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### CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

### ATTENDANCE

Erickson, Cache County Auditor, Tamra Stones, Cache County Sheriff, Sid Groll, Cache County Attorney, Scott Wyatt, Cache County Zoning Administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh, Cache County Council member elect, Cordell Yeates, Cache County Administrative Assistant, Michael Nilson, Representatives from the local news media and other interested citizens.

### CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Sarah Ann Skanchy called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and welcomed those who were in attendance.

### INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Councilman H. Craig Petersen.

### **AGENDA & MINUTES**

The agenda for the meeting was reviewed, adjusted and approved.

The minutes of the last Council meeting held on December 3, 1996 and sent to all members of the Council were discussed, corrected and approved.

### REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

The County Executive M. Lynn Lemon reported on the following items:

1. Appointments

Councilman Pulsipher moved to approve the Township Board appointments. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

2. Airport Hangar Construction Project: The Airport Authority has authorized the construction of a new airplane hangar at the airport. Lemon told the Council that before construction can begin they must approve the project. The funding is in place for the project which will cost \$23,000. The new hangar replaces an old one that has been done away with.

Councilman Beck moved to adopt the 1997 Calendar. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously.

### RESOLUTION NO. 96-41: EMERGENCY 911 SERVICE INTER-LOCAL AGREEMENT APPROVAL

The adoption of Resolution No. 96-41 will approve Cache County's participation in a Centralized Communications and Dispatch Center. It also approves an Interlocal Agreement between the Logan City Police Department and Cache County. The Council and County Attorney Scott Wyatt discussed some proposed changes in the agreement. It was determined that the agreement would be corrected to reflect the changes that the Council wanted. Attachment number two of these minutes include the corrections.

It was moved by Councilman Gibbons to adopt Resolution No. 96-41 with the proposed changes in the Interlocal Agreement. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

### RESOLUTION NO. 96-42: FUNDING FOR 911 EMERGENCY SERVICES

The adoption of Resolution No. 96-42 will authorize the fee assessment of households in the unincorporated area of the county for funding their portion of the Emergency Communication Center. Some minor changes in the language of the Resolution were suggested. Wyatt will have the proposed changes made. The attachment reflects the language changes.

Vice Chairman Anhder moved to adopt Resolution No. 96-42 with the proposed changes it was seconded and carried unanimously.

### ORDINANCE NO. 96-10: TOWNSHIP BOARDS AUTHORITY-SECOND READING

Ordinance No. 96-10 was presented to the Council for second reading. The adoption of the Ordinance will establish Jurisdiction and outline the authority of the County's Township Planning and

Zoning Boards. The County Attorney and Council reviewed section 1 of the ordinance dealing with Quorum and Vacancies. Changes will be made in the definition of a Quorum and places a 60 day period given to the County Executive to replace a vacancy on the Board.

The discussion on Ordinance No. 96-10 was tabled at this time to allow the convening of a scheduled public hearing on the 1996 budget opening.

### PUBLIC HEARING: BUDGET-1996 OPENING

Chairman Skanchy convened a scheduled public hearing on opening the 1996 budget for final adjustments at 6:00 p.m. The County Auditor, Tamra Stones, was asked to review the proposed adjustments in the 1996 budget. Stones reported that all County Department Heads were contacted to review their 1996 budgets. With their help, all department budgets were able to be adjusted to cover expenditures and keep the 1996 budget balanced.

The audience was asked for comment and no response was given.

It was moved by Councilman Allen to close the Public Hearing. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

### RESOLUTION NO. 96-40: BUDGET-1996 ADJUSTMENTS

The adoption of Resolution No. 96-40 will approve adjustments to the 1996 County budget.

Councilman Gibbons made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 96-40. It was properly seconded and passed unanimously.

### ORDINANCE NO. 96-10: TOWNSHIP JURISDICTION & AUTHORITY CONT.

The Council and County Attorney continued their discussion on Ordinance No. 96-10 that gives Townships Jurisdiction and Authority.

