CACHE COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING August 28, 2007

The Cache County Council convened in a regular session on August 28, 2007 in the Cache County Council Chamber at 199 North Main, Logan, Utah.

OPENING REMARKS AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Executive Lemon gave the opening remarks and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA

The agenda was approved with Item 11c – Final Plat Approval – Hawberry Subdivision Amended – moved up on the agenda to follow Item 8b – Transfers-Intra Department.

REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

ACTION: Motion by Vice Chairman Hansen to approve the minutes of the August 14, 2007 Council meeting as written. Yeates seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE: M. LYNN LEMON

APPOINTMENTS: Susan Gillies Deputy County Recorder

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to approve the recommended appointment. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

WARRANTS: The warrants for the periods 07-27-2007 to 08-02-2007 and 08-03-2007 to 08-09-2007 were given to the Clerk for filing.

OTHER ITEMS

☐ TV Translator – Mike Braegger told the Council the flashcut changeover from analog to digital has a few problems. The strength of the Salt Lake signal overpowers the Mt. Pisgah signal in some parts of the county which causes some residents to receive nothing. The three options the county has are:

Cache County Council 08-28-2007

- Leave it as is
- Flashcut all channels so they are all digital and have no analog signal
- Return to all analog and have no digital signal

Lemon asked that this item be placed on a future agenda to determine which option the Council will recommend.

☐ Parades – Lemon reminded Council members of the Wellsville Founders Day parade on Labor Day which begins at 10:00 a.m. Their position is No. 38. The River Heights Apple Days parade is on September 8, 2007 at 4:30 p.m.

PUBLIC HEARINGS, APPEALS AND BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MATTERS

PUBLIC HEARING: CDBG - 1ST PUBLIC HEARING - AUGUST 28, 2007 - 5:15 P.M.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to open the CDBG 1st Public Hearing. Zilles seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

Chairman Gibbons declared the Public Hearing open.

Executive Lemon explained that the purpose of the 1st Public Hearing is to gain citizen input as to their needs and potential CDBG projects. A county may have a particular project in mind; however, at this point this should be open to any project identified by the public and entertain sponsorship proposals from non-profit groups. Input from this hearing will be considered by the county's elected officials to determine which projects will be identified in the jurisdiction's Capital Improvement Plan. All CDBG projects must be included in this plan.

Executive Lemon asked the public or non-profit organizations that are in attendance specifically for the Public Hearing to sign the attendance roll that includes name, address and phone number and asked who was in attendance for this Public Hearing. Lemon directed Pat Parker to be sure the interested parties signed that roll.

Lemon noted that approximately \$710,000.00 is expected to be available in the Bear River Region for CDBG projects; \$420,000.00 of which will be available for projects to be rated and ranked. All of the allocated funds must meet a HUD National Objective and benefit low or moderate income individuals. Projects displacing low to moderate income persons are not likely to receive funding. The range of activities that may be undertaken with CDBG funds are generally affordable housing and community infrastructure projects.

Lemon invited public comment. There was none.

Lemon noted that the public notice indicated anyone interested in being sponsored needed to attend this Public Hearing and needed to introduce the organization and what they were planning.

Attorney Daines recommended holding the meeting open until the next Council Meeting. Chairman Gibbons agreed that the CDBG 1st Public Hearing will be held over until the September 11, 2007 Council Meeting when it will be re-opened.

ACTION: Motion by Vice Chairman Hansen to go out of the Public Hearing – 1st CDBG Meeting. Yeates seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST

Emerging Problems Relating to Meth Usage – Bear River Health Department-Lloyd Berentzen introduced Randy Wilde to the Council. Wilde explained the state and local statutes governing the decontamination of methamphetamine contaminated properties. Wilde also outlined when and how the local Health Department gets involved in these issues. The Health Department fee for sampling a home for possible contamination is \$150.00. There are certified decontamination specialists who do the clean up work. Fees for the decontamination work vary from \$3,000.00 to many thousands depending on the extent of the decontamination. After the clean up is completed, the Health Department samples the property again.

Tape 1, Side B

Executive Lemon asked if a property is considered safe after the decontamination process? Berentzen responded that the property can be declared in compliance with the state standard, which is considered as safe by the state. However, the "safe" designation is applicable only at the time of inspection.

Yeates asked if just methamphetamine usage on a property is enough to contaminate a property? Wilde said it is.

Vice Chairman Hansen asked if there is a methamphetamine related arrest, do law enforcement officials contact property owners of individuals involved in the arrest to notify them there may be a problem on their property? Wilde said that is the procedure followed sometimes, but law enforcement must have positive proof before the property can be investigated.

