The Council adjourned to Executive Session at 5:10 p.m.

The Council adjourned from Executive Session at 5:40 p.m.

Executive Lemon withdrew the recommendation for Planning Commission appointments at this time and will present them at the end of the Council meeting.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Gibbons to approve the recommended appointments for the Richmond Cemetery District. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

WARRANTS: There were no warrants.

OTHER ITEMS

- <u>Ritewood Eggs</u> Executive Lemon said Ritewood Eggs has reached a revised settlement agreement. If the Council wants to take a position on the revised agreement it must have a statement on this matter sent to the state by January 8, 2007. Gibbons noted that because the penalty Ritewood will have to pay remains the same and only the approach to the payment has changed, Cache County will not issue any statement.
- Chamber of Commerce Building Lemon said that the contributor who was to help the Chamber of Commerce pay for the note on the building will not be able to make the promised payment; therefore, the Chamber of Commerce has deeded one-fifth of the building back to Cache County. With improvements that have been made, the building is valued at approximately \$500,000.00.

PENDING ACTION

Approval of Cache County Capital Improvements Plan for 2007/2008 - Chairman Yeates indicated this plan was reviewed at the December 5, 2006, Council meeting.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Robison to approve the Cache County Capital Improvements Plan for 2007/2008. Hansen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous. 7-0.

■ Resolution No. 2006-31 - A Resolution of the County Council of Cache County, Utah, Declaring Certain R.S. 2477 Roadways as Public Roads - Chairman Yeates told the Council that the maps attached to the resolution indicate the first roads proposed to be Class B roads. Attorney Don Linton, in County Attorney George Daines' absence, explained that this resolution accepts the Wasatch/Cache National Forest Ogden and Logan Ranger District 2005 Travel Plan in its entirety. This action is recommended by the Attorney General's office in order for Cache County to present resolutions at a later date listing specific roads as Class B roads. The Attorney General's office also suggested the Council prepare a County Ordinance regarding a county transportation plan.

Rob Cruz, U. S. Forest Service, responded that the Forest Service is supportive of working with the County to provide good roads for the public to use. Cruz gave the Council a letter outlining the Forest Service's stance on the R.S. 2477 roads.

Petersen asked Bryan Dixon, who had submitted questions to the County Attorney on this matter if he was satisfied with the answers. Dixon said he appreciated the reply, but still had other concerns.

Petersen asked how many miles of the roads to be submitted for Class B status would be challenged by the Forest Service. Yeates replied that none of the 148 miles of roads presently being considered for Class B status are in dispute.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING:</u> DECEMBER 12, 2006 - 6:00 P.M. - OPEN 2006 BUDGET - Auditor Stones explained changes to the 2006 Budget and recommended approval. (See Attachment 5 to Resolution No. 2006-37-Adjustments to 2006 Budget-for details.)

Chairman Yeates opened the Public Hearing and invited public comment. There was none.

ACTION: Motion by Vice Chairman Hansen to close the Public Hearing. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

Resolution No. 2006-37 - Adjustments to 2006 Budget

ACTION: Motion by Council member Gibbons to waive the rules and approve Resolution No. 2006-37-Adjustments to 2006 Budget. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

PENDING ACTION

Resolution No. 2006-34 - Authorizing the issuance and sale of up to \$8,000,000.00 aggregate principal amount of Sales Tax Revenue Refunding Bonds of Cache County, Utah, and providing for related matters - Yeates said this is to allow the county to take advantage of interest rates, if they are in a favorable position after the first of the year.

Alex Buxton, Zions Bank, said that current rates would provide a 3.3% savings, or \$300,000.00, to the county. A 3% savings is considered an indication to move forward with refunding and recommended approval of Resolution No. 2006-34.