Vice Chairman Anhder moved to adopt Ordinance No. 96.10 with the recommended changes. It was seconded by Councilman Petersen.

After the motion was made and seconded other areas of concern were discussed. The County Attorney, who drafted the Ordinance, said that the Ordinance requires the Township Boards to act as advisors to the County Planning Commission. Vice Chairman Anhder suggested that the Township Boards advise and make recommendations directly to the County Council. Councilman Gibbons recommended

that the Ordinance not be changed in that area, because, of what the State Legislature may change in the Township law next year.

Anhder moved to amend his original motion by amending the Ordinance starting in section D. That the starting paragraph and the D be deleted and have items 1 & 2 become items 6 & 7 of section C. and having Planning Commission replaced by County Council in the new numbered 6 & 7 items. The motion was seconded and passed on a 4 "Yes" to 3 "No" vote.

The question on the original motion, including the passed amendment, was called for. The motion passed 6 "Yes" 1 "No", Skanchy voted "No".

### RESOLUTION NO. 96-43: ROADS-MINIMUM SPECIFICATIONS-SECOND READING

The adoption of Resolution No. 96-43 will approve minimum standards for all roads constructed in the County.

It was moved by Councilman Gibbons to adopt Resolution No. 96-43. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously.

### GUNNELL SUBDIVISION: PLAT APPROVAL (FINAL)

The County Zoning Administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh, presented to the Council a final subdivision plat. The subdivision is located in the Mount Sterling area of the County and is called the Gunnell Subdivision developed by Nolan & Pam Gunnell. Greenhalgh told the Council that the Planning Commission has approved the subdivision and the developer has agreed to meet all the requirements listed on the plat.

Councilman Allen made a motion to approve the final subdivision plat. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

### CACHE VIEW SUBDIVISION: PLAT APPROVAL (FINAL)

The Cache County Zoning Administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh, presented a second Final Subdivision Plat. This subdivision is located North of Wellsville and is being developed by Reed Darley. Some concern was expressed by Council members regarding the road to the proposed subdivision. Vice Chairman Anhder recommended that the developer be required to hard surface that portion of the road that goes in front of the Subdivision. Councilman Gibbons recommend that the developer be told that the road would not be hard surfaced by the County and that it be placed on the plat as

one of the stipulations for approving the subdivision.

A motion was made by Councilman Gibbons to approve the subdivision with the additional wording that the county would not hard surface the road to the subdivision. It was seconded and passed on 6 "Yes" to 1 "No" vote.

### OTHER BUSINESS

Chairman Skanchy report on two items of interest:

- 1. Forest Service Spruce Beetle: The Forest Service has informed Chairman Skanchy regarding their project to stop beetle infestation of pine trees in the area. They are spot logging and spraying to try and stop the beetles.
- 2. State Workforce Service Director: The Director of the newly created State Workforce Services Department is asking for input for potential members of the Regional Council.

### COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Councilman Beck: Asked when and who notifies him and Councilman Petersen of the meetings to be held for the new County Convention Task Force Committee. Beck was given assurance that he will be properly notified.

Vice Chairman Anhder: The Department of Environmental Water Quality has asked Cache County to make a presentation on ground water protection at their convention in Moab next summer. The County Water Policy Coordinator, Thad Erickson, will be working on the presentation.

Councilman Allen: Expressed appreciation for the opportunity to serve on the Council for the past four years. Allen mentioned some of the concerns he has about decisions that were made while serving on the Council, such as Cloud Seeding, Sherwood Hills and their sign not being properly landscaped. He thanked Chairman Skanchy and Executive Lemon for doing such an outstanding job.

### **ADJOURNMENT**

No further business was presented for action and this meeting was adjourned at 7:15 p.m..

BE IT RESOLVED that:

### SECTION 1: DECLARATION OF NEED

There is hereby declared a need for participation by Cache County in the centralized communications and dispatch center to meet communications needs including law enforcement, fire protection, emergency medical, and other areas of public safety.

