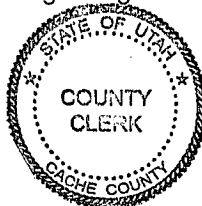

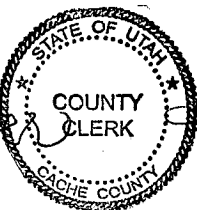

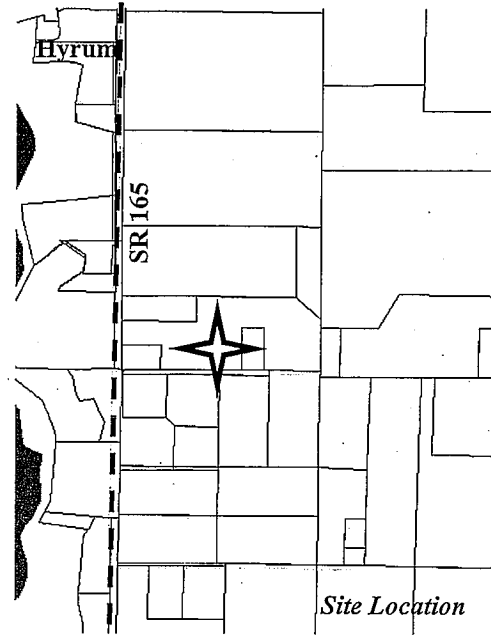

PROJECT

History: A conditional use permit was granted to Roger Clawson in 1991 that allowed a lot northeast of this subdivision to be created. This lot was contained within a 1970 parcel that crossed over onto the parcel that is currently requesting a subdivision. While the subdivision being reviewed today is not the same configuration as the original 1970 parcel, staff is considering the boundaries of this subdivision as a 1970 parcel.

Request: The applicant is requesting a subdivision to legally create three (3) new lots, Lot 1 is 0.84 acre, Lot 2 is 0.96 acre and the third lot is 10.62 acres. Lots 1 and 2 will have single family housing on them. Lot 3 is currently in greenbelt and will remain a dry lot to be used for agricultural production. The proposed subdivision meets the minimum lot size requirements of §17.09.040 and the number of lots/ lot size requirements of §17.09.080 (there will be three lots from the original 1970 parent parcel).

Access: The subdivision is accessed from 6600 South and 600 West, both of which are County Roads.

Water & Septic: Lot 2 has an existing well and associated water right for culinary water. Lots 1 and 3 were determined to have adequate soil drainage for a septic system.

AGENCY AND COUNTY DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

Bear River Health Department:

- Lots 1 & 3 were determined to have suitable soil for a septic system. Lot 2 has an existing septic system.
- Any new septic system shall be between 100 and 200 feet from any water ways or wells, as determined by the Bear River Health Department.
- Septic tanks must not be installed on more than 25% slope.

Cache County Road Department:

- County road 600 West has a hard surface (paved) width of 19 feet with shoulders and a right of way width of 35'.
- The Road Department recommends accepting this application.

Cache County Fire Department:

- Water supply tenders 2.3 miles from Hyrum Fire.
- Access roads to the property were determined to be adequate for fire protection, while the private drive was not adequate.
- Zoning clearance is approved. Each lot/home will need to be further reviewed prior to the issuance of a building permit.

Cache County Service Area #1

- Container must be placed on an accessible County Road.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Notices were mailed to 13 property owners located within three hundred feet of the subject property and to the City of Hyrum.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

Action: Staff recommends that the Planning Commission approve a motion to recommend that the County Council approve the Brian Darley Subdivision, a three (3) lot subdivision for property located at approximately 6600 South 600 West (Hyrum), TIN #01-070-0020, 01-070-0008, and 01-070-0019.