• Resolution No. 2006-36 - Amending the Cache County Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual Section 5.27.3 - Lemon said this would change the travel policy to allow Council members to be reimbursed for the cost of their spouses' meals at the UAC Annual Convention.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Gibbons to table Resolution No. 2006-36-Amending the Cache County Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual Section 5.27.3. Petersen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

• <u>Final Plat Approval - Ernest Dean Subdivision</u> - A 4-lot subdivision on an original 1970 parcel in order to obtain a single building lot. Runhaar said the Benson Planning District has no concerns with this application.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Petersen to waive the rules and approve the Final Plat - Ernest Dean Subdivision. Hansen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

• Approval of 2007 Meeting Schedule for the Cache County Planning Commission, the Benson Planning District and the Board of Adjustments - Runhaar explained that the Planning Commission meetings have been changed to the first Thursday at 5:30 p.m. so citizens will not have to take time off of work to attend; however, the January 2007 meeting will be on the second Thursday in order to meet deadlines already imposed.

✓ <u>Election of Council Chairman and Vice Chairman for 2007</u> - Chairman Yeates opened the floor to nominations for Council Chairman. Council member Robison nominated Darrel Gibbons as the Council Chairman for 2007. Hansen seconded the nomination. The nominations closed. The Council voted 7-0 to accept Darrel Gibbons as Council Chairman.

Yeates opened the floor to nominations for Council Vice Chairman for 2007. Council member Zilles nominated John Hansen as the Council Vice Chairman for 2007. Chambers seconded the nomination. The Council voted 7-0 to accept John Hansen as Council Vice Chairman for 2007.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

<u>Darrel Gibbons</u> said he has received two complaints concerning the meals at the Senior Citizens Center. Executive Lemon will investigate the complaints.

Gibbons said he has distributed a draft of the agreement to create the Northern Utah Regional Landfill Authority to the Council for their review and input. Gibbons indicated the meeting in Weber County had been cancelled.

Petersen noted that Logan City is listed on the agreement as the representative for Cache valley. Petersen said some south end mayors in Cache County are concerned that Logan City is the representative rather than Cache County and urged the county's participation.

Gibbons replied this is only a draft and the discussion is still open with regards to Cache County's involvement and participation. Zilles said that if the county is to participate in this, there will be a cost and the Council needs to be willing to accept that.

Lemon reminded the Council the three major concerns of the mayors will be on Council agendas and ownership of the landfill is the first item to be included on an agenda. Petersen said he fears events will have already occurred by the time that item is discussed.

Gibbons suggested a special meeting with Logan City Council as soon as possible. Hansen was supportive of a special meeting.

Petersen indicated that the Cache Valley Regional Council will meet Monday, December 18, 2006, and Mayor Watts, Laraine Swenson and Issa Hamud will be at that meeting addressing the landfill issue. The Council agreed that Council members should attend if at all possible.

Pat Parker will approach Logan City and request a workshop meeting with Logan City Council and Cache County Council as soon as possible.

<u>Gordon Zilles</u> reported he and Petersen had met this date in a Critical Lands Task Force meeting where a January workshop with the County Council was proposed. Petersen said the fourth Tuesday of January was suggested. Petersen also suggested consideration be given to bringing together the Critical Lands Task Force, the AG Advisory Board and the Trails Committee since much of their work is related.

<u>Craig Petersen</u> said that the Quality Growth Commission, which allocates LeRay McAllister Funds, has two seats from county government that are vacant and suggested it would be valuable to Cache County to have a representative on that Commission. Lemon will contact Brent Gardner about the possibility of having someone from Cache County fill one of the vacancies.

Brian Chambers received a call from one of the property owners of land west of the airport who has an eight-mile round trip to access his land because of airport expansion some years ago. Chambers accompanied him and other property owners in the area on a drive to their lands. The property owners said they thought the county had promised to build an access road for them, but nothing has been done. Chambers asked that the property owners, as well as others who were involved with the Council at that time, be invited to a Council meeting to have this issue resolved.

Lemon said the agreement was that if the property owners would contribute the land, the county would build an agricultural access road for them, but one of the property owners was opposed to it and another property owner who wanted the road through would not give the land.

Chambers said he is sure there are reasons why the road has not been built, but feels the property owners concerned should have the opportunity to have their concerns reviewed and resolution achieved. Chambers suggested inviting the parties to a Council meeting by at least March 2007.

Lemon said this will be placed on a future agenda.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Gibbons to adjourn to Executive Session to continue the earlier discussion on Planning Commission appointments. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

The Council adjourned to Executive Session at 6:55 p.m.

The Council adjourned from Executive Session at 7:29 p.m.