BUDGETARY MATTERS

♦ <u>Intra-Departmental Transfer</u> Airport

Transfer \$5,000.00 from Snow Removal to Building to cover design changes for building.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Robison to approve the Intra-Departmental Transfer of \$5,000.00. Vice Chairman Hansen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Petersen to waive the rules and approve the Final Plat for Hawberry Subdivision Amended. Vice Chairman Hansen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

Vice Chairman Hansen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

Set Hearing Dates for Board of Equalization – September 12, 2007 – 10:00 a.m.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Zilles to set September 12, 2007 at 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for a Board of Equalization Hearing. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

PENDING ACTION

<u>Ordinance No. 2007-05 – Agricultural Subdivisions (NO ACTION TAKEN)</u> –
Chairman Gibbons said there was nothing to report on this ordinance. The
subcommittee was formed and will begin meeting after October 1, 2007.

- Resolution No. 2007-24 Authorizing Executive to execute an agreement between Logan City and Cache County regarding management and operations of the Willow Park/Fairgrounds complex Chairman Gibbons asked Attorney Daines to explain the status of this agreement. Attorney Daines referred the Council to an aerial picture of the properties owned jointly by Logan City and Cache County (Exhibit A). The management of these properties will be divided as follows (Exhibit D):
 - ♦ Logan City will manage Fairview Park, the Sports Complex, Willow Park and the Zoo.
 - ♦ Cache County will manage the Fairgrounds.

At the election of either party in the future the property will be divided along these management areas.

Attorney Daines referred the Council to a listing of the equipment that will be divided similarly.

The County and Logan City will continue working together on some of the properties. The south side of the track is county property, but the zoo will house some animals on it. Logan City will continue to allow parking on the city managed facilities. It is agreed that there will be no distinction made between Logan City and Cache County citizens concerning fees charged for the facilities.

If the land is divided and one party wants to sell it, the other party will have the first right of refusal to buy it. Daines said they will continue to work through the subject of water rights with possibly 20-25 shares coming to the county.

Yeates questioned the city keeping the Old Rabbit Building because fairgrounds equipment could be stored in the building during the fair and access to it is through the fairgrounds. Chairman Gibbons suggested a good RAPZ/Restaurant Tax proposal could provide funds for an equipment storage facility.

Petersen asked if there was value in not authorizing Executive Lemon until negotiations on the water are complete and also asked about fund balances. Daines noted that the Executive will not execute the agreement until pending issues are resolved to each party's satisfaction. Executive Lemon said there may be an amount due in fund balances by the end of the year.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Robison to approve Resolution No. 2007-27 – Authorizing Executive to execute an agreement between Logan City and Cache County regarding management and operations of the Willow Park/Fairgrounds complex. Vice Chairman Hansen seconded the motion. The motion passed 5 aye – Robison, Hansen, Gibbons, Yeates & Zilles and 1 abstention – Petersen. Chambers absent.

□ Resolution No. 2007-26 – Authorizing Executive to execute an agreement between Logan City and Cache County regarding the County Block – Attorney Daines said Cache County asked Logan City to enter into an agreement whereby Logan City pays Cache County to take this property. Nexus will provide an estimate and Logan City will agree to pay that amount to Cache County. If it costs more, Cache County will stand the loss. If it is less, Cache County will give Logan City a refund. The county will receive the money in the third quarter of next year so design can commence and bids can be received. There will be a total of \$375,000.00 available.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Petersen to approve Resolution No. 2007-26-Authorizing Executive to execute an agreement between Logan City and Cache County regarding the County Block. Yeates seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

☐ Resolution No. 2007-27 – Adjustments to 2007 Budget — Chairman Gibbons reminded the Council that these adjustments include the Sheriff's request for additional personnel and asked Executive Lemon to review that for the Council. Lemon said there is additional money in contracts from the cities for \$35,000.00 and Sheriff Nelson will negotiate with the cities to get the funding for the Administrative Sergeant's position.

Gibbons said if this resolution is adopted, it will allow the sheriff to move forward and hire the secretary and sergeant position as requested.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Robison to approve Resolution No. 2007-27-Adjustments to 2007 Budget. Petersen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

INITIAL PROPOSAL FOR CONSIDERATION OF ACTION

- <u>Property Tax Hardship Requests</u> The Council had concerns with some of the requests and Chairman Gibbons directed Pat Parker to invite Auditor Stones, Assessor Howell and Vicky Jensen (Treasurer's Office) to the September 11, 2007 Council meeting to explain the criteria and screening process used on the hardship requests.
- <u>Motion declaring certain real property surplus</u> Chairman Gibbons noted this property is located in Lewiston.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to declare certain real property surplus. Zilles seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

<u>Kathy Robison</u> said she had been in meetings with the Four Paws animal rescue group and others and felt they have some legitimate concerns. Kenny Eggleston wants to develop a countywide ordinance on animal control that would cover all cities in the county as well.

Tape 2, Side A

Robison believes this will take 18-24 months and asked if there is some type of temporary allowance that can be made for the animal rescue people during this time. Attorney Daines said they will not be prosecuted unless there are complaints.

