The Cache County Council met in a regular session on 14 March 2000 in the Cache County Council Chamber, 120 North 100 West, Logan, Utah 84321

Call to Order

Chairman Gibbons called the meeting to order at 5:14 p.m.

Invocation

The invocation was offered by Councilman Layne M. Beck

Review and Approval of Agenda

The minutes of 25 February 2000 were reviewed, corrected, and approved.

Report of the County Executive

Other Items

Utah Department of Transportation Overpass Update

Mr. Lemon attended a meeting about the 11th South Overpass in Brigham City. Mr. Lemon

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indicated that he thought the council would support a reduction in speed from the top of the hill to the intersection rather than an overpass in that area. Mr. Lemon said that until recently he was unaware of letters sent by leaders from municipalities in Cache County which supported an overpass in that area. He also said that many of the people at the meeting were from Brigham City and that many of them were still having a problem with the overpass solution.

Airport Authority Letter

Mr. Lemon and a representative from Logan City, and Ann Skanchy, representing the airport authority, met with Hyde Park City. In an effort to cooperate with Hyde Park, the county has prepared a letter that said it would not oppose annexation of land to the east or west of the airport if Hyde Park would not include land which is considered part of the airport. Mr. Lemon asked the council if they had any concerns with this.

Mr. Anhder moved that it would be the policy of the Cache County Council to not oppose the annexation of property to the east or west of the runway, provided that the property now owned by the Logan/Cache Airport Authority would be excluded from any annexation petition. Ms. Skanchy seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Feasibility Consultant Preliminary Presentation Scheduled

The feasibility consultant will do her preliminary presentation about the College-Young Incorporation Petition at the next council meeting on 28 March 2000. There will be a meeting preceding the council meeting in which the sponsors will review the consultant's findings. The meeting will be at 4:00 p.m. on 28 March 2000 in the council's chambers. This presentation will be an opportunity to discuss the current situation. County council members are invited to the earlier session.

The sponsors will make a final presentation to the council at the first meeting in April. Mr. Lemon also intends to invite all those who are opposing the incorporation petition to attend these meetings. The consultant will provide information on revenue projections and incurred costs that will result from incorporation. One of the provisions in the law says that the consultant will provide the position of the governing body as part of her report. This is one of the reasons that the consultant will be sharing the information with the council members.

Cache Metropolitan Planning Organization

Mr. Lemon mentioned that the Cache Metropolitan Planning Organization met and discussed storm water management issues. The intent of the CMPO is to form an organization by an interlocal cooperative that will deal with these issues.

Mr. Lemon presented the Warrant Register to the clerk for filing.

Public Hearing, Community Development Block Grant, English Language Center

Mr. Lemon opened the CDBG hearing. He offered to let the English Language Center representative speak. She mentioned that the organization was thrilled to have been selected. The center will be providing language help to the community at large and specifically to those individuals who are learning English as a second language. The grant, in the amount of \$98,000.00, will also be used for program development. After asking for other comments from the audience, the council declared the public hearing closed.

Items of Special Interest

Presentation of PILT check from Utah Division of Wildlife Resources

Mr. Hasenyager presented Mr. Gibbons with a check. The check was valued at a little more than \$9,000.00. He said that when the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources purchases land, it does not remove the land from the tax rolls. These funds are revenues from the taxes.

Mr. Hasenyager mentioned the development that has occurred at Hardware Ranch. They are seeking to develop the area into a year round attraction. The area is a natural location for development of snowmobiling activities. Visitation was lower this year due to lack of snow. In a normal year the visitation numbers approach 50,000. This year that number was closer to 33,000.

Mr. Hasenyager also mentioned that the northern region's deer herds have not bounced back in recent years.. The department is looking for methods to increase the herd. A group has been put into place to help deal with issues concerning wildlife. This group then reports back to the DWR on issues that the public would like the DWR to address.

Mr. Hasenyager said that Porcupine Dam had recovered more quickly than anticipated. He also mentioned some of the other local lakes and reservoirs.

Mr. Pulsipher asked if Maridene Hancock had helped the division with its advertising in the area. Mr. Hasenyager Said that she had. He also mentioned an intent to get some folks into the valley during the Olympics.

