CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

December 9, 1998

The Cache County Council met in regular session on the 9th day of December, 1997 in the County Council Chambers located at 120 North 100 West, Logan, Utah 84321.

ATTENDANCE

Council Chairman Darrel L. Gibbons and Vice Chairman C. Larry Anhder were both present. Council members present were: Sarah Ann Skanchy, H. Craig Petersen, Guy Ray Pulsipher, Layne M. Beck and Cory Yeates.

Others present were: County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon, County Clerk, Stephen M. Erickson, County Auditor, Tamra Stones, County Sheriff, Lynn Nelson, County Attorney, Scott Wyatt, County-Wide Planner, Mark Teuscher, County Executive Administrative Assistant, Mike Nilson, County Zoning Administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh, members of the local news media and other interested citizens.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Darrel L. Gibbons called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and welcomed all who were in attendance.

INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Vice Chairman C. Larry Anhder.

AGENDA & MINUTES

The agenda for the meeting was discussed, adjusted and approved.

The minutes of the regular Council meeting held on December 2, 1997, were discussed, corrected and approved.

REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

The following items were presented by the County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon.

1. Appointments:

Appointment: Skanchy, Sarah Ann, appointed to Airport Authority Appointment: Nelson, Lee, appointed to the Co. Planning Commission

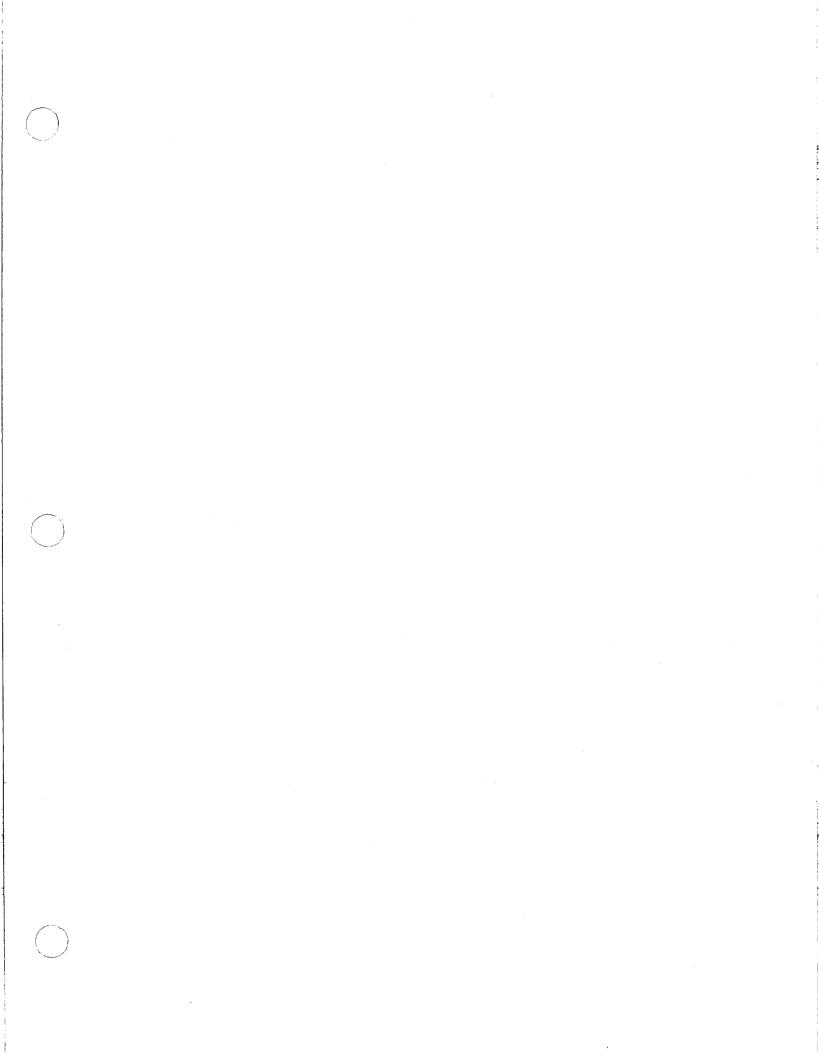
Appointment: Jenson, Judy, appointed to the County Planning Commission Appointment: Stewart, Lynn, appointed to the County Planning Commission Appointment: Erickson, David L. appointed to Co. Board of Adjustments Appointment: Speth, Darlene, appointed to Co/Yg Township board Appointment: Ricks, Sandra, appointed to Benson Planning District