ACTION: Motion by Vice Chairman Hansen to approve the recommended appointments for the Cache County Planning Commission. Gibbons seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 7-0.

RESOLUTION NO. 2006-31

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CACHE COUNTY, UTAH, DECLARING CERTAIN R.S. 2477 ROADWAYS AS PUBLIC ROADS.

WHEREAS, The County Council of Cache County, Utah, in regular meeting, lawful notice of which has been given, finds as follows:

- A. There are certain rights-of-ways, and presently existing roads, in the Wasatch-Cache National Forest Ogden and Logan Ranger District 2005 Travel Plan, more particularly described in this Resolution in the Attachments as Exhibit "A";
- B. These rights-of-way were created, pursuant to United States Revised Statutes 2477 ((43 U.S.C. § 932) (repealed October 21, 1976)) and Utah Code Ann. § 72-3-104, et seq., (1953), as amended, attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and were in use prior to the creation of the Wasatch-Cache National Forest.
- C. The Cache County Council has determined that it is in the public interest to accept the rights-of-way identified in "Exhibit A" as public highways;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Council of Cache County, State of Utah:

- 1. <u>Districts Identified</u>: The Wasatch-Cache National Forest Ogden and Logan Ranger District 2005 Travel Plan is hereby adopted by the County Council of Cache County, Utah;
- Public Roads Declaration. The right-of-ways, more particularly described in the attachments to Exhibit "A" are hereby declared to be public highways, pursuant to United States Revised Statutes 2477 ((43 U.S.C. § 932) (repealed October 21, 1976)) and Utah Code Ann. § 72-3-104, et. seq., (1953), as amended, by virtue of the continuous use of said rights-of-way as public highways for at least ten (10) years and the presumed dedication of said roads to public use pursuant, as a matter of law, through such public use.

- 3. Roads Not on Travel Plan: Further, the County Council of Cache County finds that there are additional rights-of-way not identified on the Wasatch-Cache National Forest Ogden and Logan Ranger District 2005 Travel Plan that the Council reserves the right to adopt as public highways in the future, but which are not adopted as public highways by this Resolution.
- 4. <u>Classification</u>. The right-of-ways declared to be public highways by this resolution shall be classified as part of the "B Road System" for Cache County.
- 6. <u>Effective Date.</u> This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
- 7. <u>Conflicting Resolutions.</u> To the extent that any prior resolutions adopted by the County Council of Cache County, Utah conflict with this Resolution, this Resolution shall be deemed paramount to and shall supersede such prior action.

We understand that Cache County is proposing to assert that the County owns public highway rights-of-ways on the Wasatch-Cache National Forest. Section 8 of the Act of July 26, 1866, "R.S. 2477," 43 U.S.C. 932 (repealed), provided "[t]hat the right-of-way for the construction of highways over public lands, not reserved for public uses, is herby granted." Even though this law was repealed in 1976 and no new rights-of-way could have been established after that time, rights-of-way for public highways may indeed have been established on National Forest System land prior to the repeal of R.S. 2477, if several conditions were met.

First, as stated in the law, such highway rights-of-way could only have been established on "public lands" that are "not reserved for public uses." National Forest System lands are reserved for public uses at the date of Proclamation, reservation, withdrawal, or other act establishing the National Forest or including land in a National Forest. Accordingly, for any public highway right-of-way to exist under R.S. 2477, it must be shown that the statutory grant of the right-of-way was accepted prior to inclusion of the land in the National Forest System.

In addition, to accept the grant, a highway had to be actually constructed, and dedicated to public use in accordance with applicable laws. Therefore, to demonstrate that a valid public highway right-of-way exists today on National Forest System lands, it must be shown that these requirements were met prior to inclusion of the land into the National Forest System.

Finally, if a valid public highway right-of-way was established prior to the inclusion of the land where it is located in a National Forest, it must be shown that the right-of-way has been continuously used and maintained as a public highway. If not, it may be deemed abandoned by applicable laws.

Since we have not been provided information regarding your proposed claim we cannot evaluate or concur with your potential assertion. Without sufficient evidence of title, the Forest Service cannot recognize any claim of a real property interest in land under its administration.

