May 9, 2026

(Same as last year)

1. Permit Fee
2. The course for this half marathon event begins and ends at the Little Bear River Retreat in Paradise (878 Baxter Hollow, Paradise, UT). This is an out and back course. From the LBRR property, the course turns west and heads up the McMurdie/Baxter/Mt. Pisgah Hollow Road (8400 S) and continues west and southwest on this road until it crosses over the hill into Wellsville Canyon and then descends down the road to the turn around just before it gets to the cattle guard before the road enters US 89/91. The course then backtracks along the same route on McMurdie/Baxter/Mt. Pisgah Hollow Road back to the Little Bear River Retreat. Road closures for the event would be the McMurdie/Baxter/Mt. Pisgah Hollow Road, where Meridian Road (2400 W) ties into McMurdie Hollow Road coming in from the Wellsville/Hyrum city side, the 8500 S roadway coming over from Mt. Sterling, the entrance from US 89/91, and at the front of the Little Bear River Retreat. Closures are expected to be from 6:30-7 am to 11 am. Type III "Road Closed to Through Traffic" barricades will be used at the points of entry.
3. Anticipating 150-200 participants, 20-30 event staff, and 50-100 spectators.
4. There is culinary water and bathrooms at the Little Bear River Retreat. There will also be port-a-potties on the property provided through Roto Rooter. There will be a finish line aid station at the Retreat. Along the course there will be 4 port-a-potties, 1 at each of the 4 aid stations. Garbage at the aid stations and along the course will be collected by event staff. At the Retreat we will use their garbage cans. There will be a staff member with a Managers Food Handler Permit and some with basic Food handlers permits.
5. Insurance provided through USATF.
6. The Bridgerland Amateur Radio Club will be providing support along the course to assist where needed. Some of their members have medical/first aid training and experience. Emergency support will be notified of the event and called if needed. Fire should not be an issue being in the spring but access will be easily available along the entire course.
7. Law enforcement support will be the Cache County Sheriff's Department with one officer assigned to stop through traffic coming off of US 89/91 in Sardine Canyon during the event hours. Additional support will be on call. They will be notified of the event and additional details will be provided to them prior to the event.
8. Registration costs - \$55-75
9. Parking will be available at the Retreat, (around 50 spots), at White's Ranch, and at the Second Baptist Church's field that is east of the Retreat (50 spots). We will urge participants/spectators to carpool. Parking will be available at the main city park in Paradise, which has been okayed by the city. If necessary, a shuttle van will be provided to take people back and forth.
10. Event will take place in part at the Little Bear River Retreat, Parcel Tax ID: 01-098-0016. The race starts and finishes here.

Crossover Half - Road Closure Details 2026

These are the plans for the four different road closure points and how we will address them. Each point is laid out below. Road closure signs will be set up the morning of the event beginning at 6:30 am and moved aside by 11 am to 12 pm.

Closure Point #1 -

This closure point is on Pisgah Road right in front of the Little Bear River Retreat. We will have a road closure sign that says 'Road Closed to Thru Traffic'. Access will be available to the residents or farmers that live or work up the road. We will notify the residents that live on Paradise W Dr. so they are aware of the event that day and how to work around it if access is needed. If required, an additional sign saying 'Road Closed Ahead' can be placed at 8700 S and 450 W in Paradise. The alternate route is to use Hwy 165 in Paradise over to Hyrum and then use the main roads toward Wellsville.

In the image below, the yellow is the course route, beginning and ending at the Little Bear River Retreat, the green arrow is the point where Paradise W Dr. connects to Mount Pisgah Rd. that remains open to local traffic, and the red marked with #1 is where the road closure sign will be placed. This will be from 6:45 am to approximately 11 am on the day of the event.



Road Closure Point #3 -

This closure point would be on the dirt road coming from Mt. Sterling. This is a rough dirt road and we anticipate no vehicles using this road the morning of the event. A 'Road Closed' sign will be placed at the location where the gate is located that is used to close the road for the winter months. This location is shown on the map below. An alternate option to the sign is to have the County keep the gate closed for the weekend.

The yellow path is the course route and the red path is the road to be closed at the point marked #3.



Road Closure Point #5

This location is where the Cache County Sheriff officer will stop thru traffic from going up the road but will still allow traffic to the Pisgah Pit. I will be in communication with the Pit about the event as I did last year.