A motion to approve the above recommended appointments was made by Councilman Yeates. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

2. Credit Cards-Sheriff's Office: The Sheriff's Office has had sixteen duplicate bank credit cards that are used by deputies in the four separate departments. A problem occurs when the Auditor's Office receives the billing and request for payment. The Auditor has no idea which department has used the credit cards. The Sheriff controls 4 budgets (Jail, Criminal, Patrol and Civil) and wants to have four separate accounts. Lemon said that the bank is asking for Council authorization before new department credit cards are issued. Some concern over the number of credit cards being used was expressed by Council members. County Sheriff, Lynn Nelson, told the Council that they have been using sixteen cards for a number of years and all they would like to do is to simplify the accounting process. Card credit limit was discussed by the Council and who should be using the cards. Sheriff Nelson, said that his Lieutenants determine who will use the cards. Executive Lemon is recommending that the Council support the request.

Vice Chairman Anhder moved to approve obtaining credit cards for the four separate Sheriff Departments and to authorize the County Executive and Sheriff to determine the credit limit. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously.

- 3. Roads-Commissioners meeting: On December 4, 1997, a County Commission-Council meeting was held in St. George which was attended by the County Deputy Surveyor, Preston Ward. The main purpose of the meeting was to discuss the RS 2477 roads in the State. Judge David Sam has ruled that even though a road wasn't used a lot it would still be considered a RS 2477 road. In the meeting it was also pointed out that the State has decided not to transfer jurisdiction of some state roads to the counties. Lemon thinks that the state realized that they were getting more revenue from the roads than they first thought.
- 4. Property acquired during May Tax Sale: Lemon reported that a parcel of property that the county acquired during the May Tax Sale is now being appealed by the family who had previously owned the property. They claim that there was a mix up in transferring deeds when the mother died.. Now they want to buy the property back. It was the consensus of the council that a public hearing was necessary to determine if the property should be declared surplus.



A motion to set a public hearing on January 13, at 6:30 p.m. to declare the property as surplus was made by Vice Chairman C. Larry Anhder. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

- 5. TravelLand RV Park: Executive Lemon told the Council that two months ago a letter was sent to Logan City protesting a proposed conditional use change at the TravelLand RV Park located behind the Travel Lodge South West of Logan. Since then an agreement has been reached between the neighbors, College-Young Township and the TravelLand RV Park. Lemon told the concerned parties that since they have come to an agreement the County will withdraw their protest. TravelLand has agreed to only use 8 to 12 RV lots for stays longer that 180 days instead of the whole park as requested.
- 6. Employee After Christmas Day Off: Due to the hardship it would put on the Road and Sheriff Departments, Lemon has recommended not to give the day after Christmas off to county employees. The County office's will be open as usual on the 26th of December.
- 7. Warrants: The warrants for the period of November 26 to December 5, 1997 were presented to the County Clerk for filing.

Recognized: Allred, Elwin & Grace

Councilman Petersen requested a point of personal privilege be granted to him to recognize Elwin and Grace Allred for accomplishing 50 years of marriage. It was granted and the Allreds who both attend almost every Council meeting were recognized by the Council for their accomplishment.

BUDGETARY MATTERS: INTRA-DEPARTMENTAL TRANSFERS

The following Intra-Departmental Budget transfers were considered by the Council:

1. Council \$1100.00 and \$500.00

Vice Chairman Anhder moved to approve the Council budget transfer. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

2. Extension \$93.00 & \$193.00

(See attachment #2)

Councilman Petersen moved to approve the Extension budget transfer. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

3. Recorder: \$2100.00

(See attachment #3)

It was moved by Councilman Beck to approve the Recorders budget transfer. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING SET: ROADS-LAND USE POLICY

Chairman Gibbons told the Council that a public hearing needs to be set to receive public input on the proposed change to the county's road policy.

A motion to set the Public Hearing on January 13, 1998 at 6:00 p.m. was made by Council member Skanchy. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

ROAD DEDICATION & GREEN BELT ROLL BACK TAX: DISCUSSION

The Council discussed an appeal from a property owner in Logan, who had sold some property to Logan, City. The sale however took the rest of his property out of the Green Belt program causing a large increase in his property tax. To have a parcel of property in Green Belt the parcel must be 5 acres or more. Logan City is now willing to deed back enough acreage to qualify the property for Green Belt. The property owner says that he never intended to sell more than 5 acres. There is another individual in the County who is appealing the roll back tax. It was the consensus of the Council that the two appeals be put on a future agenda for action and that a legal opinion be drafted by the County Attorney to help give the Council direction.

PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX APPEAL: VON NIEDERHAUSER, GORDON

Gordon Von Niederhauser, a Logan resident, is appealing the market value on his Ford pickup and wants the Council to lower the value so that his taxes are less.

(See attachment #4)

The County Auditor told the Council that by State law the Assessor has to value according to what is listed in the blue book. The blue book values the truck at \$14,600. However the Assessors office has lowered the value to \$13,500.

Councilman Yeates moved to deny the Von Niederhauser appeal. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 97-29: TCI CABLEVISION FRANCHISE AGREEMENT

The adoption of Resolution # 97-29 authorizes the County to enter into an agreement with TCI Cablevision of Utah.

(See attachment #5)

Council member Skanchy made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 97-29. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO 97-30: BUTTARS ROAD GATING

This Resolution will, if adopted, authorize the construction of a gate across the so called Buttars road in Clarkston, Utah.

Councilman Yeates moved to adopt Resolution No. 97-30. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN-1998-REVISED: DISCUSSION

Due to adjustments in the 1998 budget some adjustments in the 1998 Capital Improvement Plan was necessary. Attachment No. 7. reflects the adjusted Plan.

(See attachment #7)

A motion to approve the revised Capital Improvement Plan was made by Council member Skanchy. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING: BUDGET OPENING-1997

The County Auditor, Tamra Stones, reviewed proposed changes in the 1997 budget. Increased revenue and expenditures were discussed. Chairman Gibbons asked if there were any public comments. There were no public comments made.

Councilman Yeates moved to close the Public Hearing. It was seconded and carried

unanimously.

Council Member Skanchy questioned if the Public Defenders line item was enough due to the recent crimes in the County.

Vice Chairman Anhder suggested that \$20,000 be taken out of what was going into the general fund and set aside for the TV translator.

RESOLUTION NO. 97-31: BUDGET ADJUSTMENT-1997

The adoption of Resolution No. 97-31 will approve adjustments to the 1997 budget as discussed by the Council and recommended by the County Executive and Auditor.

(See attachment #8)

A motion to adopt Resolution No. 97-31 with the creation of a line item of \$20,000, plus \$5,000 from a previous years budget totaling \$25,000.00 being set aside for future TV translator needs. The motion was made by Vice Chairman Anhder. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously.

COUNTY-WIDE COMPR EHENSIVE LAND USE PLAN: DISCUSSION

The County-Wide Comprehensive Land Use Plan was again discussed by the Council. The County Attorney has prepared both an ordinance and resolution to adopt the Plan. The Attorney recommends using a Resolution to adopt the Plan. A print out by the County-Wide Planner, Mark Tuescher, of some changes in the Plan were discussed. Councilman Beck recommended that language should be included in the Plan that would protect private property rights. Beck said that government should not dictate what happens to someone elses property within proper usage such as roads, water and waste etc. The County-Wide Planner, Mark Tuescher, said that State Code spells out those private property rights. Beck said that zoning should protect a persons property. Vice Chairman Anhder said that the plan is not perfect and some changes are necessary but it is a good start and he is recommending adoption tonight. Council member Skanchy recommends putting the proposal on the next agenda as pending action and wait for legal advice concerning the proposed language by Councilman Beck and other areas that have not been properly addressed.

Councilman Yeates moved to waive the rules of first and second reading and adopt the proposed Comprehensive Land Use Plan by resolution. It was seconded by Vice Chairman Anhder.

Councilman Petersen made a motion to vote for or against waiving the rules. The motion was seconded and passed not to waive the rules on a vote of 2 "Yes" to 5 "No". Council Members Skanchy, Petersen, Pulsipher, Gibbons & Beck voted not to waive the rules of first and second reading. The original motion by Councilman Yeates failed.

Vice Chairman Anhder mentioned that he would like to have areas of the new Land Use Plan such as water and impact fees issues be further studied and adopted as part of the Plan.

SOLID WASTE-LAND FILL: DISCUSSION

Council member Skanchy mentioned that she has received a letter from Logan City Environmental Department concerning solid waste issues. Skanchy suggested that issues with the landfill buffer area and other issues should be discussed during a meeting of the Solid Waste Advisory Board and the Board should make recommendations to the Council for approval. Executive Lemon reported that there will be a Board meeting in January of 1998.

