#### CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

February 23, 1999

The Cache County Council met in a regular session on February 23, 1999 in the County Council Chambers located at 120 North 100 West, Logan, Utah 84321.

### **ATTENDANCE**

Council Vice Chairman H. Craig Petersen was present. Chairman Darrel L. Gibbons was absent and excused. Council members present were Sarah Ann Skanchy, Cory Yeates, Guy Ray Pulsipher and C. Larry Anhder. Councilman Layne M. Beck was absent and excused.

Others present were: M. Lynn Lemon, County Executive, Stephen M. Erickson, County Clerk, Scott Wyatt, County Attorney, Jim Smith, County Administrative Assistant, Bob Hasenyager, State Division of Wildlife, Regional Supervisor, Michael J. Arambel, a local dairyman from Hyrum, members of the local news media and other interested citizens.

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Vice Chairman Craig Petersen, called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and welcomed all who were in attendance. Petersen excused Chairman Gibbons and Councilman Beck.

### INVOCATION

The invocation was given by Councilman Guy Ray Pulsipher.

#### **AGENDA & MINUTES**

The agenda for the meeting was reviewed and adjusted to delete item number 6b. The agenda was then approved.

The minutes of the regular Council meeting held on February 9, 1999 were discussed, corrected and approved.

### REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

The County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon reported on the following items:

1. Capital Improvement Project-Bridge Construction-Approval: Lemon, reminded the Council that when a capital improvement project was more than \$10,000.00 the Council has to

approve the construction project. Bridges are being installed on 6<sup>th</sup> South (the Mendon Road) replacing old culverts.

A motion to approve the bridge construction project was made by Councilman Anhder. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

- 2. New Choice (Substance Abuse) Program Director Change. Brock Alder has replaced Doug Wiese as acting Director of New Choices. Mr. Wiese will continue as a counselor in the program. Lemon said, that other changes are being proposed and since the Council is the Substance Abuse Authority he will keep them informed of the changes.
- 3. Main Street (Logan City) Vision Survey: Logan City is asking for input regarding the city's downtown main street. They are asking Council members to participate in the survey as well as local citizens. The survey will help Logan City officials to determine future needs for the main street of Logan City.
- 4. Cloud Seeding: Lemon reported that the snow pack was 61% of normal at the end of December and now at the end of January it is 87%. Some have said that it will be near 120 % at the end of February. Lemon will continue to monitor the snow pack to determine when to end the cloud seeding program.
- 5. Legislative Update: UAC is asking all County Governments to encourage their legislators to vote against SB 155. This bill if passed would amend the property tax law and affect all Counties in the State negatively.
- 6. Warrants: The County Warrants for the periods of February 6 to February 19 and February 20 to February 22, 1999 were presented to the County Clerk for filing.

#### TAX PAYMENT IN-LIEU OF PROPERTY TAX: HASENYAGER ROBERT

The Regional Supervisor of the State Division of Wildlife Resources, Robert Hasenyager, appeared before the Council to present a check for \$9,114.13. The money is a substitute for property tax on property owned by the DWR in the County. The DWR pays 50 cents per acre each year. Hasenyager said, that DWR, is no longer acquiring any additional property now, but are working with private property owners to help manage wildlife in the County and State. Hasenyager, also presented a Habitat Calendar containing information on the DWR and pictures of birds and wildlife. Council members questioned Hasenyager on other issues such as private hunting clubs, extended hunting permits and elk herd management, East of Richmond City. The elk herd East of Richmond has been reduced and as yet they haven't received any complaints from property owners in that area. The Council thanked Hasenyager for his visit and especially the money.

#### TAX-PROPERTY ABATEMENT FOR HARDSHIP REASONS: ANDERSON, LINDA

Linda Anderson, a Logan resident is requesting that she be granted a tax abatement on her property for hardship reasons.

The Council discussed the request and determined that the applicant did not meet the requirements for tax relief. Council member Skanchy quoted from the County Ordinance regarding the past due taxes. The Ordinance does not allow any tax abatement for any year other than the current year (1998). Anderson is requesting abatement on taxes owed in 1996. It was suggested that a monthly payment be set up to allow Anderson time to pay her taxes.

Councilman Anhder moved to deny the application. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

### **BOARD OF EQUALIZATION**

On a motion by Councilman Yeates the Council adjourned from the regular Council meeting into a Board of Equalization, the motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

A motion to approve the above mentioned applications, was made by Board member Yeates. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

Board member Skanchy said, that there are a number of applications pending to come before the Board including one from the Hospital.

A motion to adjourn from the Board of Equalization back into the regular Council meeting was made by Board Member Anhder. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

#### **COUNCIL MEETING CONTINUED**

### **UAC MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE**

Executive Lemon, reminded the Council that the annual Management Conference is in Logan this year at USU, on April 14-16, 1999. The Council was asked to try to work their schedules so they could attend the meetings. Pat needs to know if Council members are planning on attending as soon as possible.

### **COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS**

Council member Skanchy: There is a Tri State meeting at BATC on weed management coming up. However Council members have other commitments so the County Weed Department Staff will be attending the conference.

Public Safety meeting in May for Police and other city officials. Executive Lemon will follow up on the meeting and inform Council members.

Forest Service, an overview of their projects for the area was presented. The projects include the Mount Naomi Wilderness, Foot bridges for walking trails in Logan Canyon, North Rich allotments, UDOT salt storage Shed in Logan Canyon and the Green Canyon Picnic Area in North Logan.

Vice Chairman Petersen: Petersen reported that he will be out of town for the next Council meeting and wants to be excused. Councilman Anhder will also be out of town.

Councilman Anhder: Anhder read from the Salt Lake & Weber Counties Water Conservancy District news letter. They stated, that they will by 2015, be looking to water storage on the Bear River. Anhder said, we will be unprepared to protect our water if something is not organized.

#### PUBLIC HEARING: AGRICULTURE PROTECTION AREA

A motion to convene a public hearing for an Agriculture Protection Area at 6:00 p.m. was made by Councilman Yeates. It was seconded and passed unanimously.

Arambel, Michael J. who is requesting that a 28 acre parcel of his property be placed in a proposed Agriculture Protection Area between Hyrum and Nibley was asked to review his reasons to create an Agriculture Protection Area. Arambel said, that he moved here from Arizona where large farms are being traded for housing development and even though he feels like the location of his property, which is near some sewer ponds, and will not likely be developed into housing, he does want protection so he can continue to enjoy being a dairy farmer. Arambel also said that he wants to be a good neighbor and co-exist with others but he still wants to be protected from future development in his area. Arambel mentioned that he has questions regarding the possible annexation of his property into the City of Hyrum. He wanted to know if his property is ever annexed, will he lose his protected area. Executive Lemon stated, that as he understands the law Hyrum would still have to recognize his protected area. It would be up to the County Council to make any changes in the protection area.

**Bushman, Scott**, a Hyrum City resident and a member of Hyrum's Planning Commission told the Council that he supports the request to create a Agriculture Protection Area on the Arambel property. Bushman, said that the polls support protecting Agriculture property and he believes that open space is necessary.

Vice Chairman Petersen, asked if anyone else in the audience wanted to comment. There was no further comment presented.

Councilman Yeates moved to close the Public Hearing. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

No Council action was taken at this time. However it was the consensus of the Council that a Resolution should be drafted that will approve the Arambel Agriculture Protection Area. Final action on the matter will take place during the next Council meeting.

### **ADJOURNMENT**

Councilman Anhder moved to adjourn the Council meeting. It was seconded and carried unanimously. Adjournment took place at 6:20 p.m..