Mr. Anhder asked what the current deer population is estimated at. Mr. Hasenyager said that estimates are about 15,000. Mr. Anhder suggested that there are more deer down in the valley than in past years. Mr. Hasenyager said that some of the deer become resident deer and do not go back into the hills. This is a difficult issue for the DWR to deal with as there are not any easy solutions to relocating these animals. A full-time depredation technician is located in the valley and is available to help with these situations.

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Mr. Beck asked if the elk numbers are down also. Mr. Hasenyager said that competition exists between the deer and elk populations. Elk usually win that competition to the detriment of the deer populations. Predation by wild animals was also noted as a source of lower numbers.

Bear River Health Department Report

Dr. John Bailey reported on the current status of the BRHD and presented the 1999 report to the council.

Dr. Bailey invited the council members to examine the report at their leisure. The Health Department has tried to make the manual user friendly. They have listed those who have been appointed by the councils in the multi-county area. They also included all of the employees by division. Statistical information and anecdotal information is provided to help make the information more and understandable to the general public reader.

Dr. Bailey reported on ten areas had been identified nationally by the Public Health Service, which represent some of the major public health improvements and advancements of the last 100 years nationally. An A grade represents doing better than the state. A grade B is equal to doing better than the nation but not the state. Performing equally with the two entities was equated as a C grade.

In a majority of the 10 areas, the BRHD did better than the state and the nation. Immunization rates received a B. The county does worse than the national average in this area, although it does better than the state. Deaths from coronary heart disease are better than the state or national averages. With regard to stroke, Cache County is the worst in the state. Hypertension is one of the contributing areas for strokes. The gap between the national average and our average for stroke is a small one however.

In the safer and healthier food areas, the BRHD rated itself as a C. This is due to the inability to get around to all of the locations that need to be checked. Only 50-60% of the inspections that need to be done are being done. They do a good job on the areas that they are able to inspect.

Fluoridation of drinking water also ranks very low. With the current laws, it has been difficult for fluoridation to be successful, although a recent law gave authority to second class counties to put it on the ballot. Cities already have that right.

Dr. Bailey mentioned that fluoridation remains at a low level throughout the state.

Mr. Pulsipher asked why a restaurant owner would be put out of business for not complying with a water requirement, while all of the residents of the city are using the same system to get their water. Dr. Bailey said that he was not familiar with the particular instance. He did say that it is not necessarily true that an entire system would be contaminated. Sometimes a portion or

localized problem can exist without it affecting the entire city. Sampling is done at random and occurs more in densely populated areas than in rural areas like Paradise. When tests show contamination, additional tests are done to determine the extent of the problem.

Ms. Skanchy complimented Dr. Bailey on the ease of using the new brochure. Mr. Anhder noted that it is good to have such an organization in the community, and noted that we almost take for granted that the water we drink and the food we eat is clean and safe.

Dr. Bailey thanked the counties for their support over the years. Dr. Bailey said that the 2000 Legislative Session was a disaster for the public health departments this year. Fees for services is the fastest growing segment of funding for the Health Department.

Mr. Petersen asked for a point of personal privilege and then asked that Spencer Wyatt and Ben introduce themselves to the council.

Public Hearings

Open 2000 Budget

Ms. Stones presented the items on the Budget Opening to the council. Ms. Stones reviewed each line item in the document, beginning with the first. For details see attachment.

Mr. Petersen moved that the public hearing be closed. Mr. Yeates seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Mr. Lemon offered some additional information regarding the Children's Justice Center Friends contribution. Logan City charged approximately \$5,000 to hook up the utilities. The City agreed to give back that money if the county would contribute about \$2,500.00 to help them.

On the library transfer, Mr Lemon said the county had agreed to pay a \$10,000.00 fund raising fee at an earlier date. This money was taken from the library's reserve account. When the county had money left over at the end of the year, he decided to reimburse the library rather than have the money go back into the general fund.

Mr. Anhder asked about the \$1,000.00 council overtime request. That money was appropriated for Pat Parker to attend the council meetings. Chairman Gibbons noted that Ms. Parker was initially asked to be at the meetings when the clerks position changed at mid-year.

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Mr. Gibbons asked that the appropriation be approved.

Mr. Yeates moved for the approval of Budget Resolution 00-05. Mr. Petersen seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Three applications have been received. Mr. Lemon said that no public comment either for modification or opposing the areas has been received. The Soil Conservation District and County Planning have both recommended approval of the areas.

Mr. Pulsipher moved to close the public hearing. Mr. Yeates seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

The Council adjourned to the Board of Equalization.

