CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

September 23, 1997

The Cache County Council met in regular session on the 23rd day of September, 1997 in the County Council Chambers located at 120 North 100 West, Logan, Utah 84321.

ATTENDANCE

Council Chairman Darrel L. Gibbons and Vice Chairman C. Larry Anhder were both in attendance. Other Council members present were: Sarah Ann Skanchy, H. Craig Petersen, Guy Ray Pulsipher, Cory Yeates and Layne M. Beck.

Others present were: County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon, County Clerk, Stephen M. Erickson, County Attorney, Scott Wyatt, County Auditor, Tamra Stones, County Sheriff, Lynn Nelson, County-Wide Planner, Mark Teuscher, County Administrative Assistant, Michael Nilson, Bridgerland Community Ice Arena Representative, Janet Borg. Members of the local news media and other interested citizens.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Darrel L. Gibbons called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and welcomed those in attendance. Members of the audience were asked to introduce themselves.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Chairman Gibbons.

AGENDA & MINUTES

The agenda was amended to include at the end of the meeting an Executive Session.

Chairman Gibbons told the Council it was necessary to have an executive session to discuss land acquisition near the Airport.

A motion to adjourn at the conclusion of the regular Council meeting into an executive session was made by Councilman Petersen. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

The minutes of the regular Council meeting held on September 9, 1997 were discussed, corrected and approved.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE REPORT

The County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon, reported on the following items:

1. Appointments:

Appointment: Giles, Marsha D. to Deputy Zoning Administrator Appointment: Taylor, Ann Ward to Deputy Auditor

It was moved by Councilman Yeates to approve the two appointments. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

- 2. Logan Canyon Cooperative Advisory Team: The LCC Advisory Team will meet on September 24 at 10:00 a.m. in the Forest Service Office. They will be discussing various options of bridge construction on the Logan Canyon Highway.
- 3. PILT Letter to Congressman James Hansen: Executive Lemon has drafted a letter, encouraged by the rural Counties in the State, to Congressman James Hansen regarding the PILT payment. The US House of Representatives have provided in a House Bill, 113.5 million dollars for PILT payment and the US Senate has a bill providing 124.00 million dollars. The letter encourages Hansen to support the Senate bill. The Council was in favor of sending the letter.

4. Road on 10th East between Providence and Logan: Lemon reported that the engineering on the 10th East road between Providence and Logan has been completed. We would like to construct the sidewalk this year and put the road construction on the CMPO list for future construction next year or the year after. The sidewalk will cost \$35,000 of which \$28,000 will be funded by the County. The project will be contracted out and hopefully completed this fall.

Vice Chairman Anhder recommended that future city annexations include County roads that may border the property being annexed.

It was moved by Council Member Skanchy to approve constructing the sidewalk this year. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

Lemon told the Council that the bidding process established for projects like this over \$10,000 will not be used. Lemon said the provision in the policy allowing construction in an emergency will be used.

- 5. Regional Weed Control District: The Executive and Weed Department have met with Forest Service Officials in the Malad, Idaho concerning their request to form a Regional Weed Control District. More money is available to such districts to control noxious weeds. The group would like to meet with the Council to present a formal request. An inter-local agreement will have to be drafted for approval.
- 6. Warrants: The warrant register for the period of September 5, 1997 to September 18, 1997 were presented to the County Clerk for filing.

BRIDGERLAND COMMUNITY ICE ARENA, INC: BORG, JANET

Janet Borg, who is now working full time on the proposed construction of an ice arena, appeared before the Council to update them on how the project is coming and how the \$100,000 CDBG money is being spent. The design of the arena has cost \$49,000. Borg reviewed the floor plan totaling 49,000 square feet. Originally 1000 seating area was proposed but the new plan will increase seating to 2000. Some have suggested that a swimming pool also be part of the arena because the heat generated from making ice can be used to heat the water for the pool. They will conduct a feasibility study before a final decision is made on a swimming pool. Hyde Park City will be the location for the arena and sites are now being considered. Borg thanked the Council for their support and getting the project going. She thinks that construction will begin in the spring and be completed by next fall. The total cost of the project is estimated to be 3.7 million dollars. The Utah Leg. will be asked to fund half of that amount and the rest will come from private donations.

