#### CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

March 9, 1999

The Cache County Council met in a regular session on March 9, 1999 in the County Council Chambers located at 120 North 100 West, Logan, Utah 84321.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

Council Chairman, Darrel L. Gibbons was present. Vice Chairman, H. Craig Petersen was absent and excused. Council members present were: Sarah Ann Skanchy, Layne M. Beck, Cory Yeates, Guy Ray Pulsipher. Councilman C. Larry Anhder was absent and excused.

Others present were: M. Lynn Lemon, County Executive, Stephen M. Erickson, County Clerk, Scott Wyatt, County Attorney, Lynn Nelson, County Sheriff, Tamra Stones, County Auditor, Lorene Greenhalgh, Jim Smith, County Personnel Manager and Administrative Assistant, County Zoning Administrator, Gordon Zilles, representing the Blacksmith Fork Soil Conservation District, members of the local news media and other interested citizens.

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Darrel L. Gibbons, called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. and welcomed all who were in attendance.

#### **INVOCATION**

The invocation was given by Councilman, Guy Ray Pulsipher.

#### **AGENDA & MINUTES**

The agenda for the meeting was reviewed and approved.

The minutes of the regular Council meeting held on February 23, 1999 were discussed, corrected and approved.

#### REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

The County Executive, M. Lynn Lemon reported on the following items:

1. Appointments:

Appointment: Richman, Da Wayne appointed to the County Weed Board

Appointment: Clements, LaMar reappointed as an alternate on the Board of Adjustments.

Appointment: Reese, Tracy, reappointed to the Benson Planning Commission Appointment: Nielsen, Bonnie appointed to the Co. Board of Adjustments.

### A motion to approve the above recommended appointments was made by Councilman Yeates. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

- 2. Economic Development Advisory Board: The Cache County Economic Development Advisory Board is now organized and meeting monthly with the Chamber of Commerce to draft a new strategic plan for future economic development in the County.
- 3. Bridgerland Ice Arena Agreements: The Agreements between the County and the Cities of North Logan and Hyde Park, have been completed and signed. They are anticipating having 100 percent of the money for the project by a deadline of December 31, 1999.
- 4. Weed Board Meeting: There is a Weed Board meeting on March 15<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Policy will be drafted for the coming year. Council members were invited to attend.
- 5. UDOT Meeting-Wellsville Canyon: Representatives from UDOT and Legislator Loraine Pace, will be meeting to discuss the highway safety problem, on the Wellsville Canyon Highway (89-91). The meeting is on Thursday, March 11, 1999 at 8:00 a.m. in the Council Chambers. Council members were encouraged to attend.
- 6. State Courts Meeting: Lemon, is continuing to meet with the State Court System to remedy future building needs for the Courts and the County.
- 7. CDBG Second Public Hearing Set: Executive Lemon set a second Public Hearing to comply with CDBG requirements for County sponsored, CDBG projects. The hearing was set for March 23, 1999 at 5:15 p.m..
- 8. Warrants: The County warrants for the period of February 28 to March 5, 1999 were presented to the County Clerk for filing.
- 9. Recycling Zones: An application has been received in the Executives Office, requesting the County to establish a Recycling Zone in an unincorporated area of the County. No decision will be made until the Solid Waste Advisory Board has met to discuss the issue. That Board meets next week and the recycling zone issue will then be discussed by the Council at their next meeting.

### SOIL CONSERVATION BUILDING SITE EVALUATION: ZILLES, GORDON

Gordon Zilles, representing the Blacksmith Soil Conservation District appeared before the Council to review a site soil evaluation analysis that gives potential home builders in the County a knowledge of soil conditions to help them solve future sewer and other water related problems such as irrigation water seepage into basements during the irrigation season. Zilles, quoted from the Utah State Code regarding the functions, powers and duties of the Soil Conservation Districts.