Board of Equalization

Tax Exempt Requests

Religious Requests

Ms. Skanchy moved that the council approve all of the religious exemptions based on the recommendation of Ms. Stones as the Auditor. Mr. Yeates seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Charitable Requests

Mr. Anhder asked about the Whittier Center's request. It was noted that they had received their last exemption after an appeal hearing with the state tax commission.

Ms. Skanchy asked if the council had granted a charitable exemption for the assisted living center last year. Ms. Stones answered, "Yes." One of the apartments is used as a charitable apartment.

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Mr. Yeates moved for approval of all the charitable exemptions. Mr. Pulsipher seconded the motion and it passed 6-1. Mr. Anhder voted against.

Ms. Skanchy suggested that it would be useful if Ms. Stones marked the chart to identify those who are new applicants.

Mr. Yeates asked that the council vote on Planned Parenthood separately from the other educational requests. The request was granted.

In the case of the Festival Opera Company, the request is on the Dansante Building and not for the apartment house that they own. They are asking for an exemption on some automobiles.

Mr. Yeates moved for approval on the education requests, with the exception of the Planned Parenthood item. Mr. Petersen seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Ms. Skanchy moved for the approval of the Planned Parenthood request. Mr. Petersen seconded the motion. Mr. Beck and Mr. Yeates voted against. The motion passed 5-2.

Ms. Skanchy said, with respect to the hospital, that the hospital's attorney sent a letter regarding a parcel of land which could not have its legal description obtained prior to March 1 because of the new Budge Clinic. The letter included an affidavit reserving the right to file an appropriate adjustment when the new legal description is available and the new parcel is created. The attorney discussed the parcel with Ms. Stones to decide the best procedure to follow for this case. The attorney said that they can have the property surveyed, and the County Recorder can give the new parcel a separate parcel number. This new parcel, which the new Budge Clinic will be located on, will be taxable. The rest of the property, which the hospital is located on, will be exempt.

Ms. Stones recommended that the day care center and the parking lot which has not yet been constructed not be approved. The parking lot should not be approved because it is still considered vacant land until constructed. The day care center was taxable last year. On the surgery center, the amount has changed from 22% to 38%. Ms. Stones asked for a recap on the change in percentage. The exemption on the rehabilitation center has been on personal property. The home health is a condominium-like unit. Mr. Beck asked how the hospital justifies claiming an exemption when they are in direct competition with entities which are taxed. Ms. Skanchy explained that the hospital has met the requirements for charitable status with the State Tax Commission.

Ms. Skanchy moved that the council approve the request that the hospital be given time to do the survey for the Budge Clinic property. The other issues could be dealt with by a subcommittee that would meet with the hospital administrators. Mr. Petersen seconded the

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motion, and it passed unanimously.

Mr. Beck asked if the Hospital in North Logan was a for-profit organization. It is believed to be for-profit.

Ms. Stones will send a letter to IHC concerning the Budge Clinic portion of the request. The letter will also list the items that the council does not intend to approve.

Ms. Skanchy moved that the council adopt the ordinances numbered 2000-02, 2000-03, and 2000-04. Mr. Yeates seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Initial Proposal for Consideration of Action

Final Plat Approval, Daus Minor Subdivision

Mr. Lemon presented the plat map to Chairman Gibbons. Ms. Greenhalgh had asked to be excused due to some health problems within her immediate family. The plat is located within the College-Young township. The request is for an additional family dwelling. Mr. Gibbons asked if the owner wanted to make any comments. He did not.

Ms. Skanchy said that she understood that the new well would be on the lot line and would be shared.

Mr. Petersen moved to approve the Daus Minor Subdivision. Ms. Skanchy seconded the motion, and it passed 5-0. Mr. Anhder and Mr. Yeates abstained from voting.

2000-05 Amending the Organic Act

Ms. Skanchy asked if the Organic Act for the Government of Cache County is amendable. Mr.

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Wyatt said that he could not answer that question, but would be prepared to answer it at the next meeting.

Mr. Anhder asked some questions about the particulars of the ordinance. If it is amendable, Mr. Anhder suggested that "Councilmen" be changed to "Council members". He also suggested that section 3.09 remove the information about the old salaries since they are no longer current.

