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#### THE CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

March 14, 1995

The Cache County Council met in regular session on the 14th day of March, 1995 in the County Council Chambers at 120 North 100 West, Logan, Utah 84321.

#### ATTENDANCE

Council members present: Chairman Sarah Ann Skanchy, Vice Chairman C. Larry Anhder, Council members Guy Ray Pulsipher, H. Craig Petersen, Jerry L. Allen, Darrel L. Gibbons. Councilman Layne M. Beck was absent and excused.

Others present: Cache County Executive M. Lynn Lemon; Cache County Clerk Stephen M. Erickson; Cache County Attorney Scott Wyatt; Cache County Auditor Tamra Stones; Cache County Sheriff Sid Groll; The Director of the Cache/Rich Tourist Council Maridene Alexander; Acting Director of the Cache Forest Service Chip Sibberson; State Senator Lyle W. Hillyard; Cache Chamber of Commerce President Doug Thompson; Cache Valley Communication Center Director Peggy Langille; Representatives of the local news media and other interested citizens.

## CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Sarah Ann Skanchy called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and welcomed all who were in attendance. Councilman Beck was excused from this meeting.

#### INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Councilman Guy Ray Pulsipher.

# AGENDA & MINUTES

The agenda for the meeting was adjusted and approved.

The minutes of the Council meeting held on February 28, 1995 and sent to all members of the Council were corrected and approved.

#### REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

The County Executive M. Lynn Lemon reported on the following items:

#### 1. Appointments:

The following individuals were presented to the Council for appointment approval.

Appointment: Nilson, Michael EOC Public Information Officer

Appointment: Pond, Dan V. County Appraiser
Appointment: Bradley, Dixie R. Deputy Assessor
Appointment: Bodrero, Karen Deputy Assessor

It was moved by Councilman Petersen that all appointments be approved. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

- 2. Bear Lake Dredging: Lemon has signed an agreement prepared by Ron Law a member of the Bear Lake County Commission approving the proposed Bear Lake dredging project. The agreement has been sent to the State of Idaho and the Corps of Engineers.
- 3. Wilderness Designation: USU has prepared a report on Wilderness and the Economic and Environmental impact caused by wilderness. The report will be in the Executives Office for review.
- 4. Warrant Register: The Warrant Register was presented and given to the County Clerk for filing.

#### TAX LEGISLATION: STATE SENATOR LYLE W. HILLYARD

State Senator, Lyle Hillyard was asked by Chairman Skanchy to update the Council on tax legislation that took place during the past 1995 legislative session. Hillyard reviewed legislation dealing with property tax. Including SB 254, which requires a vote of the people before any increase in property taxes. The law if passed will be in effect for the next two years. Hillyard said that it was hard for the Legislature to deal with the 135 million dollar surplus. The Legislature decided to lower property taxes for 1995. Cache County has been in compliance with the state property tax factoring process. Our county will receive a greater reduction in property taxes because the County Assessor complied last year with state factoring requirements. Executive Lemon expressed concern that the centrally assessed property taxes are dropping faster than property tax on homes. Hillyard said the Legislature is aware of the problem and working to correct it.

Senator Hillyard asked Council members to recommend individuals who may serve on various State Boards. Councilman Petersen praised Senator Hillyard for the work he is doing as a State Senator.

#### TOURIST COUNCIL REPORT: MARIDENE ALEXANDER

The Director of the Cache/Rich Tourist Council Maridene Alexander reported to the Council on the Tourist Councils 1994 activities and budget.

#### (See attachment #1)

Alexander discussed a number of brochures and guides that have been printed to help advertise the area. She expressed concern about the Utah Travel Council changing the way that they allocate funds. She said that they now want to allocate funds on a project by project basis.

#### LOGAN CANYON SCENIC GRANT: CHIP SIBBERSON

Chip Sibberson, the acting District Ranger reported to the Council that the proposed Logan Canyon Scenic Byway has been funded by an ICTEA grant. The Grant is near \$450,000.00 and will be used to fund various projects through Logan Canyon. Some of the projects will coincide with the highway construction planned through the canyon by UDOT. Sibberson thanked the Council for helping with the project including a portion of the funding. An additional \$20,000.00 will be applied for from the County Restaurant tax. A Bear Lake over look will cost \$1,000,000.00.

#### PUBLIC HEARING: SURPLUS REAL PROPERTY-NEWTON

Chairman Skanchy convened a public hearing at 6:00 p.m. to receive public input concerning, declaring a 1/4 ac parcel of property in Newton as surplus. The County Executive M. Lynn Lemon recommends that the property be declared surplus and sold to a family in Newton who have been farming it thinking that they owned it. Skanchy asked for public input? No response from the audience was given.