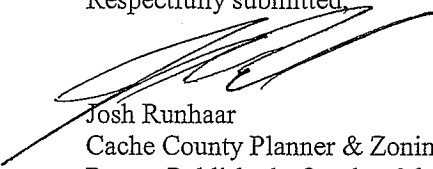

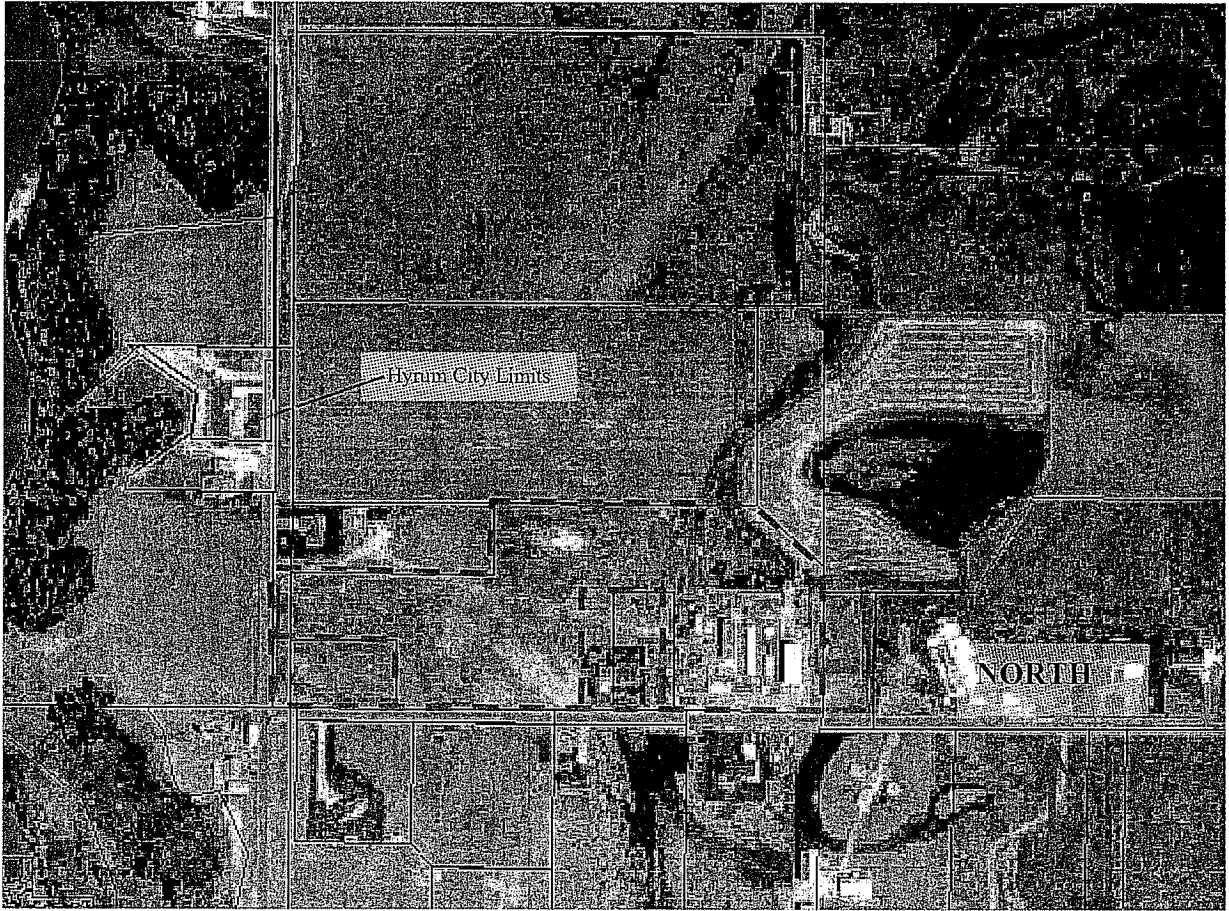

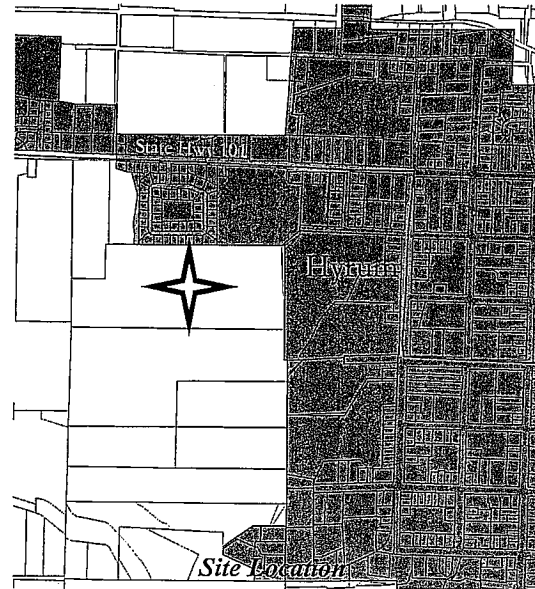

PROJECT

Request: The applicant is requesting a subdivision to create two (2) parcels. The proposed lot sizes are 3.95 acres (Lot 1), and 50.44 acres (Lot 2). All of the lots meet the minimum lot size requirements for a small subdivision as provided in §17.09.080. This subdivision is being completed to allow for Lot 1 to be annexed into Hyrum City for development, while the remainder of Lot 2 will remain in the County. It is likely that all of the development on these parcels will occur within Hyrum City, however, on Lot 1 will be seeking annexation at this time. Staff is not concerned with the subdivision as Hyrum has provided letters of support for the subdivision and for providing infrastructure and utilities for this site.

Water & Septic: Hyrum City has provided letters to the Zoning Office stating that Lot 1 will be able to connect to the municipal water, sewer, and road systems. Staff is recommending that the applicant not be required to provide any water as a part of this subdivision as Lot 1 will use services from Hyrum and Lot 2 is an agricultural piece listed as a dry lot.

Access: This subdivision is accessed from 675 West, which has a hard surface width of 40 feet and a 68 foot of right-of-way. Lot 1 contains within it the necessary right-of-way required to continue 675 West (Hyrum City Street), however, the dedication of the road will not be completed at this time and will be considered by Hyrum City as the development occurs.

AGENCY AND COUNTY DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

Hyrum City:

- All utility services including water, sewer, and electricity are near the proposed subdivision.
- Sewer depth should be confirmed with the Hyrum City Engineer before developing site plans.

Cache County Fire Department:

- A plan review will determine if the access road, private drive, water supply, and fire hydrants are adequate.
- Zoning clearance is approved for zoning only. Plan submittals must be reviewed and approved before approving any building permits.

