# CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING December 06, 2005

The Cache County Council convened in a regular session on December 06, 2005, in the Cache County Council Chamber at 179 North Main, Logan, Utah.

#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Petersen called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to approve the recommended appointments. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

- Request from Top of Utah Snowmobile Association Garth Barker reported that Governor Huntsman appointed a task force to find areas, features or places of extreme value that need to be set aside and preserved for the economic and recreational value to the citizens of Utah. The Franklin Basin/Tony Grove area is one of the top five snowmobile destinations in the United States and has been recommended as one of these "crown jewels." Barker asked the Council for a letter of approval for this region to be set aside for the benefit of Utah citizens.

Chairman Petersen asked Barker to draft a letter of approval and get it the Council by December 12, 2005, so the Council can review and sign it at the December 13, 2005, Council meeting.

• Ordinance No. 2005-16 - Reflecting Changes in County Attorney's Salary - 2005 - Executive Lemon explained the County Attorney was on an 80% salary arrangement at the beginning of 2005 and this allows the county to pay full salary to the county attorney for 2005.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Hansen to waive the rules and approve Ordinance No. 2005-16-Reflecting Changes in County Attorney's Salary-2005. Zilles seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

• <u>Discussion - 2006 Salaries for Elected Officials</u> - Lemon did not propose any recommendation regarding a market increase for elected officials in addition to the proposed 5% increase for all county employees. Lemon said some elected officials feel strongly there should be a market increase and other elected officials were opposed to it.

Yeates asked if the market increase in 2001 applies to elected officials. Jim Smith said it did not.

Sheriff Nelson spoke in favor of a market increase for elected officials.

• Ordinance No. 2005-14 - Setting Salaries for Elected Officials - Chairman Petersen explained this would include the 5% increase, but not an additional market increase.

#### (Attachment 5)

ACTION: Motion by Council member Gibbons to waive the rules and adopt Ordinance No. 2005-14-Setting Salaries for Elected Officials. Hansen seconded the motion.

Discussion on motion:

Daines stated the Sheriff's Department was over 50% of the budget yet the Sheriff is only receiving \$10,000 more than other elected officials. Daines also said the Executive should be receiving \$5,000 more bringing the salary to \$80,000.00.

Lemon said if the Council increases the Sheriff's and Executive's salaries, the salaries of other elected officials should be increased, too.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to amend the main motion to increase the County Executive salary to \$80,000.00 and the County Sheriff salary to \$70,000.00. Zilles seconded the motion. The motion to amend failed, 3 aye - Robison, Yeates & Zilles and 4 nay - Hansen, Chambers, Petersen & Gibbons.

Discussion on amendment:

Gibbons noted that the cumulative shortfall on market adjustment for elected officials is about 3 % and the Council should not short change the elected officials in future years with respect to market adjustments.

ACTION: The main motion passed, 6 aye - Hansen, Chambers, Robison, Petersen, Zilles & Gibbons and 1 nay - Yeates.

#### PUBLIC HEARINGS, APPEALS AND BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MATTERS

<u>PUBLIC HEARING:</u> OPEN 2005 BUDGET - Auditor Stones reviewed the adjustments to the 2005 budget and recommended adoption. (See Attachment 6 to Resolution No. 2005-35 for details)

Chairman Petersen opened the Public Hearing and invited public comment. There was none.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to close the Public Hearing. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to waive the rules and approve Resolution No. 2005-35-Adjustments to 2005 Budget. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

Ordinance No. 2005-15 - Setting Salaries for County Council

ACTION: Motion by Council member Gibbons to waive the rules and adopt Ordinance No. 2005-15-Setting Salaries for County Council. Yeates seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

Resolution No. 2005-34 - Adoption of 2006 Budget

ACTION: Motion by Council member Gibbons to waive the rules and approve Resolution No. 2005-34-Adoption of 2006 Budget. Zilles seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

<u>Adoption of Proposed 2006 Capital Improvement Plan</u> - Lemon explained that this is a
five-year program the county can work from to prioritize and/or add road, airport and other
projects, etc.

Lemon said a project scheduled for 2010 is straightening the curves in the Mt. Pisgah Road (8500 South from 2000 West to 2400 West) and then double chipping it.

David Curtis said he turns left on to this section of road and can only tell if cars are coming by the dust they create. If the road is double chipped, he asks that the curves be straightened as a safety precaution.

Council member Hansen asked that warning signs be placed on those curves in the meantime until the curves are corrected.

Council member Zilles asked that 4400 South be developed to take semis, etc. off of 3200 South where there are a lot of residences. Lemon said the county had met with Hyrum, Nibley and Wellsville on this issue a few years ago and Hyrum was in favor of it, but Nibley and Wellsville were not as interested. Zilles asked that the timing be moved up so that surveying, etc. can be accomplished prior to 2010 and that the county talk to Hyrum about funding help. Lemon responded that the timing can be moved up. Zilles also asked that the improvements to 3200 South create a narrower road than the proposed width. Lemon said the county has suggested 80 feet. Lemon said before an agreement is signed for 3200 South the width of the road will be negotiated.

Chambers asked if the Humane Society's request for gravel that was approved had been delivered. Lemon said he understood the gravel would not meet UDOT specifications.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Gibbons to waive the rules and approve the Proposed 2006 Capital Improvement Plan. Yeates seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

Resolution No. 2005-36 - A Resolution Approving an Agreement with ADVANCEPCS

 Consumer Card Program - Lemon explained this is a no-cost discount prescription card that can be used by individuals who already have coverage that does not cover certain prescriptions.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Chambers to waive the rules and approve Resolution No. 2005-36-Approving an Agreement with ADVANCEPCS HEALTH, L. P. To Provide Certain Managed Pharmacy Benefit Services with Consumer Card Program. Yeates seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

Delay Agreement with Logan City - This item was moved to the December 13, 2005, Council meeting agenda.

#### **COUNTY INITIATIVES - 2006**

П Cache Vision 2020+ - Chairman Petersen said he and Gibbons have been meeting with the steering committee and work is progressing satisfactorily in preparation for groups to be developed as part of the study.

#### **COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS**

Kathy Robison said BRAG has been asked by the Governor's office to conduct a point-in-time count of homeless people in shelters. This will take place in January 2006. These numbers will be used by HUD to justify federal grants to agencies that Cache County works with.

Craig Petersen asked if the Council wants to discuss a county water department at the next meeting. Daines recommended waiting until after the legislation is passed regarding language in the present statute. Lemon said any discussion prior to the passage of the current legislation would be premature.

Gordon Zilles reported on the library meeting held December 1, 2005, and feels the possibility of lowering the fee Logan Library presently charges for nonresidents is good. Data is still needed on the Bookmobile to determine its future.

**Darrel Gibbons** said he attended the CCEMS meeting today and the revenues are okay, but there is still a struggle with cash flow. As of January 1, 2006, the auditing will be pulled in-house and Cameron Jensen will handle the audit.