BUDGETARY MATTERS

The following intra-departmental budget transfer requests were considered by the Council:

Council member Skanchy moved to approve the two Surveyor transfers. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

2. Sheriff: \$2,000.00 & \$13,000.00

Council member Skanchy moved to approve the two Sheriff

transfers. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

3. Buildings & Grounds: \$8,000.00

(See attachment #4)

It was moved by Council member Skanchy to approve the Buildings and Grounds request. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING SET: BUDGET OPENING-1997

The Council discussed opening the 1997 budget for adjustments and the need for a public hearing.

A motion to set a public hearing to open the 1997 budget for adjustments on October 14, 1997 at 6:00 p.m. was made by Councilman Yeates. It was seconded and passed unanimously.

TAX ABATEMENT APPLICATION: DISCUSSION & APPROVAL

Executive Lemon presented three requests for tax abatement due to hardship.

The three applications have been approved in passed years.

Vice Chairman Anhder moved to approve all three requests. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously.

LAND USE PLAN: DISCUSSION

La Mar Clements, representing the County Planning Commission, appeared before the Council to present the modified County-Wide Comprehensive Land Use Plan. Clements reported that the Commission passed the plan on a 5 "Yes" to 1 "No" vote. Councilman Pulsipher told the Council that Lynn Davis a member of the Commission voted no and then resigned. Pulsipher said that the commission has lost a strong member and Davis will be missed. Clements said that the Commission has concerns over private property rights, forest recreation and subdivisions. Clements favors some changes in those areas and recommended that the Council further study the plan before establishing a new ordinance. Chairman Gibbons told the Council that the Commission has made great effort in making changes to the plan. Gibbons thanked the Commission for being so diligent.

It was the consensus of the Council that they should study and review the changed plan and come prepared to further discuss the

plan during the next Council meeting on October 14, 1997. The need for a public hearing was discussed and it was determined necessary to schedule a hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING SET: LAND USE PLAN

It was moved by Council member Skanchy to set a public hearing on October 28, 1997 at 6:00 p.m.. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously.

It was suggested that the Public be invited to make written comment and be more specific as they make recommendations as to what they want in the plan.

RESTAURANT TAX POLICY CHANGES: DISCUSSION

The Council decided to hold off on any discussion for possible changes in Restaurant Tax policy until the first part of 1998.

CLOUD SEEDING-1997-98: DISCUSSION

Executive Lemon told the Council that he has received letters from the State and the North American Weather Consultants regarding possible cloud seeding for the fall of this year and the winter months of 1998. The State will again provide a 50% match for funding a clouding project in the County. The Weather Consultants provided a map showing possible effects of El Nino. El Nino may cause a winter that is wetter or dryer than normal. Vice Chairman Anhder is not in favor of cloud seeding but to use the money we normally use for cloud seeding to fund water studies in the County. Box Elder County will be contacted to see what they are proposing to do about cloud seeding. A decision has to be made before October 15, 1997.

ROAD CLOSURES-COUNTY: DISCUSSION

Executive Lemon, told the Council that he has received a number of requests from concerned citizens and property owners about closing county roads near their property. Those requesting road closures are upset about some people who use the roads by destroying their fences, equipment and property. Lemon is asking the Council for recommendations as he considers the requests. Chairman Gibbons suggested that if the road is used to access public property it shouldn't be closed. But if the road is used to access private property and all property owners agree on closing the road then closing the road maybe considered. Council member

Skanchy said that a legal opinion should be given by the County Attorney on the issue. The County Attorney, Scott Wyatt, said that he would be willing to draft a legal opinion. Lemon will continue working with the concerned property owners and wait for the attorney's opinion.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Council members had nothing to report that hadn't already been discussed. However Executive Lemon had one item for discussion. Lemon told the Council that the Utah Association of Counties are asking for money (\$5,000) to be used for public land use issues. The \$5,000 was budgeted last year and is still there. Lemon was given the okay to send the money to UAC.

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION: VALUATION CHANGES APPROVAL

The Secretary to the Board of Equalization, Auditor Tamra Stones, presented to the Council a copy of valuation changes that have been made during the period of August 12, 1997 to September 23, 1997.

