CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

December 8, 1998

The Cache County Council met in a regular session on December 8, 1998 in the County Council Chambers located at 120 North 100 West, Logan, Utah 84321.

ATTENDANCE

Council Chairman, Darrel L. Gibbons and Vice Chairman Cory Yeates were present. Council members present were: Layne M. Beck, H. Craig Petersen, Guy Ray Pulsipher, Sarah Ann Skanchy and C. Larry Anhder.

Others present were: County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon, County Clerk, Stephen M. Erickson, County Auditor, Tamra Stones, County Sheriff, Lynn Nelson, County Attorney, Scott Wyatt, Representatives from the Capitol Arts Alliance, Stephen Thurston and John Emmett, members of the local news media and other interested citizens.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Darrel L. Gibbons, called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and welcomed all who were in attendance.

INVOCATION

The invocation for the meeting was given by Councilman Layne M. Beck.

AGENDA & MINUTES

The agenda for the meeting was discussed and adjusted to include on the agenda an item 7b to discuss a budget resolution. Council member, Sarah Ann Skanchy read a statement regarding item 9a Ordinance No. 98-04 that deals with a proposal to close a portion of 3700 North, and to extend the airport runway. The statement is as follows:

As you know, the County Council held a public hearing on vacating a portion of 3700 North early in 1998, about the time the Environmental Assessment was released on the proposed airport runway extension. Many people were concerned. If the runway extension goes forward, the road will need to be closed. The Airport Authority and the County and the City, have had numerous discussions concerning this matter with representatives of Hyde Park. Transportation alternatives are still being discussed. We are at the end of a, two year, Council session. I ask that the agenda item be continued into next year without a vote at this time by the County Council. We may need to hold a second public hearing on this issue at a later date.

The minutes of the regular Council meeting held on December 1, 1998 were discussed, corrected and approved.

REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

The County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon reported on the follow items:

- 1. Festival of the American West Welcome Center: The Festival's, Board of Directors, has decided to continue construction of their Welcome Center, by borrowing money to pay for it rather than bonding through Wellsville City. They are asking the Council to make payment on a loan rather than a bond as previously committed. They are saying that the bonding process will cost too much and money could be saved by borrowing instead of bonding. Some members of the Council expressed concern that a loan may have implications because of the Festivals ownership. The County Attorney, Scott Wyatt, said that the facility is totally owned by the State and no problem should exist. A consensus of the Council was that they would support, continuing to fund a loan instead of paying off a bond.
- 2. TV Translator: The major TV channels are changing the way that they will allow the retransmitting of their signals. This may affect the county's proposed new translator system. Lemon, will keep the Council informed regarding the issue.
- 3. Annexation Protest: Lemon informed the Council that we have officially filed a protest against Logan City's proposed annexation of property South West of Logan in College/Young Ward area. The Council approved the protest during the last Council meeting. Lemon reported, that Cache County School District and property owners in the area have also filed a protest.
- 4. Tax Roll Computer System: The proposed new computer tax system is now in a critical period of becoming the new method of keeping track of property and taxes in the County. The next six weeks will be used to continue to transfer data and work out bugs in the system.
- 5. Warrants: The County warrants for the period of November 26 to December 2, 1998 were given to the County Clerk for filing.

CAPITOL ARTS ALLIANCE QUARTERLY REPORT: THURSTON, STEPHEN

The Executive Director of the Capitol Arts Alliance, Stephen Thurston presented to the Council a quarterly report of that organizations activities and future plans into 1999.

Thurston, emphasized the need for local sponsorship of the events. He said, that without the sponsors the Alliance would probably be in the red and ticket cost would have to be raised. They intend keeping the ticket cost low so everyone can have an opportunity to come to the theater. Thurston, told the Council that there is currently a valley wide survey being done to ask citizens what type of entertainment they would like at the theater. John Emmett, the Chairman of the Alliance's Board of Directors, reviewed the budget and thanked the Council for supporting the Alliance with Restaurant Tax money. Emmett, thanked Mr. Thurston for taking over as Director in difficult times. He also reported that ticket selling issues are being worked out and the future of the alliance looks very good.

BUDGETARY MATTERS

The following intra-departmental budget transfer was presented to the Council for discussion and action:

Extension for \$150.00 and \$300.00

A motion to approve the Extension transfer request was made by Councilman Anhder. It was seconded and passed on a vote of six "yes" to one "no". Councilman Petersen voted no because he would like to have the Council only consider budget transfers above \$1000.00.