### SECTION 2: INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

The attached user entity Interlocal Agreement between the Logan City Police 911/Service Unit and Cache County is hereby approved and the Cache County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to execute that agreement on behalf of Cache County.

### SECTION 3: ASSESSMENTS

An initial assessment of \$1.00 (One Dollar) per month per household and commercial site in accordance with the terms and provisions of said Interlocal Agreement is hereby approved.

### SECTION 4: PRIOR RESOLUTIONS, POLICIES OR ACTIONS

This resolution supersedes all prior resolutions, actions and policies of Cache County to the extent they are in conflict with the specific provisions hereof. In all other respects such prior resolutions, actions, and policies shall remain in full force and effect.

### SECTION 5: EFFECTIVE DATE

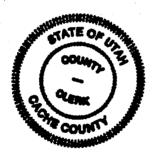

### INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR DISPATCH SERVICE

This agreement is made and entered into by and between the City of Logan, a Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as "LOGAN" and Cache County Corporation, hereinafter referred to as "USER" in this agreement.

This agreement is made and entered into by and between the parties based on the following recitals:

- A. WHEREAS the USER is in need of dispatch service, and;
- B. WHEREAS LOGAN is in a position to provide dispatch service, and;
- C. WHEREAS this agreement is made and entered into pursuant to the authority granted to the parties by the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act as set forth in Chapter 13, Title 11, Utah Code Annotated, 1953 as amended, and Section 10-1-202, Utah Code Annotated, 1953 as amended, and:
- D. WHEREAS LOGAN is able to provide centralized dispatch services which the USER needs and is not necessarily able to reasonably provide separately.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms and conditions contained herein, the parties do hereby agree as follows:

### 1. PARTICIPATION:

The USER agrees to participate in the centralized communications center by and through this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement and in accordance with the terms and conditions found herein.

### 2. SERVICES:

LOGAN shall provide centralized dispatch and communication services to the USER including dispatch and communication services for law enforcement, fire, emergency medical functions, and other emergency governmental functions. In addition, LOGAN shall provide, or cause to be provided, the necessary administrative services required for the reasonable and appropriate implementation of centralized dispatch and communication services to provide service as described herein, including auditing, fiscal services, and other administrative services.

### 3. ASSESSMENTS FOR OPERATING COSTS:

A. The USER shall be assessed for services received and the assessment shall be initially equivalent to \$1.00 (One Dollar) per month per household or commercial site located within the unincorporated area in Cache County. This assessment may

be amended by LOGAN upon due notice to the USER. There will be the opportunity for the USER to appear before LOGAN with respect to the amount of the assessment.

- B. The USER shall be billed and required to make payments to LOGAN monthly for its assessments.
- C. The operating costs shall:
  - 1. Include at least the following categories:
    - a. 911 services
    - b. Dispatch Services
    - c. Record and Recording Services; and
    - d. Miscellaneous.
  - Include, but not be limited to lease payments, building or land acquisition or leases, building maintenance, data systems, equipment, utilities, insurance, administrative costs, and financial services.
- D. Any unencumbered funds remain with LOGAN's operating budget at the end of the year and be transferred into LOGAN's reserve capital improvement and equipment fund for the operation of service.

### 4. CAPITALIZATION:

No initial contribution capital shall be required of the USER.

### 5. WITHDRAWAL:

The USER may withdraw subject to the following provisions:

- A. The USER shall be deemed withdrawn from this Agreement if the Cache County Council fails to make an annual appropriation of funds to participate in and pay the obligation of the USER under this Agreement.
- B. In other situations, the USER may withdraw upon the adoption by the Cache County Council of a Resolution of Intention to Withdraw and upon the giving of written notice to LOGAN at least six (6) months prior to the end of LOGAN's fiscal year. Withdrawal by Resolution shall

become effective on the last day of LOGAN's fiscal year in which Notice of Withdrawal is given.