Council member Skanchy moved to approve the property valuation changes. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

COUNCILMAN YEATES LEFT THE MEETING AT THIS TIME 6:50 p.m..

ADJOURNMENT

Chairman Gibbons adjourned the regular Council meeting at 6:55 p.m..

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Chairman Gibbons convened an executive session at this time to discuss land acquisition at the airport.

Those in attendance were: Chairman Gibbons, Vice Chairman Anhder, Councilmen Beck, Pulsipher, Petersen and Skanchy. Councilman Yeates was absent. Others present were: Executive Lemon, Clerk Erickson, Auditor Stones, Attorney Wyatt and Administrative Executive Assistant and Airport Manager Michael Nilson.

The discussion was led by the Airport Manager, Michael Nilson.

At the Conclusion of the discussion Councilman Beck moved to adjourn the Executive Session. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

Dear Congressman Hansen:

Cache County wants you to know how grateful we are for your continued leadership on the Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) issue. After 17 years of level funding, the Congress seems ready to recognize its responsibility to public lands counties who provide mandated services on behalf of federal agencies on lands we do not own and can not tax.

The House Interior The FY 1998 authorized PILT funding level is now \$225.5 million. Appropriations Subcommittee-passed bill is \$113.5 (last years level) while the Senate bill which passed last night contains a modest increase up to \$124 million. This is still \$101.5 million below the authorized PILT funding level contained in PL 103-397 which you help bring about on the last day of the 103rd Congress. Counties everywhere will never forget your efforts.

We believe now represents a golden opportunity for you to work with your colleagues to see that PILT appropriators do their jobs. Cache County strongly supports FY 1998 PILT funding at \$124 million. We hope you will use your influence to have the House defer to the Senate on PILT funding. Keeping the PILT momentum of the past few years going is essential and given how far behind we are, is only just beginning.

We want you to know we support you in all of your efforts to bring this program's funding levels up to where they should be. Until Federal lands are returned to us so that we can assume full responsibility for their management, PILT will remain the only viable way for rural public lands counties across the country to continue providing essential services on behalf of our own residents and the visiting public.

You have received a letter from Norm Stauffer of the State of Utah, Division of Water . Resources. This letter is concerned with the availability of State funding to cost share the operational costs of cloud seeding programs conducted in Utah this winter. It is likely the State will have funds to pay for 50% of the operational costs of these cloud seeding programs.

You may have been reading or discussing the current El Nino event that is perhaps the strongest that has occurred in this century. El Nino events can impact the amount of precipitation that occurs on a global scale. The inter-relationships between the warm ocean water off of Peru and the atmospheric circulation patterns are not well understood. Extreme precipitation, both low and high amounts, have been observed in various parts of the world in previous El Nino events. Of interest in Utah is that the years of 1976-77 and 1982-83 were both El Nino years. The first of these two years was extremely dry and the second extremely wet.

A study by C. F. Ropelewski and M. S. Halpert conducted in 1986 examined the relationships between the El Nino events and precipitation around the world. This study indicated that the Great Basin area experienced above normal precipitation in the April through October season in 9 out of 11 El Nino events. This trend seems to be holding true for this summer. There were, however, no discernable patterns in the Great Basin area for the winter (October through March) season. The enclosed figure appeared recently in the Salt Lake Tribune. This forecast for the January - March, 1998 period suggests that the precipitation in most of Utah is too close to call implying near average precipitation. I have enclosed a recent discussion on the El Nino from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

We would recommend that you consider establishing a cloud seeding program to be active by mid-November or the first of December if you need to augment precipitation that may result from a below normal to slightly above normal winter season. Operations can be conducted and snowpack conditions monitored. If snowpack conditions become excessive, the cloud seeding program could either be suspended or terminated. If the snowpack, however, is not excessive then the cloud seeding program will be beneficial in augmenting the natural snowfall.

Strong warm episode (El Niño) conditions continued throughout the equatorial central and eastern Pacific during August. Equatorial sea surface temperature (SST) anomalies (departures from normal) were greater than +1C everywhere from 180W east to the South American coast (Fig. 1). Anomalies exceeding +4C were observed along the equator east of 120W. In many areas of the eastern equatorial Pacific, August SST anomalies were the largest observed during the last 50 years.

