CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

September 10, 1996

The Cache County Council met in a regular session on the 10th day of September, 1996 in the Council Chambers located at 120 North 100 West, Logan, Utah 84321.

ATTENDANCE

Council Chairman Sarah Ann Skanchy and Vice Chairman C. Larry Anhder were present. Council members present were; Guy Ray Pulsipher, Layne M. Beck, H. Craig Petersen, Jerry L Allen and Darrel L. Gibbons.

Others present were: Cache County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon, Cache County Clerk, Stephen M. Erickson, Cache County Auditor, Tamra Stones, Cache County Sheriff, Sidney P. Groll, Cache County Recorder Michael Gleed, Cache County Fire Chief, Kelly Pitcher, Cache County Zoning Administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh, Cache County Senior Citizen Director Marcee Cazier, Cache County Water Policy Director, Thad Erickson, Cache County Administrative Assistant, Michael Nilson, Representatives from the local news media and other interested citizens.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Sarah Ann Skanchy called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and welcomed all who were in attendance.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Vice Chairman C. Larry Anhder.

AGENDA & MINUTES

The agenda for the meeting was reviewed and approved.

The minutes of the regular Council meeting held on August 27, 1996 and sent to all members of the Council were discussed, corrected and approved.

REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

The County Executive M. Lynn Lemon reported on the following items:

1: Appointments:

Appointment: Cooper, Holly Ann as Dep. Sheriff Res. Officer Appointment: Peck, Doyle Willard, as Dep. Sheriff Res. Officer Appointment: Hardin, Michael Lee, as Dep. Sheriff Res. Officer

Appointment: Nyberg, William Darce, as Dep. Sher. Res. Officer

A motion to approve the above appointments was made by Vice Chairman Anhder. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

2. CDBG Workshop and Public Hearing (1997-98):

A workshop on how to apply for CDBG funding for 1997-98 projects will be held on September 19th in the Hyde Park City Offices at 6:00 p.m.. Those applicants who are requesting County sponsorship for their projects are required to attend.

CDBG PUBLIC HEARING SET: Executive Lemon, set the first Public Hearing to receive CDBG applications from the public requesting County sponsorship for their projects. The Public Hearing will be held on September 24, 1996 at 5:15 p.m. in the Council Chambers.

- 3. UDOT Open House at Ideal Beach: The Utah Department of Transportation will be holding an open house at Ideal Beach on the South end of Bear Lake, on September 24th at 6:00 p.m.. The Open House will provide an opportunity for citizens, community leaders and others to talk to Transportation Commissioner Todd Weston and other UDOT Officials about transportation needs. The County Road Superintendent Joe Kirby will represent the County at the meeting.
- 4. Warrants: The warrants were presented to the County Clerk for filing.

BUDGETARY MATTERS

The following Intra-Departmental budget transfers were considered by the Council:

1. County Recorder: \$2,000.00

Councilman Petersen moved to approve the requested budget transfer. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

2. Jail: \$2,000.00

(See attachment #2)

A motion to approve the Jail budget transfer was made by Councilman Gibbons. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING SET: BUDGET OPENING-1996

Chairman Skanchy explained the need to make adjustment to the 1996 budget and recommended setting a public hearing for the next Council meeting.

It was moved by Councilman Gibbons to set the public hearing on September 24, 1996 at 6:00 p.m. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

THE COUNCIL ADJOURNED FROM THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING INTO A BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION: PROPERTY TAX CHANGED VALUATIONS

The Secretary for the Board of Equalization, Tamra Stones reviewed the changes made in the property tax valuations on certain properties in the County during Board of Equalization hearings. Stones recommended approving the changes.

Board member Pulsipher moved to approve the property tax valuations changes. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

The Board has heard 378 appeals this year compared to 375 last year. Another hearing to finalize all 1997 tax appeals will be held on September 18th. Vice Chairman Anhder recommended that property tax notices be combined as land and resident to facilitate the hearing process.

THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION ADJOURNED BACK INTO THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING.

