### CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

December 2, 1997

The Cache County Council met in regular session on the 2nd day of December, 1997 in the County Council Chambers located at 120 North 100 West, Logan, Utah 84321.

### **ATTENDANCE**

Council Chairman Darrel L. Gibbons and Vice Chairman C. Larry Anhder were both present. Council members present were: Sarah Ann Skanchy, H. Craig Petersen, Guy Ray Pulsipher, Layne M. Beck and Cory Yeates.

Others present were: County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon, County Clerk, Stephen M. Erickson, County Auditor, Tamra Stones, County Sheriff, Lynn Nelson, County Executive Administrative Assistant, Mike Nilson, County-Wide Planner, Mark Teuscher, County Zoning Administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh, members of the local news media and other interested citizens.

### CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Darrel L. Gibbons called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and welcomed all who were in attendance.

### INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Council member Sarah Ann Skanchy.

### AGENDA & MINUTES

The agenda for the meeting was discussed, adjusted and approved.

The minutes of the regular Council meeting held on November 25, 1997 were discussed, corrected and approved.

### ORDINANCE NO. 97-06: SALARIES FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS

The adoption of Ordinance No. 97-06 will set the County Elected Officials salary for 1998.

(See attachment #1)

The Council discussed a number of items concerning the salaries for the elected officials, including, the percent increase, filing fees, benefits and health insurance. The County

Executive, M. Lynn Lemon, recommended in the 1998 budget, that all county employees have a salary increase of 3% cost of living, 1% length of service and a 1% merit increase. He also recommended that all elected officials receive a 4% salary increase except the County Executive-Surveyor and the County Attorney who would get a 3% salary increase. Lemon had previously explained that some department heads are receiving a higher salary than other elected officials and that his and the Attorneys salaries were in line with those salaries. Vice Chairman Anhder argued that the Attorney and Executive-Surveyor should receive the same increase as the other elected officials. Anhder also pointed out that the health insurance will be going up 19% next year and maybe that increase should be considered as part of the 3% & 4% salary increase. Gibbons who sits on the BRAG Governing Board said that BRAG employees are receiving a 2% and 1% merit, salary increase for Council member Skanchy said that she supports the 1998. recommendation of Executive Lemon. In the 1998 budget, money has been funded to study employees wages compared to work load etc. Vice Chairman Anhder challenged Council members to make salary decisions on the recommendations provided by the study.

Councilman Petersen made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 97-06, including a 4% salary increase for the Attorney and Executive. It was properly seconded and passed on a vote of 6 "Yes" to 1 "No" vote. Council member Skanchy voted no.

### COUNTY EXECUTIVE REPORT

The County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon, reported on the following items:

- 1. Federal Employee Day Off: President Clinton has given the day after Christmas off to, all Federal employees. Lemon will make a recommendation regarding County employees at the next Council meeting.
- 2. Extension Home Economist, Chris Saunders: Saunders has taken a new position at USU. The Extension Service is now looking for a replacement. A committee to pick a replacement will be organized. Executive Lemon and Councilman Petersen will represent the County on the selection committee.
- 3. The Beus Group-TV Translator: The Beus Group has appealed the decision of the District Court regarding their claim that the County had broken the lease agreement when they were late one day with one payment. The District Courts have ruled in favor of the County, but the Beus Group is appealing that decision.

### BUDGETARY MATTERS: INTRA-DEPARTMENT BUDGET TRANSFERS

The following Intra-Departmental budget transfers were considered by the Council.

Council member Skanchy moved to approve the two Extension requests. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

Attachment #2 also contains a Library budget transfer that was approved last Council meeting. The Library transfer was modified to show correct figures.

### ORDINANCE NO. 97-07: SALARIES-COUNCIL MEMBER-1998

The adoption of Ordinance No. 97-07 will set 1998 salaries for Council members.

Council members have an option to carry health insurance, of which a portion to the insurance premium is deducted from their salary or receive a stipend of \$540.00. Some Council members chose not to take the stipend.

Vice Chairman Anhder made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 97-07. It was seconded by Councilman Beck and passed on a 6 "Yes" to 1 "No" vote. Councilman Petersen voted no.

### RESOLUTION NO. 97-26: BUDGET ADOPTION-1998

Approval of Resolution No. 97-26 will adopt the proposed 1998 budget.

A large number of hours have been performed, to prepare and adjust the figures to present a 1998 balanced budget for adoption by the Council. The County Auditor, County Executive, Department Heads and the County Council have all worked hard to provide county departments, with funding to accomplish necessary services for citizens in the county. It has been done with out a tax increase but has depended on additional new growth in the County for extra funding.

Vice Chairman Anhder moved to adopt Resolution No. 97-26. It was seconded by Councilman Petersen.

Councilman Pulsipher, who represents the Council on the County Planning Commission, suggested that members of the Planning Commission receive an increase in salary. They have been burdened with an extra work load because of the new growth in the County. Pulsipher said that an increase has been discussed in the past but nothing has ever been done. The Commission have been paid \$6.00 per meeting for a number of years. The Zoning Administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh supports an increase for Commission members. The County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon is also supportive of the increase.

Councilman Pulsipher moved to amend the original motion to include in the 1998 budget an increase in salary for Planning Commissioners, who attend their meetings, from \$6.00 to \$15.00. It was seconded by Councilman Yeates and passed unanimously.