Most importantly, Federal law codified at 16 U.S.C. 551 requires compliance with regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture governing the use and occupancy of NFS lands. Regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture at 36 CFR 251.50 require that authorization be obtained from the Forest Service for all use and occupancy of National Forest System lands. Regulations at 36 CFR 261.10(a) prohibit constructing or maintaining roads or trails across National Forest System lands without appropriate Forest Service authorization.





Even where a valid right-of-way exists on a National Forest under R.S. 2477, the United States retains ownership of the land beneath and adjacent to the right-of-way, "the servient estate." Any use, constructed, reconstruction, or maintenance of roads that may affect that land is subject to regulation by the Forest Service, including requirements for authorizations, to insure that activities are within the scope of the right-of-way and do not unreasonably or unnecessarily degrade Federal property. The assertion of a right-of-way under R.S. 2477 does not exempt the claimant from the application of these regulations.

Where it is logical for a particular road to be part of the state or county transportation system, the Forest Service may consider issuance of permanent easements to a state or county under current authorities. Similarly, where roads are necessary for access to private property within a National Forest, the Forest Service is obligated by law to provide reasonable access, and may issue authorizations to the owners of such property. Seeking easements or other authorizations from the Forest Service under these authorities may be simpler, less costly, and provide more certainty than asserting right-of-way under R.S. 2477. RESOLUTION NO. 2006-34

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF UP TO \$8,000,000 AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF SALES TAX REVENUE REFUNDING BONDS OF CACHE COUNTY, UTAH, TO BE ISSUED IN ONE OR MORE SERIES; FIXING THE MAXIMUM AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF THE BONDS, THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF YEARS OVER WHICH THE BONDS MAY MATURE AND THE MAXIMUM INTEREST RATE THAT THE BONDS MAY BEAR; PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF A NOTICE OF BONDS TO BE ISSUED; PROVIDING FOR THE RUNNING OF A CONTEST PERIOD; AUTHORIZING THE CIRCULATION OF THE PRELIMINARY OFFICIAL STATEMENT WITH RESPECT THERETO; AND PROVIDING FOR RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, the County Council (the "Council") of Cache County, Utah (the "County") considers it desirable and necessary and for the benefit of the County to issue up to \$8,000,000 principal amount of sales tax revenue refunding bonds (the "Bonds"), in one or more series, for the purpose of paying all or part of the cost of (a) refinancing all or a portion of the County's currently outstanding Sales Tax Revenue Bonds, Series 2002 (the "Refunded Bonds"), (b) funding any necessary reserves and contingencies in connection with the Bonds, and (c) paying the costs incurred in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds and the refunding of the Refunded Bonds;

WHEREAS, in connection with the issuance of the Refunded Bonds and in accordance with the then applicable Section 11-14-17.5 of the Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended (the "Utah Code"), the County, following due, legal and timely notice, held a public hearing on May 14, 2002;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the applicable provisions of Chapter 27 of Title 11 (the "Act") of the Utah Code, the County has the authority to issue its sales tax revenue refunding bonds for the foregoing purposes;

2158846.01.03.doc 8700155/RDB/mo WHEREAS, Section 11-27-4 of the Utah Code provides for the publication of a Notice of Refunding Bonds to be Issued (the "Notice") and the running of a 30-day contest period, and the County desires to cause the publication of such Notice at this time in compliance with said section with respect to the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to provide for the publication of the Notice;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Cache County, Utah, as follows:

Section 1. Bonds Authorized; Purpose. The Council hereby finds and determines that it is in the best interests of the residents of the County for the County to issue the Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed Eight Million Dollars (\$8,000,000), to bear interest at a rate or rates of not to exceed six percent (6.00%) per annum, to mature over a period not to exceed seventeen (17) years from their date or dates, and to be sold at a discount from par not to exceed two percent (2.00%) of the principal amount thereof, pursuant to a resolution to be adopted and approved by the County in substantially the form attached hereto as Annex 1 (the "Final Bond Resolution"), the General Indenture of Trust, dated as of June 1, 2002, as heretofore amended and supplemented (the "General Indenture"), between the County and U.S. Bank, N.A., as trustee, a copy of which is attached hereto as Annex 2, and a Third Supplemental Indenture of Trust (the "Third Supplemental Indenture") to be entered into at the time of issuance of the Bonds in substantially the form attached hereto as Annex 3 (collectively with the General Indenture, the "Indenture"). The Bonds shall be subject to such optional and mandatory redemption and other provisions as are contained in the final form of the Bonds and the Indenture. Therefore, the County hereby declares its intention to issue the Bonds according to the provisions of this Resolution, the Final Bond Resolution and the Indenture for the purpose of paying all or part of the cost of (a) refinancing all or a portion of the Refunded Bonds, (b) funding any necessary reserves or contingencies in connection with the Bonds, and (c) paying the costs incurred in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds and the refunding of the Refunded Bonds.