RESOLUTION NO. 96-28: SENIOR CITIZEN LOAN APPROVAL

The adoption of Resolution No. 96-28 will approve a loan agreement for the Cache Senior Citizen's and authorize the execution of the agreement by the County Executive. The loan will be for \$115,000.00 and will be paid back over a five year period beginning in 1998.

Resolution No. 96-28 will appear in the minutes as printed and the agreement will be assigned a number, signed and kept as a contract or agreement in the County Clerks Office.

A motion to adopt Resolution No. 96-28 was made by Councilman Allen. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

Item 9b on the agenda requesting an inter-department transfer in Resolution form to provide the \$115,000.00 for the Senior Center was deleted from the agenda. The transfer will be part of the 1996 budget opening at the next Council meeting.

RESOLUTION NO. 96-29: EOC WELL COSTS-BUDGET TRANSFER

Michael Nilson, County Administrative Assistant explained the need for additional funding to finish the Emergency Operations Centers well. Nilson said that the well has been completed as far as the drilling goes but the well needs to be tested and connected to the EOC. Materials and equipment to totally complete the well project will cost more. The adoption of Resolution No. 96-29 will transfer funds into the well account to pay for its completion.

A motion to adopt Resolution No. 96-29 was made by Vice Chairman Anhder. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

A.D.A. IMPROVEMENTS CACHE COMMERCE BUILDING: DISCUSSION

This agenda item was not discussed due to no representation from the Bear River Association of Governments who are directing the remodeling project to the Commerce Building on 160 North Main, Logan, Utah to meet ADA requirements. Apparently they havn't received any bids at this point in time.

AGRICULTURAL PROTECTION AREAS-COUNTY PROCEDURES: DISCUSSION

Chairman Skanchy reviewed what the Council has done in the past regarding the Agricultural Protection Areas in the County. Skanchy said that we have set up a Board as directed by legislation but nothing has been done to provide a procedure for applying for a protection area or setting a fee. The Council discussed recommendations from the Agricultural Protection Board regarding the size of the protected area. It was suggested that the size of the area in the South end of the County should be different from the North end because of the smaller parcels of agricultural land in the South. Other concerns were discussed such as the number of land owners in an area and the number of years limiting the area.

It was determined that the Administration and County Attorney draft a procedure to apply for or to grant an agricultural protection area in the County for Council review and approval.

TAX ABATEMENT: HARDSHIP REQUESTS

The following Tax Abatement Hardship requests were considered

by the Council:

A motion to <u>approve</u> the above two requests was made by Vice Chairman Anhder. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

3. Mary Robinson from River Heights.

A motion to deny this request was made by Vice Chairman Anhder. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

4. Justin Dekanyi and Julie Willis from Smithfield.

(See attachment #8)

It was moved to deny this request by Vice Chairman Anhder. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously.

5. Gail Peterson

A motion to table this request for additional information was made by Councilman Gibbons. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

WATER POLICY ADVISORY BOARD RECOMMENDATIONS: BEAR RIVER STORAGE PROJECT.

Thad Erickson, County Water Policy Director, appeared before the Council to discuss recommendations dealing with water storage and other issues regarding water in the County. Erickson reviewed the minutes of a recent meeting held by the County Water Policy Board. The Boards recommendations are as follows:

- 1. That economic feasibility be demonstrated through valid benefit-cost analysis and that (as a Minimum) the project is capable of returning state cost of borrowing.
- 2. That costs be allocated according to benefits received and to whomever they may accrue.
- 3. That the normal rules of state water law are observed in the appropriation, storage, and release of the waters involved.

4. That comparative analysis with other options for meeting water supply needs show the surface water storage option to be the least costly* solution.

*Intangible values, social costs or benefits, direct or indirect, are not intended to be excluded from an economic analysis.

The Council discussed water storage areas other than the Bear River, such as the Barrens located near Amalga. Water studies presently being done were also discussed.

Vice Chairman Anhder moved to accept the recommendations from the County Water Policy Advisory Board as County policy for the present time. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously.

