□ <u>Liquor Licensing Information</u> Executive Buttars emailed the Council information about the State Division of Alcohol and Beverage Control liquor licensing questions.

and this information may help the Council with future deliberations on the issue.
 SB52 proposes metering secondary water systems – Water Manager Nathan Daugs is in discussions with the bill's sponsor for amendments. Senator Hillyard does not support the bill.
 HB172 allowing counties to appoint certain county officeholders has currently been tabled.
 SB72 – Transportation Bill is in house committee and passed the senate with no opposing votes
 Moratorium on change in county classification – Vice Chair Worthen asked the status of the moratorium. Executive Buttars said it is awaiting the Governor's signature and Buttars will contact the Lieutenant Governor's office to verify Cache will not be declared a county of the second class.
 Ban on plastic bags – The legislature is looking at a law to disallow a city or county to ban the use of plastic bags.

An Agri-Tourism business in Cache County is considering expanding its operations

#### **ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST**

Nibley City Request for Change in RAPZ Allocation Schedule – Nibley City Manager David Zook thanked the county for the property conversion process connected with the sale of county-owned North Logan property which allowed Nibley to develop the Firefly Park. The first phase of the Park is almost done and Zook is asking that the approximate \$80,000.00 of funding to be paid over the next five years be awarded as a total lump sum instead.

Executive Buttars said there is funding available due to the reimbursement for the purchase of land at the Heritage Center. Council member White expressed concern that the lump sum payment will take dollars away from the total RAPZ available for other projects. Executive Buttars favors support of the request and he will get better financial information for the Council's consideration.

PUBLIC HEARING SET: March 12, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. – Resolution No. 2019-08-Amending 2019 Budget

ACTION: Motion by Council member Erickson to set a Public Hearing – March 12, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. – Resolution No. 2019-08-Amending 2019 Budget. White seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING:</u> February 26, 2019 at 5:30 p.m. – Resolution No. 2019-04-Declaring Cache County interest in Real Property located In Logan Canyon including Parcel Number 18-065-0006 as Surplus Property – Executive Buttars explained this is .17 acres that the adjoining property owner thought was included in their purchase in 1998. Buttars believes the only access to the property is through private property.

Executive Buttars opened the Public Hearing and invited public comment.

<u>Mike Nyman</u>, adjoining property owner, said he didn't know this parcel was not part of his original purchase and said the legal description and the overlay are contradictory. He would like to have the matter rectified.

Executive Buttars observed the legal description needs to be cleared up. Director Runhaar noted a survey will cost five times the value of the property and there is nothing for the county to tie it to.

There was no other public comment.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Zilles to close the Public Hearing. Worthen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

PUBLIC HEARING: February 26, 2019 at 5:40 p.m. – Resolution No. 2019-05-Declaring Cache County interest in Real Property located In Scare Canyon including Parcel Number 16-110-0000 as Surplus Property – Executive Buttars indicated some interested persons have initiated this. Attorney Edwards stated a quit claim deed from The Hideout, LLC, transferred ownership of the parcel to Cache County to be used as a public park providing unrestricted public access thereto and a developed trail for public usage. There is no reversion clause.

Director Runhaar remarked the 12-acre parcel was left over from The Hideout subdivision and is not buildable.

Executive Buttars said it appears this parcel has the only access to a privately owned parcel.

Chairman Ward opened the Public Hearing and invited public comment.

<u>Mark Ross</u>, owner of adjacent property, is interested in purchasing the property and believes it came to the county for access to The Hideout property. Scare Canyon possesses deeded right-of-way on the main roads, but not on the smaller roads.

There was no other public comment.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Zilles to close the Public Hearing. White seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

Gina Worthen reminded Council members to let her know of any interest or concerns with current legislation. Council member White suggested the state inmate pay for stay issue. North Logan is trying to figure out funding for a new museum. An online survey produced significant interest in the idea. Worthen feels this is a lot for a single modest-sized city to take on and asked the Council to consider ways to assist in the project.

<u>Dave Erickson</u> reminded the Council that this Friday is the deadline for RAPZ requests and asked about the status of the Chamber building. Executive Buttars said an offer has been received and the acceptance is contingent upon the Council's acceptance which will be on a future agenda.

<u>Paul Borup</u> attended the Richmond Council meeting's discussion on the creation of a metro fire district in the north part of the county. Richmond's mayor is very interested in the possibility.

**Gordon Zilles** reminded the Council that the Cache Valley Rendezvous is this weekend.

**Executive Buttars** said there are a lot of projects coming to the county currently.

<u>Karl Ward</u> stated a need to work on the Davenport Road issue to bring it to finalization and requested an Executive Session for the March 12, 2019 Council meeting.

## RESOLUTION DECLARING COUNTY INTEREST IN REAL PROPERTY LOCATED IN LOGAN CANYON INCLUDING PARCEL NUMBER 18-065-0006 AS SURPLUS PROPERTY

WHEREAS, Cache County intends to sell the County interest in real property described in Exhibit "A"; and

  - c. Whether the purpose served by the property or its use either no longer exists or has significantly changed because of the needs and demands of the county or as may be determined by a change of policy evidenced by an ordinance or resolution of the county council.
  - d. Whether the property is so damaged, depreciated or worn that it is inoperable or limited in operation without repairs and the cost of such repairs is unreasonable, excessive or impractical.
  - e. Whether the purposes and interests of the county would be better served by the declaration of the property as surplus and the disposition of that property.

THEREFORE, the Cache County Council, after holding a public hearing, resolves that the Property, better described in "Exhibit A" shall be declared surplus, and that such surplus property may be disposed of by the County Executive subject to the provisions of Cache County Code Chapter 3.40. This resolution takes effect immediately upon adoption.