Section 2. Notice of Refunding Bonds to be Issued; Contest Period. In accordance with the provisions of Section 11-27-4 of the Utah Code, the County Clerk or any Deputy County Clerk shall cause the Notice, in substantially the form attached hereto as Annex 4, to be published one time in The Herald Journal, a newspaper of general circulation within the County.

For a period of thirty (30) days from and after publication of the Notice, any person in interest shall have the right to contest the legality of this Resolution (including the Final Bond Resolution and the Third Supplemental Indenture attached hereto) or the Bonds hereby authorized or any provisions made for the security and payment of the Bonds. After such time, no one shall have any cause of action to contest the regularity, formality or legality of this Resolution (including the Final Bond Resolution and the Third Supplemental Indenture) or the Bonds or any provisions made for the security and payment of the Bonds for any cause.

Section 3. County Clerk to Perform Certain Acts. The County Clerk is hereby directed to maintain a copy of this Resolution (together with all annexes hereto), the form of the Final Bond Resolution, a copy of the General Indenture and the form of the Third Supplemental Indenture on file in her office during her regular business hours for public examination until at least thirty (30) days from and after the date of publication of the Notice.

Section 4. Preparation and Distribution of a Preliminary Official Statement. The preparation and distribution of a Preliminary Official Statement for the Bonds in connection with the sale thereof is hereby authorized.

Section 5. Severability. It is hereby declared that all parts of this Resolution are severable, and if any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of any such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect the remaining sections, paragraphs, clauses or provisions of this Resolution.

Section 6. Repealer. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 7. Effective Immediately. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

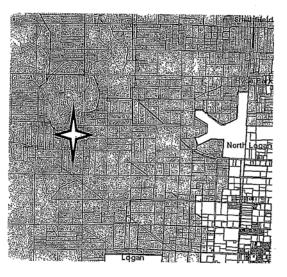

Site Location

PROJECT

Request: The applicant is requesting a four (4) lot subdivision on an original 1970 parcel in order to obtain a single building lot. The agent for this subdivision is representing only Lots 1 and 2 within this subdivision. The subdivision contains the two lots to the north because current State and County regulations require that all non-agricultural subdivisions required County legislative approval from the base 1970 parcel. While Lot 4 within this subdivision does not meet the minimum size requirements currently required by ordinance, staff was able to obtain historical records showing that Lot 4 was in the same size and configuration in 1963. This parcel is not located on the 1970 Plat Books, however, staff is recommending that because this parcel can be shown to have existed in the same size and configuration prior to 1970, that it be deemed legal within this subdivision with no restrictions.

Water & Septic: The applicant has received permission from the Benson Culinary Water District for water connections for Lot 2, which is the lot being proposed for development. Because water connections are not currently available for Lots 1 and 3, staff is recommending that they be approved as a dry lots and be appropriately labeled as such. The Bear River Health Department has provided a feasibility letter Lots 1 and 2, but septic feasibility has not been determined for Lot 3 and the existing septic system on Lot 4 has not been reviewed.

A portion of the Benson Irrigation Canal is located within the boundaries of this subdivision, and forms the boundary between Lots 1 and 3.

Access: Lots 1 and 2 are proposed to access from 2600 North which has a paved surface width of 21 feet.

AGENCY AND COUNTY DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

Bear River Health Department:

Lots 1 and 2 are feasible for on-site wastewater disposal systems.