CLOUD SEEDING-1996-97: DISCUSSION

Executive Lemon reported that he had been in contact with the Box Elder County Commission concerning cloud seeding in the area for 1996-97. Lemon said that Box Elder County has suggested that we not cloud seed this year. They would like to start building a fund that would eventually allow Box Elder and Cache Counties the ability to purchase their own cloud seeding equipment. After discussing the issue it was the consensus of the Council that the county continue with our present cloud seeding program. Cloud seeding will be further discussed during a future Council meeting.

FAST COPS PROGRAM: GROLL, SIDNEY P.

The County Sheriff, Sid Groll, appeared before the Council to discuss the Federal Government's Fast Cops program. The program provides grant money to hire additional Officers for police protection in the Sheriff's Department. Groll said that there is a deadline on September 15th to apply for the federal funding. The program would help solve the problem of not having 24 hour police protection in the County. The Federal program would allow the County to apply for funding to hire as many as three additional officers. The grant money would pay 75% of what is needed and the County would have to pay the other 25%. The 75% would equate to \$75,000.00 per officer over a three year period. Groll said that the County would need to equip the officers with a car etc. The equipment and the 25% would cost approximately \$22,000.00 per officer.

Executive Lemon said that there is a concern in the County

about not having 24 hour police protection. However, he is also concerned with the additional funding needed for the program when there are so many other areas in the county that also need funding.

Chairman Skanchy said that she is worried about financing the program when the federal funds runs out.

Vice Chairman Anhder moved to apply for funding for one officer. It was seconded and passed on a 5 "Yes" to 1 "No" vote. Chairman Skanchy voted "No".

PERSONNEL POLICY FINANCIAL IMPACT-SICK LEAVE, COMPENSATORY TIME, TWO STEP WAGE PLAN: DISCUSSION

Executive Lemon and the Council discussed three county personnel areas that if approved may have a financial impact on the county budget, in some cases. The proposed two step wage plan would come from the Departments 1996 budgets. Lemon said that county employees were told during last years budget time that the Council would discuss the two step wage plan. Department Heads are now reporting that the funding is available from their 1996 budgets. The two step wage plan will total approximately \$120,000.00 per year. Compensation for sick leave and compensatory time were discussed.

Councilman Gibbons recommended that a workshop be scheduled to study the issues. A workshop will be held at 4:00 p.m. on September 24th before the regular Council meeting.

FAMILY PRESERVATION AND SUPPORT PLAN: GRANT REQUEST-USU

Chairman Skanchy informed the Council that USU's Department of Family & Human Development Center is in the process of applying for a grant through the County. The Grant will be used to study and organize the preservation of families.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Councilman Pulsipher: Pulsipher expressed concern over road right-of-way requirements in the unincorporated areas of the County. The Planning and Zoning Commission are getting a number of complaints regarding the width of the right-of-way needed to obtain a permit to build a home in some locations of the County.

Councilman Gibbons: Gibbons who is a member of a committee to evaluate the salary of the Director of BRAG, asked Council members for input concerning the salary. Some Council members suggested that no increase be given and that freezing the salary would be proper. It was also suggested that the salary be evaluated annually.

ADJOURNMENT

No further business was presented and Chairman Skanchy adjourned the meeting at 7:35 p.m..

CACHE COUNTY WATER POLICY ADVISORY BOARD Minutes of 3 SEPTEMBER 1996 MEETING (With member's review comments through

September 9)

Minutes of the last meeting on July 30, 1996 were approved with the following modifications: Larry Anhder's memo of 7 August 1996 to the County Executive/Council on the water conservancy district issue and recommending that the status quo be maintained for now should be made a part of the July 30 meeting minutes. The sentence concerning the difficulty of dealing with intangibles such as wild life values, flood control, and recreation, etc. lacks clarity. We have a gender problem on the reference to Monti Jones, candidate for the legislature. Her name was incorrectly referred to as "his" rather than "her." "Kent Hortin" is correct rather than "Kent Horton." While the minutes reflected that the Board felt that we had a lack of information on some important issues, we also have the correct institutional structure in place to deal with the issue at hand.