### 6. RECORDS CONFIDENTIALITY:

LOGAN shall adopt a policy in accordance with applicable state law regarding the maintenance, dissemination, and retention of confidential records and information. The USER agrees to abide by the provision of that policy at all times during the term of this Agreement and after the termination of this Agreement and withdrawal of membership by the USER.

### 7. RESOLUTIONS:

The USER agrees to adopt such resolutions and take any required action as may be necessary and appropriate to carry into effect the terms of this Agreement.

### 8. COOPERATION:

The USER commits itself to render mutual cooperation to LOGAN and other users of the service provided by the terms of this Agreement and agrees to move towards standardization and unification of those functions relating to dispatch, communications services, emergency dispatching and other needed procedures.

### 9. EFFECTIVE DATE:

This Agreement shall become effective on the 1st day of January, 1997 and shall terminate on the 31st day of December, 2001.

### 10. AUTHORIZATION:

The undersigned representative of the USER confirms his authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the USER and the approval of this Agreement by the Cache County Council in a public meeting.

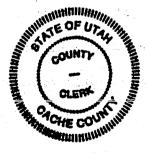

### **RESOLUTION NO. 96-42**

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR FUNDING OF A 911 EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SERVICE AND AMENDING A PREVIOUSLY PASSED RESOLUTION TO INCLUDE A LEVY FOR 911 EMERGENCY SERVICES ON RADIO COMMUNICATIONS ACCESS LINES IN ACCORDANCE WITH UTAH LAW.

WHEREAS, the Utah Legislature has enabled Public Agencies to provide for the funding of a 911 Emergency Telephone System by the levy of a monthly charge not to exceed \$.50 (Fifty Cents) per month for each local exchange service line; and

WHEREAS, Cache County has previously adopted a resolution levying such surcharge in the amount of \$.50 (Fifty Cents) per month pursuant to State law; and

WHEREAS, Cache County has authorized Logan City Police Department to collect the levy enacted for provision of 911 Emergency Telephone Services; and

WHEREAS, the Utah Legislature has now amended the State enabling law to authorize the collection of a levy from radio communication services and radio communication access lines as defined in State law;

### NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that:

- 1. There is hereby assessed against every local exchange service switched access line and every revenue producing radio communication access line as those are defined in State law, a charge of \$.50 (Fifty Cents) per month for each local exchange service switch access line for the provision of 911 Emergency Telephone Service within the jurisdiction of Cache County.
- 2. Notification of the intent to levy the charge shall be given to the Public Service Commission at least 30 (thirty) days prior to the effective date of this Resolution.
- Cache County authorizes Logan City Police Department to directly receive from the providers of local exchange service and radio communications service the monies received from the levy for purposes of providing 911 Emergency Telephone Service within the jurisdiction of Cache County.

This resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.

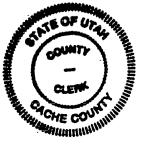

### CACHE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 96-10

### AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE JURISDICTION AND AUTHORITY OF TOWNSHIP PLANNING AND ZONING BOARDS

The County Council of Cache County, Utah, in a regular meeting, lawful notice of which had been given, finds that it is in the best interests of the County and its citizens to adopt an ordinance establishing the jurisdiction and authority of Township Planning and Zoning Boards. This ordinance is a supplement to Cache County Ordinance No. 96–03 wherein the County set forth the time and manner of conducting elections to create townships, providing for the election of Township Planning and Zoning Board members, and setting procedures thereof.

Now therefore the County Council of Cache County, Utah, ORDAINS as follows:

### SECTION 1: ORGANIZATION OF BOARD.

### A. QUORUM

- 1. A quorum of the Township Planning and Zoning Board shall consist of four members present;
- 2. A quorum of the Township Planning and Zoning Board shall have the authority to conduct all business:
- 3. A majority vote of the Township Planning and Zoning Board shall be required to take any action, pass a motion, or approve or grant any application.