RESOLUTION NO. 98-38: INTER-DEPARTMENTAL BUDGET TRANSFER

The adoption of Resolution No. 98-38 will allow the County Auditor to transfer funds from the Executive & Sundry Insurance Claims to various departments to balance their 1998 budgets.

A motion to waive the rules of first and second reading and adopt Resolution No. 98-38 was made by Councilman Anhder. It was properly seconded and carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION NO. 98-37: BRIDGERLAND ICE ARENA AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF UTAH

The adoption of Resolution #98-37 will allow the county to enter into a contract with the State Department of Community and Economic Development for the proposed Bridgerland Ice

Arena with written terms and conditions.

The salary for the Executive Director of the Bridgerland Ice Arena, Janet Borg was discussed and is part of the Resolution. Janet Borg, was in attendance and concurred with the drafted Resolution.

Councilman Anhder moved to adopt Resolution No. 98-37. It was properly seconded and passed on a vote of six "yes" to one "no". Council member Skanchy voted no.

EMPLOYEE SICK LEAVE CRITERIA: DISCUSSION

Executive Lemon, is recommending some changes in the employee sick leave criteria. The recommendations were discussed during the last Council meeting and seemed to be agreed on. The recommendation will be drafted as an amendment for adoption into the County personnel policy in January.

TAX ABATEMENT HARDSHIP REQUEST: DISCUSSION

Richard and Martha Wursten, from the Paradise area of the County are asking for property tax relief for hardship reasons. The County Auditor, Tamra Stones told the Council that the Wurstens will have delinquent taxes at the beginning of 1999 and they are willing to start paying \$50.00 a month at that time. The Council determined that the request was premature and they should be encouraged to pay their taxes for the coming year by using a coupon book from the County Treasurers Office. Ms. Stones, the County Auditor will follow up on the matter.

The council also considered an appeal of set valuation from the owners of the Copper Mill Restaurant and Emporium on main street in Logan. The County Auditor pointed out that the time for appeal has long expired and the owners were told that the Council has never reopened the appeal process once the deadline has expired. The owners claim that they never received their tax notice on time. A written comment from the County Appraisal Supervisor, Raymond G. Thorson concerning the appeal was reviewed by council members.

Vice Chairman Yeates moved to accept the recommendation of Raymond Thorson and deny the request to appeal the tax assessment. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

Craig Petersen and C. Larry Anhder, the County Executive/Surveyor, M. Lynn Lemon, County Attorney, Scott Wyatt, County Assessor, Kathleen C. Howell, County Auditor, Tamra Stone, County Clerk, Stephen M. Erickson, County Recorder, Michael Gleed, County Sheriff, Lynn Nelson and County Treasurer, Karen A. Jeppesen.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

Councilman Petersen: Petersen told the Council that his mother-in-law had passed away and he will be unable to attend a scheduled meeting with the Council. All who were in attendance expressed their condolences to Councilman Petersen.

Councilman Anhder: Anhder reported that an information pamphlet explaining the proposed Water Conservancy District will be sent out in city utility bills. The State Water Engineer will be meeting with the Water Board next month where he will be reviewing water allocation guidelines and other water issues.

Council member Skanchy: Skanchy reported that the Airport Authority is in the process of hiring a part time airport manager as funding was provided in the 1999 budget for the position. They are still negotiating with property owners to acquire their property for a runway extension.

Chairman Gibbons: Gibbons, said that he had been approached by a number of employees thanking him and the Council for salary increases for 1999.

Capitol Arts Alliance Programming

The two Capitol Arts Alliance shows presented in this quarter were well received and well attended. Both series finished in the black. Preliminary amounts indicate that the Yesterday, Tribute to The Beatles show had a positive amount of \$862.00. The Lion, The Witch & The Wardrobe had a positive amount of \$1,813.00. In finding the net income, I have deducted all costs incurred with each show including CAA staff that are assigned to programming and marketing.

The Yesterday group played to an enthusiastic crowd, and I beleive everyone enjoyed themselves.

The Lion, The Witch & The Wardrobe performed a free matinee for the children of the county school district and filled the theatre. The evening performance was well attended.

Shows Coming Up

On December 8, 1998, the Ellen Eccles Theatre will present Ramona Quimby a children's show based on the well-loved children's books by Beverly Cleary. There will be a free matinee for school age children as well as an evening performance. This is one of the programs that the City of Logan helps sponsor through the Cultural Arts Grant. We thank the City of Logan for their help and support.

On January 15, 1999, the Ellen Eccles Theatre will present The Lettermen. We expect this to be a popular show as they have performed in the past and were very well-received.