Cache County Service Area #1

- No comments.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

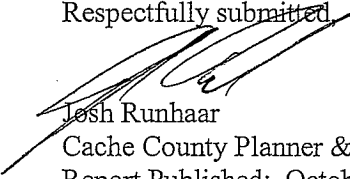

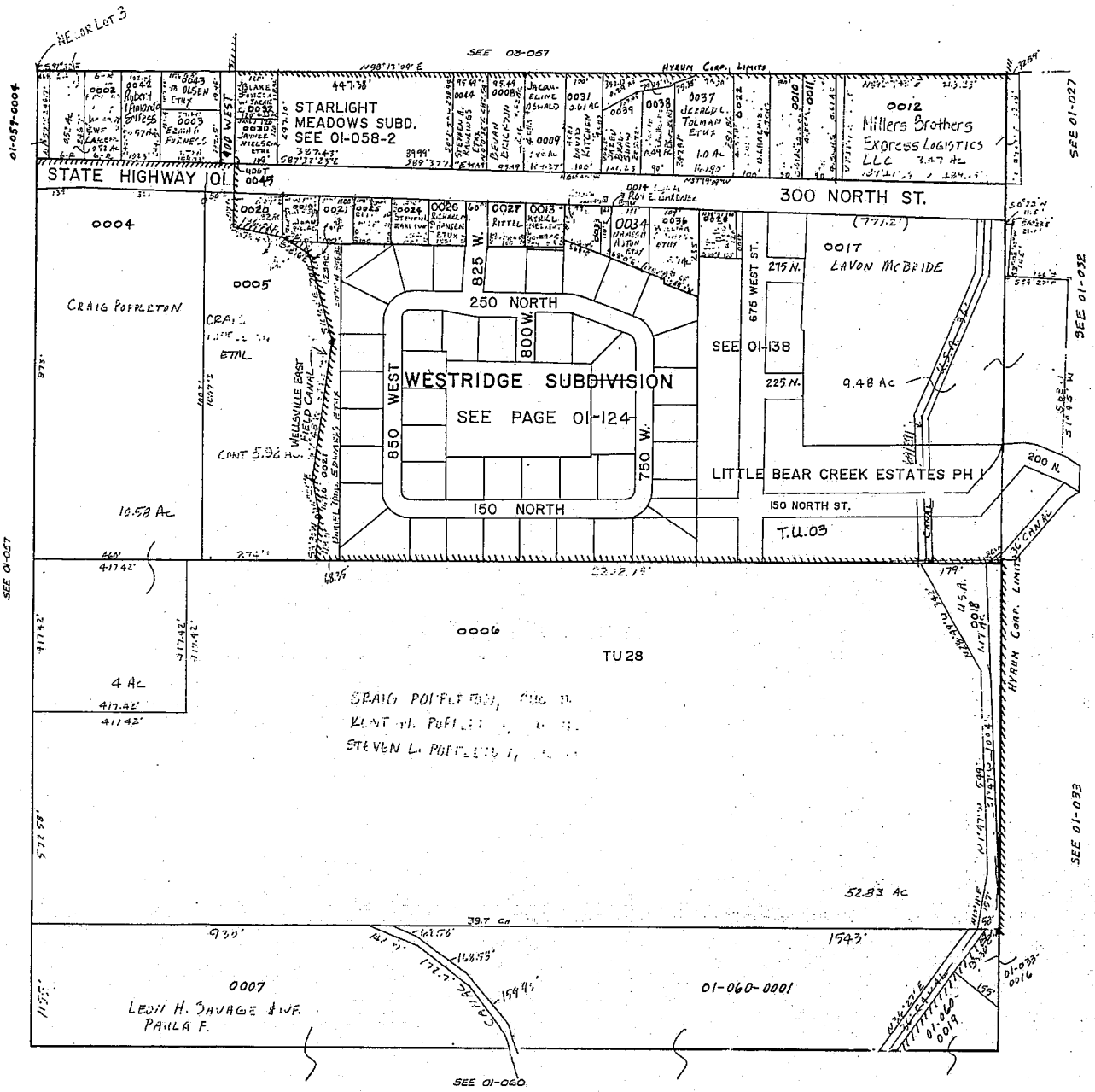

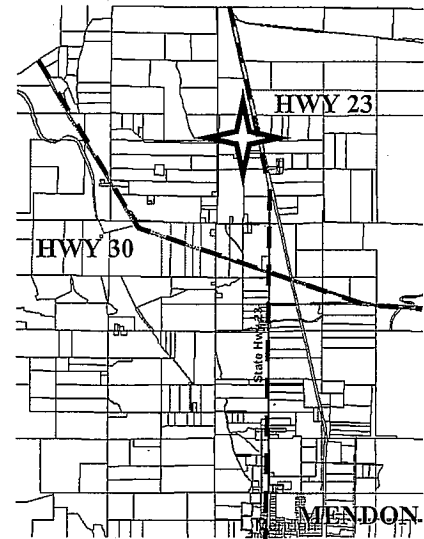

Site Location

PROJECT

History: This subdivision was originally proposed in September of 2004, but was never completed and recorded. The proposal in 2004 maintained a different lot configuration, but was very similar in most respects.