Mr. Anhder also noted that the "voting, except on procedural motions, shall be by roll call," and said that we ought to follow that procedure. He is also concerned that the requirement for four affirmative votes can create difficulty if one or two council members are absent. County Attorney Scott Wyatt said it could be a problem if members recuse themselves from voting. This effectively becomes a no vote. Mr. Gibbons and Mr. Petersen both think that holding an issue over is an acceptable solution for those rare occasions when a full council is needed to vote on a particularly important issue.

Ms. Skanchy said that she thinks that four affirmative votes is the way to go. She also has a problem with amending the Organic Act at all, because it was voted on by the citizens of Cache County.

Mr. Gibbons said that when an item is important enough, it has been generally been tabled until a full quorum is available to vote.

2000-06 Amending Ordinance 77-18, Providing for the Issuance of Misdemeanor Citations within Cache County.

The council did not feel that they had sufficient time to study this particular ordinance and to gain the understanding to vote. Ms. Skanchy asked that 2000-06 and 2000-07 be placed on the next agenda. Mr. Gibbons agreed.

2000-07 Amending Ordinance 89-01, Licensing of Businesses

Mr. Lemon wanted this to be on the agenda for the first reading so that it could move through the codification process. Ms. Skanchy reviewed the existing ordinance and offered suggestions. In addition, Mr. Lemon met with the Zoning, Fire, and Building Inspection Department Heads and with the County Clerk.

The yearly income threshold for home enterprises was set a \$1,200.00. Mr. Yeates thought that this number could be considerably higher. Mr. Beck suggested that this number is too low. He said that his children make \$150.00 per month each. The suggested limit was \$2,400.00. Mr. Lemon does not have a problem with raising the limit. He does not want the process to become overly regulatory.

The fire chief is concerned about finding all of the businesses so that they can be inspected for safety purposes. The new ordinance would require a license at each location of the business. For those with multiple sites, the fee could be waived. Mr. Yeates said that the costs of doing the inspections are the same for every business. People with more than one business location should be charged for each location that requires these inspections.

It was indicated that state law will not allow for more than one government entity to charge for licensing.

Class D Roads/RS2477 Rights of Way, Quiet Title

This is the program Governor Leavitt proposed. Mr. Lemon suggested that the council needs to decide if we are in favor or opposed to this program and then tell UAC. Mr. Lemon's recommendation was in favor of joining. He thinks that most of the funding will come from the Constitutional Defense Fund.

Mr. Anhder moved that the council support this program. Mr. Pulsipher seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Ice Arena Bond Options

Mr. Lemon placed this on the agenda because the Restaurant Tax Appropriation is coming up, and the Bonding Companies are asking the North Park Interlocal Cooperative to prepare a parameters resolution.

The parameter resolution sets the parameters, or terms, for the bond and provides individuals with the opportunity to oppose the bonds if they desire. Mr. Lemon said that the council needs to decide if they want the bond term to be 10, 15, or 20 years.

A ten-year bond would cost \$142,000.00 per year, or between 1.4-1.5 million total; a fifteen-year bond \$109,000.00 per year, or about 1.7 million total; and a twenty-year bond would cost \$98,000.00 per year, or about 1.9 million total.

There is a question as to what the council intended. Mr. Lemon said that some of the council members intended that the council would appropriate up to \$100,000.00 per year, up to a total of 1 million. Others felt that it was up to \$100,000.00 per year without the million dollar limit.

According to the letter which Chairman Gibbons and Mr. Lemon signed, the intent of the council was to appropriate annually from the Recreation, Tourism, Convention, and Cultural Tax an amount necessary to amortize up to 1 million dollars in bond lease payments.

Ms. Skanchy asked about the 1/64th cent sales tax. She wanted to know if the ice arena was

going to fund another bond with the money from that appropriation.

Mr. Gibbons said that they had committed to the cities that they would not take more than \$100,00.00 annually. Mr. Anhder agreed that this had been his view. The million dollar cap creates a problem related to the bonding cost. Mr. Anhder encouraged the council to make it \$100,000.00 per year.

Mr. Lemon thinks that the council should specify if the 1 million dollar agreement is for total cost or if the cost includes additional money to pay for the cost of issuing the bond. Mr. Beck suggested that the council should only have one bond so that the fixed costs will only need to be paid one time. Having one larger bond would lower the transaction costs significantly.

Mr. Beck said that there is no point in paying the costs twice.