Another show that was well attended in the past is The Coasters, Drifters, Platters. They will perform at the Ellen Eccles Theatre on February 20, 1999.

Capital Improvements

Our Air Handler 2 system has deteriorated to the point that it must be replaced. This is an approximate \$10,000 expenditure and we are all wanting to complete the project before spring.

The carpet for the Bullen Center has been purchased and we are now waiting for a window of time for installation.

Plans In Progress

The Marketing Committee is becoming very active and is seeking input from individuals as well as larger corporations as to the kind of shows that Cache Valley wants and will support. If you have attended any of the shows this season you may have noticed the survey inserted in the program. Our audience input has been very helpful. We are also sending the survey in the City of Logan newsletter and Charter Communication billing statements. Incidentally, if you have any suggestions please make them. We are desirous of meeting the needs and fulfilling the entertainment desires of the people of Cache Valley.

The Programming Committee is beginning to contact available entertainers and it is in fact the entertainers that we are asking an opinion on with our survey. The whole process is very exciting as we begin already to make plans for a new season.

Fiscal Report

The first quarter is presented for your information. It was prepared by Morris Harness of Cook, Dorigatti & Associates.

Fiscal Report

The attached Statement of Activities shows the preliminary results of operations of Capitol Arts Alliance for the three months ended September 30, 1998. The first quarter of operations has produced an increase in net assets.

Actual revenues and gains from unrestricted contributions and fees, rents, tickets, and other sales have exceeded budgeted amounts for the first quarter. Temporarily restricted contributions are below budgeted amounts primarily due to the timing of expected revenues and also due to the budget presentation of funding from outside agencies.

Total expenses for the first quarter are below budgeted amounts. Some of the difference between budgeted and actual expense is due to the timing of expenses for production and marketing and facilities related expenditures. These expenses are anticipated later in the year.

The County Council of Cache County, Utah, in a regular meeting, lawful notice of which has been given, finds that it is in the best interest of Cache County to enter into a Contract with the State of Utah, Department of Community and Economic Development, for a grant of funds for the Bridgerland Community Ice Arena.

On or before December 31, 1999, all funding for the entire cost of the Bridgerland Community Ice Arena will be committed, in writing, including an endowment in the sum of \$500,000.00, which will be raised by the board of the Bridgerland Community Ice Arena; and no construction will commence until the entire amount of the funding required for the project has been committed, in writing, based upon actual firm bids for the various phases of the project.

RE: Ad-valorem appraisal on the Coppermill Restaurant (06-025-0011) and the Emporium Building located at 55 North Main (06-028-0016), Logan, Cache County, Utah.

We have recently been provided a real estate valuation report (appraisal) accomplished by Thomas D. Singleton, MAI dated 30 September 1996. This appraisal covered the Coppermill Restaurant (which was being extensively remodeled and renovated) and the Emporium Building. The appraisal estimated the completed value of the Coppermill as of April 1, 1997 at \$1,014,000. The Emporium property was estimated in this report to have a value of \$1,050,000 as of July 18,1996.

Due to the extensive remodeling, renovation, etc. both of these parcels were reappraised for tax purposes for the 1998 tax year. We had placed a value on the Emporium property of \$1,262,393 and on the new and renovated Coppermill a value of \$1,322,645. The Coppermill renovation also incorporated the "Fred's Flowers" building. Information was obtained from a Mr. Mac McKay at the Coppermill. No cost information was provided nor was the appraisal done by Mr. Singleton provided at that time. Our values were based on Marshall-Swift Commercial Cost Estimates and physical information gathered.

These values were established as of 1 January 1998 (lien date) and were not appealed at the Board of Equalization Hearings held in July and August of this year. Relative to the fee appraisal submitted our values are \$212,393 higher on the Emporium and \$308,645 higher on the Coppermill. It is probable adjustments would have been made had the appraisal been submitted.

These differences, though significant are not unreasonable relative to property valued at over \$2,000,000. It is to be noted that the effective date of the appraisals are different (Sept. 96 to Jan. 98), and that the building was appraised subject to completion for the Coppermill by Mr. Singleton. The difference in time may or may not account for some of the discrepancy in value.

In prior years the value for the Emporium was much lower (\$376,299 for the 1997 tax year and previous). The Coppermill was not completed as of Jan. 1, 1997 making a comparison of property valuations irrelevant.

It would be my recommendation that the Singleton appraisal be used for the 1999 tax year. No timely appeal was made for the 1998 tax year, nor was the appraisal submitted in 1997 when the appraisal exceeded our valuation.