Councilman Yeates called for a vote on the original motion with the added amendment. The vote on the original motion was unanimous.

Copies of the 1998 budget are on file in the County Auditor's and County Clerk's offices.

The CDBG Capital Improvement Plan will be adjusted to reflect the changes made in some areas of the 1998 budget. Executive Lemon will provide a new Improvement Plan for consideration at the next meeting.

### LAND USE ROAD POLICY: DISCUSSION

The Council continued discussing the proposed new Land Use Road Policy. The County Zoning Administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh, presented what she called, a fifth draft, of the proposed changes. Road widths, right-of-ways, deeded roads and dedicated roads were The County-Wide Planner, Mark Tuescher and Zoning Administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh had made changes in the proposed plan that were suggested during the last Council meeting. changes were discussed along with other recommendations. Council members were asked by Chairman Gibbons to read the policy and if they had specific changes they would like to make they were asked to call and discuss them with Lorene or Mark. Gibbons said that he will have the policy on the next council meeting agenda as pending action. Executive Lemon, stated that we need to make sure of what we want and need, and what meets the needs of the county and its Greenhalgh said that the Planning Commission is being confronted continually about roads and they are anxious to have a new policy in place.

RESOLUTION NO. 97-27:CLEMENTS-SURPLUS REAL PROPERTY SALE

The approval of Resolution No. 97-27 will authorize the execution of a deed to LaMar Clements for a parcel of property that was declared surplus by the Council. The County Assessors office has appraised the property at \$2700 per acre. This parcel of property contains .21 acre.

Council member Skanchy moved to waive the rules of first and second reading and adopt Resolution No. 97-27. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

### RESOLUTION NO. 97-28:PACE-SURPLUS REAL PROPERTY SALE

Approval of Resolution 97-28 will authorize the execution of a deed to R. L. Pace for a parcel of property that has been declared surplus by the Council. The appraisal is \$2700.00 per acre and this parcel contains .21 acres.

Vice Chairman Anhder made a motion to waive the rules and adopt Resolution No. 97-28. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

### RESOLUTION NO. 97-29: TCI CABLE FRANCHISE RENEWAL AGREEMENT

This Resolution was tabled until the next Council meeting. The fees paid to the County by TCI was questioned. Executive Lemon will follow up on the fee question and report to the Council at the next meeting.

### COUNCIL MEETING AND COUNTY HOLIDAY SCHEDULE-1998: APPROVAL

The 1998 Council meeting and County Holiday schedule was reviewed by the Council.

### (See attachment #7)

Vice Chairman Anhder questioned the need to have the day after Thanksgiving as a holiday. Anhder reasoned that people were unable to do necessary county business such as paying their property taxes. It was pointed out that confusion occurred because the holiday fell on the last working day of the month when taxes are normally due. People didn't realize that the Treasurers office was open on Monday the 1st of December because the last day of the month fell on a weekend. Next year the holiday will not fall on the last working day of November.

Councilman Skanchy made a motion to approve the Council meeting and holiday schedule. Changing the 4th of July holiday to the 3rd of July on a Friday. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

### LAND USE-COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN: DISCUSSION

The Council continued its discussion on the new proposed County-Wide comprehensive Land Use Plan.

Vice Chairman Anhder told the Council that he believes that plan that has been presented, even though it may not be perfect, is a living, vibrant, changeable master plan. The County has never adopted a master plan and in these changing times we now have a document that will benefit us and our future children.

Anhder moved to adopt, which is probably the most significant document produced in Cache County history, the master plan as presented.

Council member Skanchy said that the plan is only on the agenda for discussion and it would not be appropriate to adopt the plan at this time. Skanchy also said that it will take a written resolution to formally adopt the plan and the press must be notified.

The motion by Vice Chairman Anhder was seconded by Councilman Yeates so that discussion could continue.

Chairman Gibbons asked for specific changes in the plan that may be suggested before its adoption. Council member Skanchy said that the airport hazard zones, solid waste, and those comments made during the public hearing on the plan should be considered.

It was the consensus of the County Executive and Council that the old ordinances will be used until the new ordinances have been drafted and adopted.

Chairman Gibbons suggested that the County Attorney be asked for a legal opinion on how to adopt the new plan. Lemon said that we need to know what is legal during the transition. Councilman Beck suggested that the County Attorney hire additional help to rewrite the ordinance. The Zoning administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh suggested that the Planning Commission be involved in the process. Executive Lemon said that \$30,000 has been budgeted to rewrite the Ordinances and a matching grant may be available. Councilman Petersen stated that to him the plan has to be written so we can understand it and as he reads the plan it really hasn't made many significant changes. Anhder said that there are changes and it

continues the process to develop new ordinances. Council member Skanchy will get with Mr. Tuescher concerning the issues discussed tonight.

The discussion concluded with the motion being withdrawn by Vice Chairman Anhder, with the approval of Councilman Yeates who seconded the motion. The matter will be on the next agenda for initial consideration and action.

A draft on closing the Buttars road will also be on the agenda for initial consideration.

### COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Council member Skanchy: Reported that an airport meeting is being held and they will be discussing possible condemnation proceedings to purchase property for runway extension and protection zones.

### ADJOURNMENT

No further business was presented and Chairman Gibbons adjourned the meeting at 7:05 p.m..