### **B. VACANCIES**

- 1. There are three categories of membership of the Township Planning and Zoning Board: township electees pursuant to Ordinance 96-03 Section 5; county appointees pursuant to Ordinance 96-03 Section 6; and township board appointees pursuant to Ordinance 96-03 Section 6. Unless otherwise provided by law, vacancies shall be filled as follows:
  - (a) a township electee or county appointee vacancy of the Township Planning and Zoning Board by reason of death, resignation, removal or disqualification shall be filled by appointment by the County Executive with the advice and consent of the County Council. The Township Planning and Zoning Board may submit a list of nominees to the County Executive for his or her consideration, however, the County Executive is not required to appoint from the list of nominees.
  - (b) a township board appointee vacancy of the Township Planning and Zoning Board by reason of death, resignation, removal or disqualification shall be filled by selection by the remaining members of the Township Planning and Zoning Board, namely the three township electees and three county appointees.
- Unless otherwise provided by law, vacancies for township electees shall be filled for the unexpired term of the member replaced.
- 3. In the event the County Executive is unable, for a period of sixty (60) days, to locate sufficient residents who are willing to serve on the Township Planning and Zoning Board to create or maintain a seven-member board, the Township Planning and Zoning Board shall cease to function. Once the County Executive is able to locate sufficient residents who are willing to



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### C. MEETINGS

- The Township Planning and Zoning Board shall convene in regular meetings at least once a
  month for the conduct of its business. If no business has been initiated with the County Zoning
  office to be considered by the Township Planning and Zoning Board then the meeting scheduled
  for that month is not required.
- 2. All meetings shall be open to the public and records and minutes thereof made and maintained by the office of the County Zoning Administrator.
- 3. All meetings shall be held at the same location where the county planning commission meetings are held.

### SECTION 2: POWERS AND DUTIES OF BOARD.

- A. The extent of power conferred by this Ordinance upon a Township Planning and Zoning Board is limited to the territory included within the boundaries of the relevant township and is limited to the powers and duties set forth in county ordinances, including but not limited to the Cache County Land Use Ordinance, and Utah law.
- B. Unless specifically modified by this Ordinance, or specifically granted by Utah law, the Township Planning and Zoning Board shall be subject to all provisions of the Cache County Land Use Ordinance as it now exists and as it may be amended from time to time.
- C. After a township is created, the duly elected and appointed Township Planning and Zoning Board shall act as the planning commission within the township boundaries so far as it is authorized herein and shall:
  - 1. Act upon provisions of the land use ordinance where specifically provided for in the land use ordinance adopted by the County Council.
  - 2. Recommend to the County Council approval or denial of subdivision applications located within the township, or, amendments to existing subdivisions affecting areas within the township.
  - Approve or deny conditional use permits within the township.
  - 4. Advise the County Council on matters that the County Council directs.
  - Provide other functions as specified in law, ordinance or as directed by the County Council.
  - 6. Prepare and recommend amendments to the general plan, as it pertains to the township, to the County Council.
  - 7. Recommend to the County Council amendments to existing zoning ordinances and maps affecting areas within the township.
- D. The Office of the Cache County Zoning Administrator shall act as staff for the Township Planning and Zoning Board. Any applications for land use permits or other matters that are to be acted upon by the Township Planning and Zoning Board shall be filed with the Cache

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E. Any appeals from the Township Planning and Zoning Board shall not be filed with the County Planning Commission but shall be filed as if the appeal was taken from the County Planning Commission in the method provided for by law.