<u>Craig Petersen</u> asked if there is any new information about 4200 North and the airport ILS proposal? Executive Lemon said there is not. The parties are still working through the problem. Several options are being considered.

The Chamber of Commerce has endorsed the county's road sales tax proposal.

Petersen said the Regional Council passed a resolution stating that before the county goes forward with an agricultural subdivision ordinance, there needs to be an underlying philosophical statement from the county that guides the ordinance.

Cache County Council 08-28-2007

<u>Gordon Zilles</u> asked if the gravel at the Humane Society facility on Valley View Highway is from the county? It is not.

Chairman Gibbons asked if all Council members will be at the September 11, 2007 Council meeting? Yeates replied he would be out of town.



PROJECT

Request: The applicant is requesting a boundary line adjustment as an amendment to the Hawberry Lot Split Subdivision. The Hawberry Lot Split Subdivision was originally approved by the County Council and recorded in October, 2006. The boundary line adjustment is between Lot 1 and an adjacent parcel owned by Clarkston Town. Lot 1 of the subdivision will decrease in size from 18.18 acres to 17.27 acres. The parcel owned by Clarkston Town will increase in size from 1.45 acres to 2.36 acres. The proposed subdivision amendment meets the minimum lot size requirements of §17.09.040 and the number of lots/ lot size requirements of §17.09.080. This Boundary Line Adjustment is being brought to the Planning Commission in compliance with State Code §17-27a-608 Vacating or Changing a Subdivision Plat, which requires the Land Use Authority to amend the subdivision.

Access: Both lots within this subdivision are accessed by substandard roads (10200 North and 10300 -North). The only lot-proposed-for-development is Lot 2, which will be likely accesses from 300 West, a Clarkston Town road. Staff is recommending that no improvements be required of either road at this time, but that if residential access are requested from either road, that the applicants be required to improve the roads to their driveway access point to the minimum County road standards. Appropriate right-of-way has been dedicated on the plat. The county does not provide snow removal service to the two access roads.

Water & Septic: At this time, water is not required as this is part of a lot split subdivision, however, prior to the issuance of a Zoning Clearance, approved water rights will be required.

The Bear River Health Department has found that the soils on both of the lots are suitable for septic systems. Each home will be required to obtain a permit and install the septic system in accordance with R317-4 Utah Administrative Code. Any new septic system shall be between 100 and 200 feet from any water ways or wells, as determined by the Bear River Health Department.

Service Provision: Water supply tenders from Clarkston are 0.7 mile away. Access is adequate for fire protection. Each new home will require additional review from the County Fire Department when their location on the lots is determined. The bus stop is located at 87 North 100 West, approximately 4 blocks from the property. If garbage collection is to be on the existing access roads, they must be improved to meet county specifications.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Notices were mailed to 7 property owners located within three hundred feet of the subject property and to the Town of Clarkston. At the time the staff report was prepared, no written comments had been received by Staff.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

Action: Staff recommends that the Planning Commission make a motion to recommend approval to the County Council of the Hawberry Subdivision Amendment, a boundary line adjustment of a two (2) lot subdivision for property located at approximately 10300 North 9600 West (Clarkston), TIN #15-032-0001, 15-032-0003, 15-032-0004.

Standard Stipulations:

- 1. The proponent shall reaffirm the County's right-of-way on all County Roads adjacent to the development area with an easement or dedication to be recorded on the final survey plat.
- 2. Any new septic systems shall meet the requirements of the Bear River Health Department and shall be between 100 and 200 feet from any water way or well unless otherwise designated by the Health Department.
- 3. Each landowner shall obtain a septic tank permit from the Bear River Health Department prior to construction on any lot.
- 4. All landowners are required to obtain a Zoning Clearance and all applicable department reviews prior to any construction on the lots.

Site Specific Stipulations:

- 1. Prior to the issuance of a Zoning Clearance for Lots 1 or 2, proof of appropriate water shares will be required.
- 2. If residential access for either property is requested onto either 10200 or 10300 North, the roads will be required to be improved to a minimum of a 20 foot wide hard surface, as approved by the Cache County Road Department, from 300 West (Clarkston Town road) to the point of access for the lots.

RECOMMENDED FINDINGS OF FACT

The Planning Commission bases its decision on the following findings supported in the administrative record for this project.

- 1. The Hawberry Subdivision Amendment has been revised and amended by the conditions of project approval to address the issues and concerns raised within the public and administrative records.
- The Hawberry Subdivision Amendment has been revised and amended by the conditions of project approval to conform to the requirements of Title 17 of the Cache County Code and the requirements of various departments and agencies.
- 3. The subdivision amendment approval is issued in conformance with Titles 16 and 17 of the Cache County Code and State Code §17-27a-608.
- 4. The Hawberry Subdivision Amendment is compatible with surrounding land uses and will not interfere with the use and enjoyment of adjoining or area properties.