### (See attachment #1)

Zilles also discussed an application that is being completed by potential home builders before a building permit is issued. The completed application would be sent to the Soil Conservation District for review and then returned to the home builder with soil data for sewage disposal. The County Zoning Administrator, Lorene Greenhalgh was asked if the proposal would help her in determining the out come of a request for a building permit. Greenhalgh said, that it may be helpful but it wouldn't be used as a final decision for granting or not granting a building permit. The Planning Commission uses the data received from the Bear River Health Department to show where there may be a water problem. Greenhalgh said that this application should be in the hands of potential home owners before they even buy the lot. Zilles, said that there would have to be a fee associated with the application to pay for reviewing and handling.

It was the consensus of the Council that the Soil Conservation District should present their proposal to the County Planning Commission for study and review. The Planning Commission would then make recommendations to the Council for action.

### **PUBLIC HEARING SET: BUDGET OPENING-1999**

The 1999 County Budget needs to be adjusted and it will require a Public Hearing.

It was moved by Council member Skanchy to set the Public Hearing on Tuesday, March 23, 1999 at 6:00 p.m.. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

### RESOLUTION NO. 99-06: ARAMBEL AGRICULTURE PROTECTION AREA

The adoption of Resolution No. 99-06 will approve Michael Arambels request to place a parcel of his property in an Agriculture Protection Area near Hyrum.

The Arambel application has met and passed all the necessary requirements and was given

Council approval at the last Council meeting.

A motion to adopt Resolution No. 99-06 was made by Councilman Yeates. It was seconded by Councilman Pulsipher and passed unanimously.

#### TAX ABATEMENT FOR HARDSHIP REASONS: BLAKE, MICHAEL

Michael & Jeannette Blake, Richmond residents are requesting that the County drop the penalties and interest on their back taxes for hardship reasons.

The Blake's are willing to pay the taxes and it was suggested that a coupon book be sent to them so that they can pay their taxes monthly.

Councilman Yeates moved to waive the penalties & interest with the stipulation that if the taxes are not paid by December 31, 1999 the penalties & interest will be reattached. The motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

### **BOARD OF EQUALIZATION**

The Council adjourned from the regular Council meeting into a Board of Equalization to act on Property Tax Exemption Applications.

The applications from the Logan Regional Hospital and the Utah Festival Opera Company, were tabled until further study and additional information is obtained. A meeting was scheduled to meet with the Director of the Hospital. Board members, Gibbons, Skanchy and Yeates along with the County Auditor and Assessor will attend the meeting.

The meeting of the Board of Equalization adjourned and the regular Council meeting continued.

### RESTAURANT TAX APPLICATION-GUIDELINES: DISCUSSION

The Council reviewed the application and policy regarding Restaurant Tax. It was determined not to change the present policy and since the applications haven't been sent out yet the deadline to return the application was extended to April 16, 1999.

The Council discussed the payment to the Festival of the American West. The payment of \$45,000.00 is designed to come from the surplus Transient Room Tax (TRT) for the first three years and then after that \$45,000.00 will come out of the operating TRT. The Restaurant Tax and TRT will each pay \$45,000.00 a year.

The Council has been asked to hear from a citizen's group from Logan who are proposing the Construction of a Hotel-Convention Center in Logan. It was agreed that the matter would be part of the next meeting agenda on March 23, 1999.

### FIRE DISTRICT PROPOSAL: DISCUSSION

Councilman Pulsipher who along with Chairman Gibbons are members of the County Fire Advisory Board. That Board is suggesting that something has to be done to obtain funds for fire fighting equipment and ambulance services. The Fire Board is recommending that a Fire District, that has tax authority, be established to provide funds for future equipment and personnel needs. Dr. Russell Hirst, President of the Cache Mayor's Association, and a member of the Fire Board and presently serving as Lewiston City Mayor will be reviewing the proposal at a meeting with Mayor's of the County at their next meeting. The Council discussed the legal part of a district including structure and a legal base. It was determined that the County Attorney, Scott Wyatt should draft the structure and legal technicalities for a proposed Fire District.

#### **CLOUD SEEDING: DISCUSSION**

Executive Lemon, told the Council that due to the percent of annual precipitation in the area especially in the South end of the Valley he has decided to continue to the Cloud Seeding Program probably through the month of March. Lemon said, that it may cost a small additional amount of money to do so but he feels like it is worth it.