A motion to close the public hearing was made by Councilman Allen. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

It was moved by Councilman Gibbons to declare the property as surplus and place it back on the County tax rolls. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

#### RESOLUTION NO. 95-09: SURPLUS REAL PROPERTY

The adoption of Resolution No. 95-09 allows the conveyance of surplus real property and authorizes the County Executive and County Clerk to execute a quick claim deed to the Jenkins family.

A motion to adopt Resolution No. 95-09 was made by Councilman Gibbons. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

#### BUDGETARY MATTERS

The following Intra-Departmental transfers were presented for Council approval:

1. CVCC \$600.00

A motion to approve the transfer was made by Vice Chairman Anhder. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

2. CVCC \$1489.00

A motion to approve this transfer was made by Councilman Gibbons. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

#### PUBLIC HEARING SET: 1995 BUDGET OPENING

Chairman Skanchy told the Council that it is necessary to open the 1995 budget which requires a public hearing.

A motion to set the public hearing on March 28, 1995 at 5:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers was made by Councilman Petersen. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

THE COUNCIL ADJOURNED FROM THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING INTO A BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.

#### BOARD OF EQUALIZATION: TAX EXEMPTION AFFIDAVITS 1995

The Board of Equalization met to consider a number of requests for property tax exemption. The Board also discussed the problem of applications being filed late (after March 1, 1995).

A motion to extend the filing date to the 15th of March was made by Councilman Pulsipher. It was seconded and passed on a 4 "Yes" to 2 "No" vote. (Councilman Beck absent)

It was moved by Councilman Gibbons not to allow an extension in 1996. There wasn't a second or a vote on this motion however it was the consensus of the Council not to allow an extension to the filing deadline in 1996.

HOSPITAL MEETING: A meeting will be scheduled in the next two weeks with the Hospital to discuss their tax exemption request.

The Board discussed and acted on the following tax exemption requests:

1. Churches-Seven Applications

(See attachment #4)

It was moved by Vice Chairman Anhder to approve the seven church applications. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

2. Sunshine Terrace Foundation:

Councilman Allen moved to approve this application. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

3. Bear River Mental Health Services:

Councilman Petersen moved to approve this application. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

4. Association for the Advancement of the Handicapped:

A motion to approve the application was made by Councilman Pulsipher. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

5. American Red Cross:

It was moved by Vice Chairman Anhder to approve the application. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

6. Trapper Trails Council-Boy Scouts of America:

Councilman Gibbons moved to approve the application. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

7. American Legion Post #58 Smithfield, Utah:

It was moved by Councilman Pulsipher to approve this application. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

8. Cache Industries Inc.:

It was moved by Councilman Gibbons to approve this application. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

9. Options for Independence:

A motion to approve this application was made by Councilman Pulsipher. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

(The above (3 through 9) appear as attachment #6)

9. Whittier Community Center:

A motion to deny this application because it doesn't meeting the charitable requirements was made by Vice Chairman Anhder. It was seconded and passed on a 4 "Yes" to 2 "No" vote.

10. Cache Chamber of Commerce:

The Board was concerned about the Chamber meeting the necessary requirements to qualify for property tax exemption. The President of the Chamber said that the Chamber building has always been tax exempt because of a long time agreement between the County and the Chamber. Auditor Stones, said that the application does not meet the requirements to be exempt. This application was tabled until the County Attorney can make a legal opinion.

THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION ADJOURNED FROM THEIR BOARD MEETING BACK INTO THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT: WESTON SIGN

The Council discussed the Findings of Fact prepared by the County Attorney Scott Wyatt concerning their decision on the Weston sign in Wellsville Canyon. The Council expressed concern about the fact that there wasn't a time limit requiring the Westons to meet the terms of the decision.

A motion to amend the Findings of Fact to include the date of June 1, 1995 as the date to meet the stipulations was made by Councilman Petersen. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

It was moved by Councilman Gibbons to approve the Findings of Fact as prepared by the County Attorney with the amended time limit added. It was seconded and passed on a 5 "Yes" to 1 "No" vote. (Councilman Beck absent)

#### RESOLUTION NO. 95-10: BENSON WATER DISTRICT ANNEXATION

The adoption of Resolution No. 95-10 will satisfy a request from the Benson Culinary Water District to set a public hearing to meet legal requirements. The District wants the County to annex additional property into the District that they are already serving.

Councilman Allen moved to adopt Resolution No. 95-10 and set the Public Hearing on April 11, at 6:00 p.m.. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

#### WILLOW PARK ADVISORY BOARD BUDGET REQUEST: REST-ROOMS

The Willow Park Advisory Board is recommending that the Council approve a recommendation that will allow the transfer from their reserve fund \$20,000.00 to complete a proposed rest-room. The rest-room was budgeted \$50,000.00 from the Restaurant Tax. However the low bid of 6 was up \$20,000.00 more than expected.

