OPENING REMARKS AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

ACTION: Motion by Council member Robison to approve the minutes of the July 28, 2009 Council Meeting as written. Zilles seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Yeates absent.

REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE: M. LYNN LEMON

APPOINTMENTS: Andrew McAdams Deputy County Attorney

ACTION: Motion by Vice Chairman Zilles to approve the appointment of Andrew McAdams as a Cache County Deputy Attorney. White seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Yeates absent.

PUBLIC HEARINGS, APPEALS AND BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MATTERS

SET PUBLIC HEARING: AUGUST 25, 2009 – 5:15 P.M. – 1ST CDBG PUBLIC HEARING

ACTION: Motion by Council member Buttars to set a Public Hearing – August 25, 2009 – 5:15 p.m. White seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Yeates absent.

OTHER ITEMS

<u>Fair and Rodeo</u> – Executive Lemon thanked Clerk Jill Zollinger and her staff and
Lamont Poulsen for the great job on the Cache County Fair and Rodeo. Lemon had a
number of people tell him how much they enjoyed the Fair.

- ☐ Cloud Seeding Report The summary report for last year states the long-term average for precipitation for December through February shows an average 17% increase and a 10% increase for snow water content.
- □ <u>Library Report</u> Executive Lemon distributed a copy of various user reports from the Logan Library. There were fourteen new users outside of Logan City, three of which were from the unincorporated area of the county. The handout also included the Bookmobile Circulation Report.
- □ Acreage required for AG Protection Area Executive Lemon reminded the Council that a few years ago the AG Advisory board recommended lowering the number of acres required for an AG Protection Area from ten acres to five acres. Lemon said there is an individual who has agricultural land just outside a city, but it is just under ten acres. He wants to put it in an AG Protection Area. Executive Lemon asked for the Council's feelings on lowering the acreage requirement. Council members were supportive of lowering it citing that greenbelt only requires five acres.
- □ **USACCC Meeting** will be September 23 25, 2009 in Park City, Utah.

Chairman Petersen asked Attorney Swink to introduce the new attorneys in the County Attorney's office.

Attorney Swink introduced Spencer Walsh and Andrew McAdams to the Council.

ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST

Employee of the Month was presented to Terryl Warner of the Victim Advocate Office by Jim Smith.

UNIT OR COMMITTEE REPORTS

★ Landfill Update – Issa Hamud reviewed the process that brought Cache County into the NURLA group and the subsequent withdrawal of Box Elder County. Hamud said he wants to have geological testing done at the Clarkston property Cache County owns which has been selected as a possible landfill site. Hamud believes the testing will verify the site's viability as a landfill. NURLA will continue to meet but it is difficult to accomplish anything in Box Elder County without the county's participation in NURLA.

Council member Chambers asked about the status of Mountain Fiber as the county's recycling agent. Hamud said the original fee paid to Mountain Fiber when the recycling program began in 2004 was \$25.00 a ton and last year there was no fee.

PUBLIC HEARINGS, APPEALS AND BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MATTERS

<u>PUBLIC HEARING:</u> AUGUST 11, 2009 – 5:45 P.M. – OPEN 2009 BUDGET – Auditor Tamra Stones explained the adjustments to the 2009 Budget. (See Attachment 3 to Resolution No. 2009-24 for details.)

Tape 1, Side B

Chairman Petersen opened the Public Hearing and invited public comment.

Executive Lemon noted he gave the Council copies of an analysis of the road tax detailing the projects and Class B Roads transfer of funds and will answer any questions concerning it.

There was no other public comment.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Robison to close the Public Hearing – August 11, 2009 – 5:45 p.m. White seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Yeates absent.

UNIT OR COMMITTEE REPORTS

★ <u>Greenbelt/Rollback Taxes Discussion</u> – Council member asked Assessor Howell to explain what is required for an individual who is working with the Farm Service Agency and is not cropping 50% of their crop (as required for greenbelt, etc.) because they are under a program through the Agency to improve their ground? Assessor Howell reviewed the state requirements and responded that the individual should bring documentation of the program they are involved in to her office which she will honor if it is in order.

Council members stated their support of the greenbelt/rollback program and observed that there is a group that wants to eliminate the program.

Vice Chairman Zilles remarked that some farmers find that it is more economically viable to graze cattle on their agricultural land rather than produce a crop, but then they do not qualify for the greenbelt/rollback. Assessor Howell said that some farmers choose to cut a couple of crops off the land and graze it the rest of the year. This meets the production requirement and still allows them to gain revenue from the grazing.

Assessor Howell reviewed the reasons for the increased property taxes and land values in Cache County. Annual statistical valuing is required with a physical visit to reappraise the value at least every five years. Howell reiterated that because taxing entities are guaranteed the same amount of funding as their last year's budget, if property values go down, property tax goes up and vice-versa. This rate is set by the state. Values are down in all of the state except for Cache County where values have increased; therefore

property taxes in Cache County are higher because of a value increase in addition to the increased tax rate because of lower values statewide.

Tape 2, Side A

Howell said contrary to a current rumor, her office staff is the same size it was when they moved into the new Cache County Administration Building in 2003.

Council member Chambers asked if Howell is seeing much anger in residents concerning property values and taxes? Howell said she is; people are very upset, but after talking with her staff, most people understand the situation and believe their property has been valued correctly.

Executive Lemon and Assessor Howell stated the ad being run by the Logan School District does not give all the facts. The School District receives the same money for its budget as last year, but the values in the rest of the state are down so the tax rate goes up to guarantee them their funding as previously explained.

★ <u>Cache County Financial Update</u> – Executive Lemon reviewed current and projected tax sales tax revenues including RAPZ Tax Restaurant Tax, County Transit Tax and Transit Room Tax as well as payroll savings.

Director Runhaar presented the density proposals for two-acre, five-acre and ten-acre zones.

Council member White asked how this helps prevent sprawl?

Council members replied they see this as one component of the solution for the residential/agricultural zone.

Chairman Petersen responded that if the Council approves this component but it isn't made effective until later, that allows the county to proceed more effectively to discuss standards, clustering, etc.

Tape 2, Side B

Council member Buttars asked the Planning Commission's feelings on the A-10 zone? Runhaar said there are a variety of opinions but the vote from the Planning Commission was for the A-10 Zone to be the base agricultural zone.

Buttars stated he sees the proposed density zones as a step closer to clustering which he believes will help preserve agricultural land.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

<u>Brian Chambers</u> advised Council members that he will notify the Celebrate America Show who wants complimentary tickets to the September 2, 2009 show if Council members tell him their desires. Buttars, Petersen, Robison and Executive Lemon indicated they and their spouses want to attend.

<u>Craig "W" Buttars</u> thanked Clerk Jill Zollinger for the Fair and Rodeo and all the work that went in to making it a success.