Benson Culinary Water

- Culinary water has been approved for Lot 1 with stipulations from the Benson Culinary Water District. Cache County Road Department:
 - The property is accessed by 2600 North which has a paved surface width of 21 feet.
 - The applicant has provided the required right-of-way dedication for 2600 North on the proposed plat.

Cache County Fire Department:

- Subdivision is approved, further review will be required prior to the construction of the home. Cache County School District:
 - Bus stop can be located at 3385 West 2600 North.

Cache County Service Area #1

Residents will be required to locate their containers along 2600 North for collection.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Notices were mailed to 9 property owners located within three hundred feet of the subject property. At the time the staff report was prepared, no written comments had been received by Staff.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

Action: Staff recommends that the Planning Commission approve a motion to recommend that the County Council approve the Ernest Dean Subdivision, a four (4) lot subdivision for property located at approximately 3385 West 2600 North, Benson, TIN #12-017-0075.

Stipulations:

1. Any new septic systems shall meet the requirements of the Bear River Health Department and shall be a minimum of 200 feet from any water way or well unless otherwise designated by the Health Department.

RECOMMENDED FINDINGS OF FACT

The Planning Commission bases its decision on the following findings supported in the administrative record for this project.

- 1. The Ernest Dean Subdivision has been revised and amended by the conditions of project approval to address the issues and concerns raised within the public and administrative records.
- 2. The Ernest Dean Subdivision has been revised and amended by the conditions of project approval to conform to the requirements of Title 17 of the Cache County Code and the requirements of various departments and agencies.
- 3. The subdivision approval is issued in conformance with Title 17 of the Cache County Code.
- 4. The Ernest Dean Subdivision is compatible with surrounding land uses and will not interfere with the use and enjoyment of adjoining or area properties.
- 5. 2600 North provides access to the subject property, has an adequate capacity, or suitable level of service, for the proposed use.

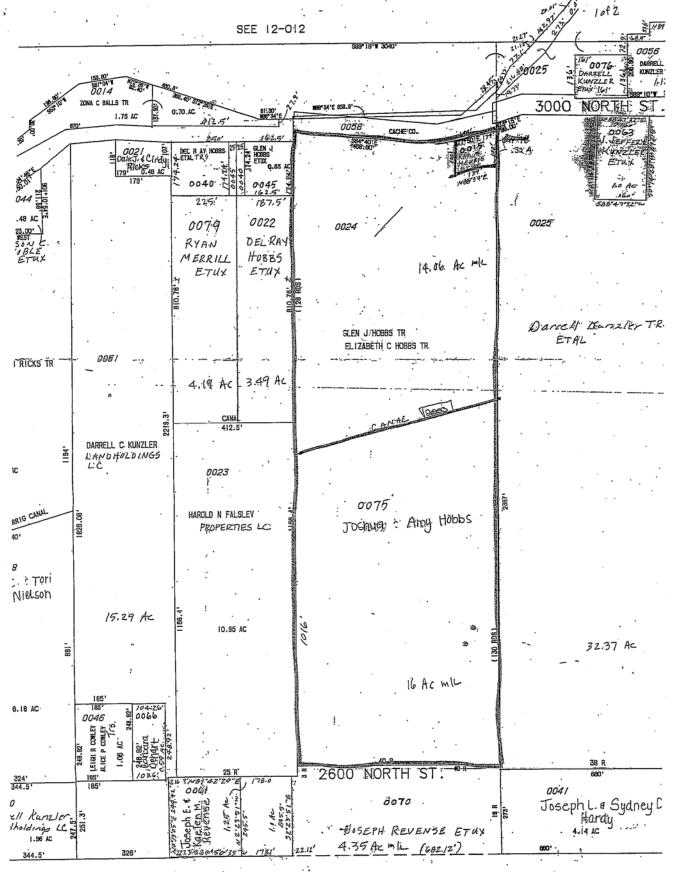

Over the course of the past 12 months worth of Planning Commission meetings, staff has heard many comments by both applicants and the public in regards to the difficulties involved with the current afternoon meeting time. The difficulty experienced by most is that individuals wishing to comment or even hear about specific projects typically need to take a half day of vacation to do so. The number of holidays that occur on Mondays is also numerous, requiring that the meeting schedule be irregular which reduces deadline and scheduling predictability.