A motion to allow the transfer was made by Councilman Gibbons. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

The proposed transfer will now go before the Logan City Council for approval.

# COMMUNICATIONS CENTER NON-MERIT POSITION TO MERIT POSITION: PEGGY LANGILLE

The Director of the Cache Valley Communication Center Peggy Langille appeared before the Council to request a budget transfer of \$2,000.00. This will cover a change of a part time non-merit employee to a merit employee.

#### (See attachment #10)

Councilman Allen moved that the budget transfer be approved. It was seconded and carried unanimously. (Councilman Beck absent)

#### FAST COPS REQUEST: GROLL, SID-COUNTY SHERIFF

The County Sheriff Sid Groll informed the Council that Hyrum City, Smithfield City and Wellsville City have received funding through the recently passed federal crime bill. The Cities will have one additional sheriff each for three years. Sheriff Groll said that the funding supplies autos etc. and will not cost the County anything.

#### COUNCILMAN DARREL L. GIBBONS LEAVES THE MEETING

Councilman Gibbons left the meeting at 7:30 p.m..

#### JAIL PROGRAM OFFICER: GROLL, SID-COUNTY SHERIFF

County Sheriff Groll is requesting a Jail Program Officer. Groll reviewed the need for the officer and his duties and responsibilities. The funding to pay for the officer was discussed as well as equipment and secretary. The matter was tabled for further study and will be on a future agenda for discussion.

#### COUNTYWIDE LIBRARY: DISCUSSION

The Council briefly discussed the status of the proposed countywide library system. Councilman Petersen said that the present Resolution is being redrafted. Due to the passing of legislation that requires a vote of the people before property taxes are increased. Problems & questions concerning bonding, location of buildings and library access on the West side of the county were discussed. The issue will be on the next Council meeting agenda.

The County Attorney Scott Wyatt suggested that maybe a library could be classed as recreation which would allow it to fall under special district.

#### NIBLEY CITY: COUNTY WELL PERMIT

Executive Lemon reviewed a request from Nibley City who would like the County to give a county owned well permit to that City for well development. Lemon explained, that the County obtained the well permit in order to protect the county from affecting the Nibley City water source due to county gravel excavation near their springs. So far the excavation has not affected their springs and now they would like to use the County well permit. Lemon said that he told Nibley City that the County would let them have the permit if they would release the County from any responsibility concern their water source. The County Attorney has been asked to draft a release and conditions of the release.

#### CULINARY WATER: JOE NIELSON LETTER

Joe Nielson, from Paradise, has written a letter to the Council concern culinary water. Members of the Council all have a copy of the letter for review. The issue will be on the next Council meeting agenda.

#### TONY GROVE COMMENTS: TRAIL & RECREATION AREA IMPROVEMENTS

The County has been asked to comment on recreation improvements at Tony Grove in Logan Canyon. Comments are to be in before April 10th, 1995. It will be on the next Council meeting agenda.

#### COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Councilman Allen: He attended the ribbon cutting for the new BRAG house. Allen said that it is an outstanding facility. It is a club house with members.

Vice Chairman Anhder: Employee Compensation Committee is not composed of the right people. Anhder believes that it should have other members besides county employees. Chairman Skanchy suggested that Anhder draft a revision of the county personnel ordinance with his recommendations.

Councilman Petersen: Countywide Planner recommendations. A meeting on March 29th has been scheduled to discuss the Planners planning recommendations.

Councilman Pulsipher: Water problems in the South end of the County during last weekends storms were handled very well by the County Road Superintendent Joe Kirby.

#### MAY TAX SALE

The County Executive Lemon and County Auditor Stones are concerned about individuals who are home owners and who haven't paid their property taxes before the May tax sale. The Council reaffirmed that they are willing to work with those individuals and they don't want anyone displaced out of their homes if possible.

IN THE MATTER OF THE REQUEST FOR A SPECIAL PERMIT BY WESTONS/SHERWOOD HILLS FOR A SIGN IN A FR-40 ZONE

FINDINGS AND ORDER

### FINDINGS

The Cache County Council, Utah, makes the following findings in the above designated application:

- 1. David Weston (Applicant) as agent for Sherwood Hills, Inc. filed a request for a special permit to allow a business sign to be maintained on property owned by Applicant in Wellsville Canyon. A sign had been placed on the subject property by Weston without proper authorization or necessary permits.
- 2. Sherwood Hills, Inc. is a resort accessed by, but located some distance off, highway 89/91 and is largely hidden from view from the highway by surrounding trees. The only portion of the resort that is easily visible from the highway is a golf course and some small out building.
- 3. Sherwood Hills, Inc. is an allowed use in the FR-40 zone and the resort was established with authorization of the County Commission decades ago.
- 4. The County Council believes that because a prior governing body of the County allowed the construction of a business in Wellsville Canyon the current business owners should receive adequate consideration for some type of sign identifying the business for passerbys and customers particularly since the business is not readily visible from the highway.