Request: The applicant is requesting a subdivision to create five (5) new building parcels. Lot 1 contains 36.2 acres and Lots 2 through 5 range from 3 to 6 acres in size. The proposed subdivision meets the minimum lot size requirements of §17.09.040 and the number of lots/ lot size requirements of §17.09.080 (there will be five lots from the original 1970 parent parcel).

Access: The lots within this subdivision will be accessed by private drives from 2000 North, a County road. It should be noted that Hwy 23 is directly to the east of the proposed subdivision, and that no residential access is necessary from lots 1 or 5 onto the State Highway. Additionally, County right-of-way does exist to the west of this property for the future continuation of 6400 West.

Water & Septic: The applicant has applied to the State of Utah Division of Water Rights for culinary water permits for this subdivision and is currently working on final approval of those water rights. The subdivision will not be recorded until the appropriate water rights for all of the lots have been approved by the State of Utah Division of Water Rights.

The Bear River Health Department has found that the soils on all of the lots are suitable for septic systems. Each home will be required to obtain a permit and installed in accordance with R317-4 Utah Administrative Code.

AGENCY AND COUNTY DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

Bear River Health Department:

- The soil on all of the proposed lots may be acceptable for septic systems.
- Any new septic system shall be between 100 and 200 feet from any water ways or wells, as determined by the Bear River Health Department.

Cache County Road Department:

- 2000 North, a County Road, has an existing paved surface width of 22 feet and a right-of-way width of 66'.

Cache County Fire Department:

- Water supply tenders 3.9 miles from Mendon Fire.
- Each lot/home will need to be further reviewed prior to the issuance of a Zoning Clearance.

CHAPTER 15.08 FIRE CODE

Sections

15.08.010 Minimum Requirements

This chapter is adopted as the requirements concerning the regulations governing life safety and fire prevention code. Where the provisions of this code conflict with the provisions of another, the more specific requirement shall be applicable.

15.08.020 Adopted.

The County Council and Executive, in order to prescribe regulations governing the safeguarding of life and property from fire and explosion hazards arising from the storage, handling and use of hazardous substances, materials and devices, and from conditions hazardous to life or property in the occupancy of buildings and premises as herein provided; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefor; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said Fire Code on file in the office of the county clerk are hereby referred to, adopted, and made a part hereof, as if fully set out in this ordinance, with the additions, insertions, deletions and changes, if any prescribed below, hereby adopts as its Fire Code:

- A. The International Fire Code, published by the International Code Council and National Fire Protection Agency Association codes and standards as adopted by the State of Utah in Title 53, Chapter 7, Section 106 of the Utah Code and Utah Administrative Code Rule 710, Chapter 9, Section 1.
- B. Amendments and additions as published in the Utah Administrative Code Rule 710, Chapter 9, Section 6.
- C. The International Urban-Wildland Interface Code, published by the International Code Council and the exceptions adopted in Utah Administrative Code Rule 652, Chapter 122.

15.08.030 Additional amendments to adopted code.

The following sections of the International Fire Code are also hereby revised:

- A- Section 101.1 Insert: Cache County for [NAME OF JURISDICTION].
- B- Section 109.3 Insert: Class C misdemeanor for [SPECIFY OFFENSE]
- C- Section 109.3 Insert: up to seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) for [AMOUNT].
- D- Section 109.3 Insert: up to ninety days for [NUMBER OF DAYS].
- E- Section 111.4 Insert: up to two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) for the first [AMOUNT] and up to seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) for the second [AMOUNT].

15.08.040 Fire Code Official.

Whenever the words "fire code official" or "fire official" are used in the fire code adopted in this chapter, they shall mean the Cache County fire chief.

15.08.050 Enforcement.

The Fire Code shall be enforced by the Cache County Fire District under the supervision of the Cache County fire chief. The Cache County fire chief may assign such members from the fire district as fire marshal, deputy fire marshals or inspectors as shall from time to time be necessary. The Urban-Interface code shall be enforced by the Cache County Fire District and the Cache County Development Services Department. All citations and penalties issued in the enforcement of this code shall be done with direct consultation and oversight of the Cache County attorney or his/her designee.