Jay supported Lynn Lemon's letter to the Bear River Commission on the importance of maintaining Cache water and property rights including historic river flows. The letter recommended that the Compact not be reopened.

Thad discussed conversations he has had with Frank Nishaguchi, Manager of the Bear River Water Conservancy District, and Sen. John Holmgren on common interests between Box Elder and Cache Counties on water issues. Sen. Holmgren's proposal to investigate a Barrens option modification to store high quality winter and spring runoff from tributaries such as Logan River was briefly discussed. A follow up joint meeting to the one held in June in Brigham City and initiated by Sen. Holmgren is scheduled for 26 Sep. at 6:00 PM in the Cache County Council Chambers. The 1997 Utah Ground Water Protection Conference will be held May 8 and 9 at the Moab Valley Inn, Moab, UT. There is a new 7 ½ minute geologic quadrangle map out for Logan. Copies of the narrative portion of the map package concerning floods on Logan River were passed out. USGS research on potential groundwater quality degradation in Salt Lake County through long term pumping has recently been reported in Utah Dept. of Natural Resources Technical Publications 110-A and 110-C. Copies of the abstracts and conclusions of these reports were distributed.

Discussions on Cache County interest in the Bear River Storage issue began with Alison's draft statement as a point of departure. Her statement included input provided by Jay and Thad which had been previously circulated to all board members by mail. Jay sketched the history of Bear River storage studies he remembered since coming to Logan in 1947. A series of studies beginning with the Bureau of Reclamation and other comprehensive studies were used by the State in leading up to the 1992 Bear River Basin planning document that provides us with much information. Bill wants to know what Box Elder County is going to do about storage. Kent

discussed the groundwater interference issue and the perspective of the Bear River Water Users and their concern about protection of property rights. Kent favors being proactive rather than reactive on the storage issue. Larry Parker was concerned that adopting wording in a recommendation on policy which rigidly restricted development to the least costly option would fail to recognize sufficiently some intangible values such as recreation, conservation, aesthetic, environmental, and wildlife aspects. It was agreed that these minutes would show that the board's intent was to recognize these values as essential to the analysis when the least costly solution is arrived at. Wally pointed out that groundwater usage is subject to surface water rights, but we are not ready to accept the State Engineer's analysis on interference. Considerable discussion occurred on water availability, restrictions on development due to shortage of water, water rights transfer, subsidy to agriculture, and who will use the water if we don't. Bill moved that we accept the statement prepared by Alison with specified deletions and substitutions with the resulting wording as provided below. Alison seconded and the motion carried with no dissenting votes.

CACHE COUNTY INTEREST IN BEAR RIVER STORAGE PROJECTS

The Cache County Water Policy Advisory Board, since its beginning in 1992, has focused on many issues besides proposed Bear River storage. We have investigated water rights, and economic issues such as water marketing and supply/demand modeling. We are investigating geologic characteristics and water quality. We are concerned with surface water/ground water interference, replacement, and sustained yield optimization. A study by Trevor Hughes of depletion of water flows by four Cache municipalities will be available soon and applies directly to the replacement issue. Water quality data collection projects now, or soon to be, underway include: Ecosystems Research shallow ground water study (in progress), National Water Quality Assessment program (NAQUA of the USGS funded for Oct. 96) and classification of Cache County groundwater.

The Cache County Water Policy Advisory Board favors the development of any Bear River storage project subject to the following conditions being satisfied:

- 1. That economic feasibility be demonstrated through valid benefit-cost analysis and that (as a minimum) the project is capable of returning state cost of borrowing.
 - 2. That costs be allocated according to benefits received and to whomever they may accrue.
- 3. That the normal rules of state water law are observed in the appropriation, storage, and release of the waters involved.
- 4. That comparative analysis with other options for meeting water supply needs show the surface water storage option to be the least *costly** solution.
- * Intangible values, social costs or benefits, direct or indirect, are not intended to be excluded from an economic analysis.