Mr. Lemon said that the local mayors will really feel the impact this year when the council takes out this large appropriation to pay toward the ice rink. He also said that the restaurant tax revenues are not as high as he had anticipated. Chairman Gibbons mentioned that \$60,000.00 has already been set aside. This would delay the full impact by one year. Mr. Beck suggested that the money could be used toward closing costs on the bonds. Mr. Anhder asked Ms. Borg if the bonds could be combined. She was not aware of this creating a problem. Mr. Lemon said that the issue does not need to be decided tonight, however, he felt the council should be considering how it would like to proceed.

Mr. Lemon said that initially the Bridgerland Community Ice Rink people met with Hyde Park City to get approval for a conditional use permit. Hyde Park City officials said it should be the county's responsibility because the property is in the unincorporated area. Mr. Lemon recommended that Hyde Park deal with the issue because the road would belong to the city. Hyde Park will be dealing with the water and with the look of the building. Mayor Daines asked if the county is prepared to petition that the property be annexed into Hyde Park City.

Currently, the county has a lease agreement with North Logan and with Hyde Park for an equestrian facility on this property. Mr. Lemon said that as soon as these cities are prepared to amend that lease, or end it, the council could prepare proposal to lease the land to the interlocal cooperative for the ice arena. Mr. Lemon asked if the council is prepared to petition for annexation of this property into Hyde Park City. The facility would be inside Hyde Park's boundary. Chairman Gibbons said that Hyde Park does not have sufficient money to fund its half of the road that will be needed.

Mr. Petersen wanted to discuss the \$60,000.00 capitalized interest costs (the cost of the use of the money from the time of the loan until the time the building is finished) and the \$118,000.00 reserve. Mr. Anhder said that the reserve is fairly common as security on at least one year's bond payment. It was concluded that if the loan were set up in this manner, restaurant tax money

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would only need to be allocated for 14 years. Mr. Beck noted that interest rates have increased by a full point since the original discussion. Chairman Gibbons asked the clerk to review prior minutes and to try and find proof of the intent of the council in this matter.

Ms. Borg said that she spoke to Mr. Hillyard about bringing money back to the county after the Olympics. She said that Mr. Hillyard felt quite certain that if the Olympics are successful he can get some additional money for our county.

Council Member Reports







Section 3.



ORDINANCE NO. 2000 - 02

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR THE CACHE COUNTY
CODE.

The County Council of Cache County, Utah, in a regular meeting, lawful notice of which has been given, finds that the following ordinance should be adopted.

The Cache County Council hereby ordains, as follows:

Section 1. Definitions. The following words and phrases, whenever used in the ordinances of Cache County, shall be construed as defined in this section unless from the context a different meaning is intended or unless a different meaning is specifically defined and more particularly directed to the use of such words or phrases:

"County" means the County of Cache, or the area within the territorial limits of the County, and such territory outside the County over which the County has jurisdiction or control by virtue of any constitutional or statutory provision.

"Council" means the County Council of the County of Cache. "All its members" or "all council members" means the total number of council members holding office.

"Law" denotes applicable federal law, the Constitution and statutes of the state of Utah, the ordinances of the County, and when appropriate, any and all rules and regulations which may be promulgated thereunder.

"May" is permissive.

"Month" means a calendar month.

"Must" and "shall" are each mandatory.

"Oath" includes an affirmation or declaration in all cases in which, by law, an affirmation may be substituted for an oath, and in such cases the words "swear" and "sworn" shall be equivalent to the words "affirm" and "affirmed."

"Owner," applied to a building or land, means and includes any part owner, joint owner, tenant in common, joint tenant, tenant by the entirety, of the whole or a part of such building or land.

"Person" means and includes a natural person, joint venture, joint stock company, partnership, association, club, company, corporation, business, trust, organization, or the manager, lessee, agent, servant, officer or employee of any of them.

"Personal property" means and includes money, goods, chattels, things in action and evidences of debt.

"Preceding" and "following" mean next before and next after, respectively.

"Property" means and includes real and personal property.

"Real property" means and includes lands, tenements and hereditaments.

"Sidewalk" means that portion of a street between the curblineline and the adjacent property line intended for the use of pedestrians.

"State" means the state of Utah.

"Street" means and includes all streets, highways, avenues, lanes, alleys, courts, places, squares, curbs, or other public ways in the County which have been or may hereafter be dedicated and open to public use, or such other public property so designated in any law of this state.

"Tenant" and "occupant," applied to a building or land, mean and include any person who occupies the whole or a part of such building or land, whether alone or with others.