Council member Skanchy moved to extend the Cloud Seeding Program through the month of March to help increase water reserves in the South end of the County. It was seconded and carried unanimously.

### **UAC MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE: DISCUSSION**

Council members were reminded that the Utah Association of Counties annual Management Conference is being held in Cache County this year. They were encouraged to register through the Council Secretary, Pat Parker as soon as possible. The Conference is April 14 through April 16 at USU.

#### **COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS**

Councilman Yeates: Yeates advised the Council that the Cache Economic Development Board is now meeting monthly. Executive Lemon is a member of the Cache Economic Board.

### **ADJOURNMENT**

Chairman Gibbons adjourned the meeting at 6:45 p.m..

- (d) (i) A new election for supervisors shall be conducted in any divided or consolidated district.
  - (ii) In an election under Subsection (10)(d)(i), the commission shall:
    - (A) set the dates for nominations, election, and commencement of terms of office; and
    - (B) certify the results of the election.
  - (iii) The nominating committee shall select a slate of at least six candidates for an election under Subsection (10)(d)(i). Nominations may also be made as provided under Subsection (6).
  - (iv) Notwithstanding Subsection (1)(c), the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes at an election under Subsection (10)(d)(i) shall be elected to a four-year term, and the three candidates receiving the next highest number of votes shall be elected to a two-year term.

### 17A-3-805 District a political subdivision -- Functions, powers, and duties.

Each district organized under this part is a political subdivision of the state and has and shall exercise the following functions, powers, and duties to:

- (1) employ, subject to available funds, clerical and staff personnel, including legal staff;
- (2) conduct surveys, investigations, and research relating to soil erosion, floodwater, nonpoint water pollution, flood control, water pollution, sediment damage, and watershed development;
- (3) devise and implement measures for the prevention of soil erosion, floodwater and sediment damages, nonpoint water pollution, and for the conservation, development, utilization and disposal of water on state or private lands with the consent of the land occupier, and in the case of school and institutional trust lands as defined in Subsection 53C-1-103(6), with the consent of the director of the School and Institutional Trust Lands Administration, acting in accordance with Sections 53C-1-102 and 53C-1-303;
- (4) construct, improve, operate, and maintain any structures considered necessary or convenient for the performance of any operation authorized by this part, and acquire property, both real and personal, through purchase, or otherwise, and maintain, improve, and administer such property consistent with the purposes of this part;
- (5) enter into contracts or agreements in the name of the district, and sue and be sued;
- (6) receive funds from any federal or state agency or from any county, city, or other political subdivision within the state or from any private source;
- (7) annually submit to the commission on or before January 30, of each year, a copy of the minutes of each district meeting, a copy of its annual work plan, and an accounting of the district's financial affairs. The accounting shall be prepared by a disinterested person and show the district's debits and credits including accounts payable and accounts receivable, the purpose of each debit, the source of each credit,

and the actual cash balance on hand; and

do all other things necessary or convenient for the efficient and effective administration of the district.

#### Recommendations regarding land use within district authorized. 17A-3-806

In addition to the functions, powers, and duties imposed upon each district by Section 17A-3-805, each district is authorized to make recommendations governing land use within the district. Such recommendations may include, but are not limited to:

provisions requiring the observance of particular methods of cultivation;

provisions requiring specific crop programs and tillage practices; (2)

provisions prohibiting the tillage and cultivation of highly erosive areas where erosion may not be adequately controlled if cultivated; and

provisions requiring the construction of terraces, terrace outlets, check dams, dikes, ponds, and other structures.

Each recommendation adopted under this section shall be uniform throughout the district; provided, that the supervisors may uniformly classify land within the district with reference to soil type, degree of slope, degree of threatened or existing erosion, cropping and tillage practices in use, or according to other relevant factors.

#### 17A-3-807 District courts have jurisdiction

The district court with jurisdiction in the county in which the district is located has jurisdiction to decide all cases and controversies involving the construction, application, or enforcement of land use ordinances within the district and the county attorney within such county shall act as legal counsel for the district in all such cases and controversies.