- 5. The Council finds that granting a special permit to allow Applicant the requested sign, with certain modifications as enumerated below, is reasonable and necessary for the public convenience, necessity, welfare and safety based on the following:
- a. The sign requested is reasonable and is reasonably necessary to the applicant and the beneficial use of his property. The Applicant needs a sign similar to the requested sign to adequately identify his business.
- b. The sign requested is not inconsistent with the general purpose and intent of the zone. The zone allows lodges, recreation grounds and facilities for public use and adequate posting is necessary for that use.
- c. The sign does not emit any noise, smoke, fumes or odors so it will not be offensive to adjacent property owners for those concerns.
- d. The sign does not create nor unreasonable increase hazards or dangers to adjacent property owners or to the community because of or resulting from fire, explosion, pollution, increased traffic congestion, increased parking, or from the presence of any dangerous conditions or materials more than any other uses permitted in the zone.
- e. An injustice would result if a special permit for a sign were not granted as the Applicant would be hampered in his ability to adequately promote or identify the business. The fact that the resort is hidden some distance from the road creates a stronger need for an identification sign.

- f. Relieving the Applicant's parcel of land from the requirements of the existing zone restrictions would not adversely affect the public interest in having the zoning ordinance strictly enforced.
- g. The Applicant has shown that the sign is not harmful to the public welfare and convenience.
- h. Certain conditions and restrictions, are imposed and agreed to by applicant.
- i. The sign will not require any municipal services which would not be made available for uses otherwise permitted in this zone.

### ORDER

Based on the foregoing the Council orders that:

- 1. Applicant is awarded a special permit to maintain the sign already located on the property subject to the following limitations and restrictions:
- a. Any required zoning clearance and building permits will be requested and received by Applicant,
- b. The existing sign will be temporarily removed to satisfy the conditions stated herein,
- c. The sign will be re-erected to a maximum height of 35 feet from the natural ground level and will be placed with required inspections by the County Building Official,
- d. The reader board will be removed permanently from the sign,

- e. There will be sufficient landscaping placed around the base of the sign so as to assist in blending the sign with the natural environment.
- 2. If any of the above stated stipulations are not met by June 1, 1995, this permit shall be null and void.
  - 3. This permit will run with the land.

The effective date of this order is February 28, 1995.

### RESOLUTION NO. 95-10

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THAT IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL TO ANNEX AREA INTO THE BENSON CULINARY WATER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT AND SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE SAME.

WHEREAS: The Cache County Council has the authority under U.C.A. section 17A-2-332 to consider and act upon requests to extend the boundaries of any improvement district;

WHEREAS: The Cache County Council has received the request of the Board of Trustees of the Benson Culinary Water Improvement District to annex into the improvement district the area described in Exhibit "A" and illustrated on the map in Exhibit "B";

WHEREAS: It appears to the Council that the requested annexation is in the best public interests; and

WHEREAS: In order to effect this annexation the Council desires to set a public hearing and provide notice of the same in accordance with U.C.A. section 17A-2-333 and 17A-2-304 to receive public discussion on the proposed annexation:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

Section 1: Declaration of Intent to Annex.

The Cache County Council hereby declares that the public health, convenience, and necessity requires the annexation of the area described in Exhibit "A" and "B" into the Benson Culinary Water Improvement District and that it is the intent of this Council to effect the annexation as requested and described herein.

## Section 2: Public hearing to discuss the proposed annexation.

A public hearing will be held to discuss the proposed annexation of the area into the Benson Culinary Water Improvement District on the 11th day of April, 1995 at 6:50 p.m.

## Section 3. Notice Requirements for Public Hearing.

Notice shall be given for the public hearing and shall include the following:

- B. The district's current boundaries as further described in Exhibit "A,"



- C. That the proposed improvements are limited to connecting homes to current water lines in the area to be annexed,
- D. That the estimated costs of the proposed improvements are \$1,500.00 per household in the frea to be annexed. It is expected that individuals residing in the Benson Culinary Water Improvement District, as it is presently constituted, will not have any additional costs associated with the annexation, and
- E. No bonds will be issued to pay for any of the improvements.
- F. Notice of the hearing shall be published once a week for three successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the county.

Section 4. Effective Date.