"Written" means and includes printed, typewritten, mimeographed, multigraphed, or otherwise reproduced in permanent visible form.

"Year" means a calendar year.

Section 2. Interpretation of language. All words and phrases shall be construed according to the common and approved usage of the language, but technical words and phrases and such others as may have acquired a peculiar and appropriate meaning in the law shall be construed and understood according to such peculiar and appropriate meaning.

Section 3. Grammatical interpretation. The following grammatical rules shall apply in the ordinances of the County unless it is apparent from the context that a different construction is intended:

- A. Gender. Each gender includes the masculine, feminine and neuter genders.
- B. Singular and Plural. The singular number includes the plural and the plural includes the singular.
- C. Tenses. Words used in the present tense include the past and the future tenses and vice versa, unless manifestly inapplicable.

Section 4. Acts by agents. When an act is required by an ordinance, the same being such that it may be done as well by an agent as by the principal, such requirement shall be construed to include all such acts performed by an authorized agent.

Section 5. Prohibited acts include causing and permitting. Whenever in the ordinances of the County any act or omission is made unlawful, it shall include causing, allowing, permitting, aiding, abetting, suffering, or concealing the fact of such act or omission.

Section 6. Computation of time. Except when otherwise provided, the time within which an act is required to be done shall be computed by excluding the first day and including the last day, unless the last day is Sunday or a holiday, in which case it shall also be excluded.

Section 7. Construction. The provisions of the ordinances of the County, and all proceedings under them, are to be construed with a view to effect their objects and to promote justice.

Section 8. Repeal shall not revive any ordinances. The repeal of an ordinance shall not repeal the repealing clause of an ordinance or revive any ordinance which has been repealed thereby.

Section 9. Effective date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval and publication in the manner provided by law.



AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A RIGHT OF ENTRY FOR INSPECTION UNDER THE
CACHE COUNTY CODE.

The County Council of Cache County, Utah, in a regular meeting, lawful notice of which
has been given, finds that the following ordinance should be adopted.

The Cache County Council hereby ordains, as follows:

Chapter _____

RIGHT OF ENTRY FOR INSPECTION

Section 1. Whenever any officer or employee of the County is authorized to enter any
building or premises for the purpose of making an inspection to enforce any ordinance, the
officer or employee may enter such building or premises at all reasonable times to inspect the
same; provided, that the officer or employee shall effect entry in the manner provided in Section
2 of this chapter, except in emergency situations, or when consent of the person having charge or
control of such building or premises has been otherwise obtained.

Section 2. If the building or premises to be inspected is occupied, the authorized
officer or employee shall first present proper credentials and demand entry; and if such building
or premises is unoccupied, the officer or employee shall first make a reasonable effort to locate
the owner or other person having charge or control of the building or premises and demand entry.
If consent to such entry is not given, the authorized officer or employee shall have recourse to
every remedy provided by law to secure entry.

Section 3. This chapter shall be controlling over any other ordinance or part of an
ordinance on the same subject, whether heretofore or hereafter adopted, unless such ordinance or
part of an ordinance provides differently by an express reference to this chapter.
Notwithstanding any other ordinance of this County, whether heretofore or hereafter adopted, it
shall not be a violation of this chapter to refuse or fail to consent to an entry for inspection.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval and publication
in the manner provided by law.



ORDINANCE NO. 2000 - 04

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING A PENALTY FOR ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS FOR WHICH NO OTHER PENALTY IS SEPARATELY PROVIDED.

The County Council of Cache County, Utah, in a regular meeting, lawful notice of which has been given, finds that the following ordinance should be adopted.

The Cache County Council hereby ordains, as follows:

Section 1. A. Any person violating any of the provisions or failing to comply with any of the mandatory requirements of the ordinances of the County shall be guilty of an infraction unless the violation is made a misdemeanor by ordinance.

B. Except in cases where a different punishment is prescribed by any ordinance of the County, any person convicted of a misdemeanor for violation of an ordinance of the County is punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or by imprisonment not to exceed six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

C. Any person convicted of an infraction for violation of an ordinance of the County is punishable by a fine of not more than \$750.00.

D. Each such person shall be guilty of a separate offense for each and every day during any portion of which any violation of any provision of the ordinances of the County is committed, continued or permitted by any such person, and such person shall be punishable accordingly.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval and publication in the manner provided by law.