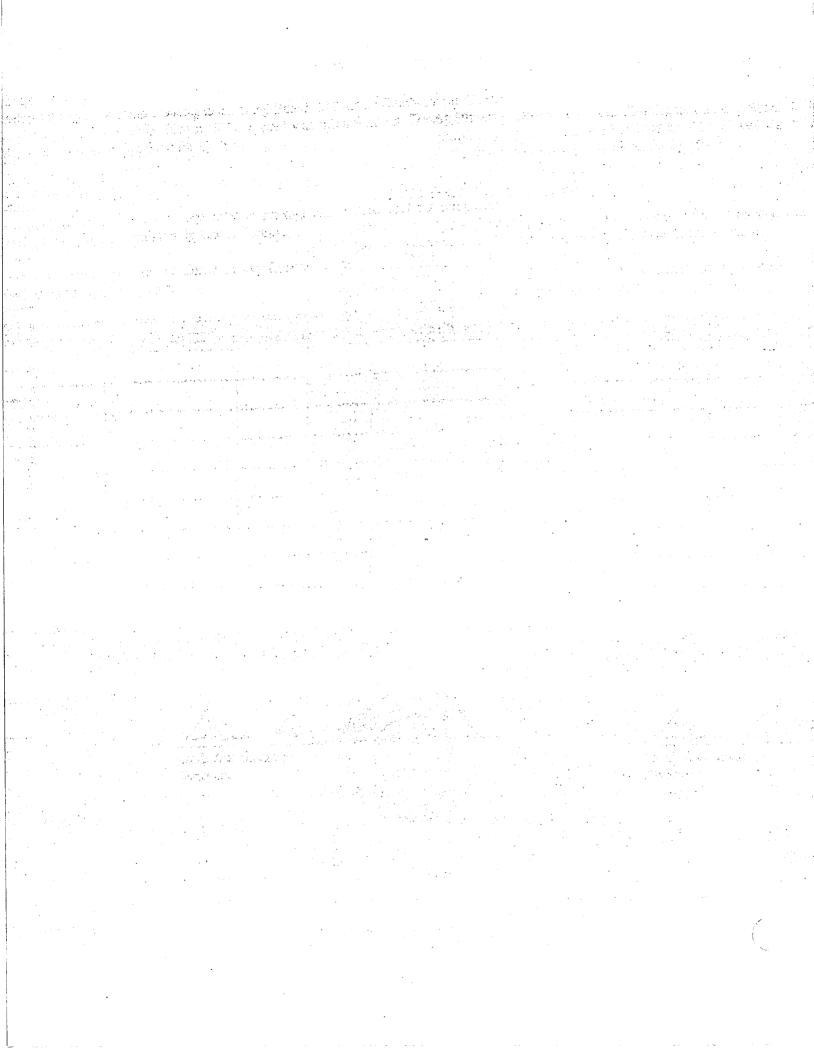

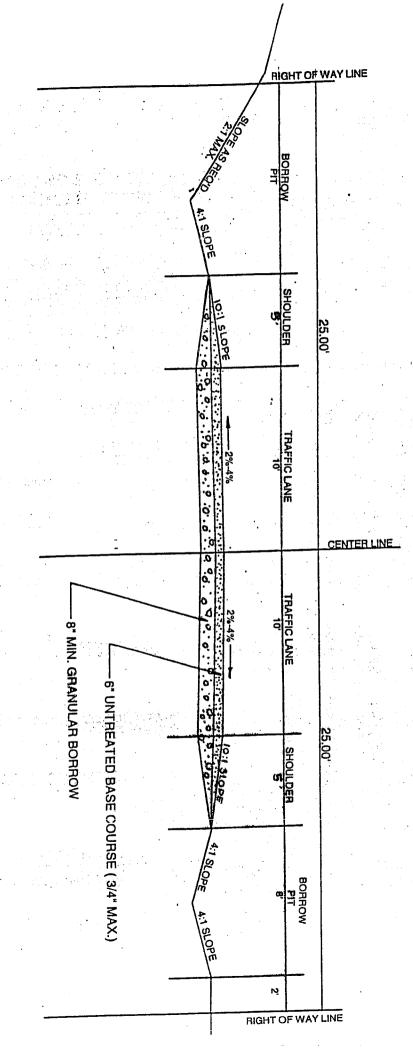