EMS BY-LAWS CHANGES: DISCUSSION

Executive Lemon reported that the EMS Council have come to the Mayors Association with proposed By-Law changes. Lemon has given copies of the proposed by-laws to the County Fire Chief, Kelly Pitcher for his input and recommendations. The Fire Chief has some concern but has not made any recommendations yet. Lemon said that he wanted the proposal on the agenda tonight as first reading and he would like to have the proposal on the next agenda for Council action.

RESOLUTION NO. 97-32: TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES-1998

The adoption of Resolution No. 97-32 will authorize the County to participate with other Counties in the State to combine cash flow borrowing in the tax anticipated program provided by UAC.

(See attachment #9)

It was moved by Councilman Petersen to waive the rules and adopt Resolution No. 97-32. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Council member Skanchy: Skanchy updated the Council on Work Force Services and Regional Council. They are proceeding with organizing committees and scheduling meetings.

Vice Chairman Anhder: Anhder informed the Council of an upcoming meeting on the 16th of December, 1997, with the Audubon Society concerning a proposal to construct a dam on the Amalga Barrens area.. Council members were invited to attend.

ADJOURNMENT

No further business was presented and the meeting was adjourned at 6:50 p.m. by Chairman Gibbons.

RESOLUTION NO. 97-32

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENT OF CACHE COUNTY, STATE OF UTAH (HEREINAFTER COUNTY"), TO ARRANGE FOR SHORT-TERM FINANCING TO ACCOMMODATE THE ANTICIPATED OPERATING CAPITAL DEFICITS BY THE ISSUANCE OF TAX AND REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTES (HEREINAFTER "TRANS") AS A PARTICIPANT IN THE UTAH ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES (HEREINAFTER "UAC") COMBINED CASH FLOW BORROWING PROGRAM (HEREINAFTER THE "UAC PROGRAM"), AND RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, it appears that property tax and other revenues will not be received in the next budget year until after significant operating expenses have been incurred, thereby causing operating capital deficits; and

WHEREAS, it will be in the best interest of the County to issue TRANs to provide temporary cash flow capacity to meet operating demands prior to receipt of revenues in adequate amounts; and,

WHEREAS, UAC has invited the County to participate in the UAC Program to facilitate the issuance and sale by the County of its TRANs; and

WHEREAS, UAC has established a Program Implementation Board to solicit and evaluate competitive bids and to select the best bid for the TRANs of participating counties; and

WHEREAS, it is timely to seek advice from a professional financial consultant concerning the amount and timing of such cash flow borrowing; and

WHEREAS, the UAC Program appears to be the best source of TRANs financing available to the County; and

WHEREAS, it is timely to make a commitment concerning TRANs financing by the County so as to allow UAC and its underwriter, Zions Bank Public Finance (hereinafter the "Underwriter"), to determine whether there is sufficient interest to create an adequately sized combination offering of TRANs;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Cache County Council, State of Utah, as follows:

Section 1. It is found and declared to be in the best interest of the County to anticipate cash flow deficiencies and provide operating capital by the issuance of TRANs.

Section 2. The County declares its intention to issue TRANs for the partial financing of operating during periods when cash flow deficiencies would otherwise occur during the next



succeeding year.

- Section 3. It is determined that the UAC Program is the best alternative for the County to use in connection with the issuance of its TRANs.
- Section 4. If the County determines that it will not need to issue TRANs, then this resolution shall be of no effect for the next succeeding budget year. If, as it now appears likely, the County determines that it is necessary or prudent to issue TRANs to cover projected cash flow deficiencies, it will utilize the UAC Program for the issuance of such TRANs, providing the UAC Program is then available.
- Section 5. One of the purposes of this Resolution is to provide commitment upon which UAC may rely as it determines the size and feasibility of a combined County TRANs offering. If it is determined that there is insufficient county participation to constitute a feasible offering of TRANs, then it is understood that the Underwriter will not proceed with the pooling and offering of combined cash flow notes.
- Section 6. Authorization is granted for County officials to consult with the Underwriter concerning the appropriate size and timing of an issuance of TRANs by the County through the program sponsored by UAC. The Program Implementation Board is authorized to work with the Underwriter to solicit, receive and evaluate bids for the TRANs and the investment of proceeds of the TRANs. Subject to final approval of the County, the Program Implementation Board is also authorized to select the best bid or bids for the sale of the TRANs and the investment of the proceeds thereof.

This resolution was adopted by the Cache County Council, State of Utah, on 9th day of December, 1997.