The equatorial oceanic thermocline during August continued to be much deeper than normal across the eastern Pacific and shallower than normal in the western Pacific. Consistent with this structure, subsurface ocean temperatures were much above normal in the east-central and eastern Pacific, with anomalies exceeding +8C to the east of 120W at thermocline depth.

Tropical rainfall was enhanced over the central and eastern tropical Pacific, and suppressed over all of donesia (Fig. 2). Low-level (850-hPa) winds continued to be much weaker than normal over the pical Pacific during August. By early September the easterlies were absent over most of the equatorial Pacific and westerlies were observed between New Guinea and 180W. Weaker than normal easterlies have been observed across most of the equatorial Pacific since March.

Over the past few seasons the NCEP statistical (CCA) and coupled model predictions have consistently indicated the development and persistence of a strong warm episode. The latest NCEP forecasts (Fig. 3) indicate that strong warm episode conditions will continue through early 1998. In interpreting the SST anomalies from these forecasts (right hand panels, Fig. 3), it is important to keep in mind that the smaller anomalies predicted during March-May 1998 may have a larger impact on the global atmospheric circulation than the very large anomalies currently observed, because they occur near the peak of the SST annual cycle in the tropical eastern Pacific. In fact, the areal extent of SSTs greater than 28C (the threshold for deep convection) increases with time through March-May 1998 (left hand panels, Fig. 3).

Based on the NCEP SST predictions and the results from historical studies on the effects of warm episodes, we expect drier than normal conditions to continue over Indonesia and eastern Australia during the next several months. Drier than normal conditions are also likely over most of Central America and the Caribbean Sea. Rainfall should be heavier than normal over the central and eastern equatorial Pacific and from central Chile eastward across northeastern Argentina, Uruguay and southern Brazil. During the northern winter season we expect wetter than normal conditions to prevail over most of the extreme southern United States, and warmer than normal conditions to develop over the northern United States from the Rocky Mountains eastward to the Great Lakes.

Dear Lynn:

In recent years, Cache, Box Elder and Rich counties have participated in funding cloud seeding operations in the Bear River Region. Helped with money from the state, the long-term results show consistent increases in snowfall and water availability in our arid regions. It is time once again to indicate your intent for the 1997-98 cloud seeding season.

The Division of Water Resources implemented new administrative procedures three years ago. Major provisions include:

- Division of Water Resources staff will assist interested groups in organizing to sponsor cloud seeding projects.
- Project sponsors apply directly to the Board of Water Resources for financial assistance (applications due by October 15).
- The board will allocate available funds at the October 24, 1997 board meeting (75% initial payment on estimated costs 25% payment on remaining actual costs).

During the past two seasons, the board approved a recommendation to allocate to all participating local sponsors the entire \$150,000 set aside for state assistance, up to 50% cost share. Based on actual usage, the percent of state funding last year to local participants was 50% rather than 35%, the previously approved match. This figure cannot be determined until the end of the season because it is based on the number of generating hours and participation by local sponsors.

Project sponsors contract directly with a licensed cloud seeding contractor. (Currently, only North American Weather Consultants is licensed in Utah and has applied for a permit from the state.)

In the past, a successful option has been cost-sharing agreements between Box Elder and Cache Counties and possible future involvement of Rich County. Should this plan be continued, a letter of intent from both counties needs to be sent to my attention by Oct. 15, 1997. Before then, you should receive a proposed contract from the cloud seeding contractor (NAWC) for the costs of the 1997-98 season for your area. Based on those costs, we can then determine the amount of state funding (35% to 50% share, depending on total participation) and allocate these funds at the October 24, 1997 meeting of the Utah Board of Water Resources. A contract will then be prepared between the division and your county for the duration of the cloud seeding project.

I would be most happy to appear at a future meeting to explain the cloud seeding operations and answer any questions. Don Griffiths of NAWC would also be able to attend and do likewise. Please advise if you require our attendance to answer questions.

We look forward to working with you and believe we need to maintain the important assets that cloud seeding can provide to the water resources of the state.
